THE BULLETIN

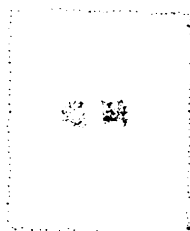
6.8. VENEZUELA

Between 1898 and 1912 Venezuela printed and used a number of Official stamps, but from 1925, the authorities began to make use of ordinary postage stamps perforated with the initials G N for official purposes.

The use of these perfins was discontinued in 1943 when meter mail was introduced.

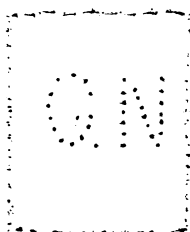
G N stands for Gobierno Nacional (National Government).

Two types of perforation were used - one of small solid letters, the other of large perforated initials.
