PERFIN PRICES

1. Basil Tomkins sent us the following extract from an Auction Catalogue,

PERFINS Queen Victoria & King Edward VII, mainly values 1½d and upwards, a superb accumulation which will repay careful sorting, about 10,000. RESERVE £100.

Basil adds that he has been advised the lot realised £170.

2. Brian Birch wrote to say that in a recent list of Swiss stamps for sale was an item,

1882 10c, Zumstein. 61AF with private but officially sanctioned 'T' perforation £6.50.

Brian has been unable to find any reference to this perfin in catalogues or reference books and would welcome any information.

EXCHANGE PACKET

The first packet was sent out at the end of January. Containing 791 items priced at £7.38 it took 2 months to circulate among the

10 members in the circuit. Sales were quite good, 405 items being sold for £3.80½.

would welcome hearing from anyone with Japanese perfins for disposal.

George Wright who supplied the illustrations of the Japanese Officials which were reproduced in our last issue, now sends, us some further information on the Navy Department perfins.

Taking the illustrations from left to right the details are,

1. 38 holes
2. 31 holes Used at Kure, East Maizuru and East Maizurukitasu
3. 33 holes Takau Naval Hospital.
4. 34 holes Used at Tokosuka and Miyagioo.
5. 27 holes Kaigun Kikan Gakko. Used at Maizurukitasui and Nakamaizuru.
6. 26 holes Used at Maizuruhon Mashi and East Maizuru.
7. 59 holes Sasebo Naval Base.
8. This design is a forgery.

COMMEMORATIVE PERFINS

We continue the treatise on commemorative perfins with an Illustration of a perfin (COMPEX) franked with a special exhibition postmark. We have a further cover to illustrate and publish but would like a few notes to go with them. Does anyone have any background information on these perfins?

GENERAL REMARKS AND NOTES

For original listings see pages 88/92 of Mr Jennings' Book. Where no details of lettering dimensions are given the die is the one listed by Mr Jennings.

Where dimensions are given then,

- N1 = Not a new die but Jennings records two or more dies with this lettering.
- N2 = A new die for Line Engraved but it also comes on other issues (generally SF)
- N3 = A new die but Jennings records other dies with similar lettering.
- N4 = So far as I know this is a completely new die.

I am indebted to Mr J. Nelson for his help in checking and producing this list. I hope to add a listing of unrecorded plates of recorded dies of 1d line engraved fairly soon.

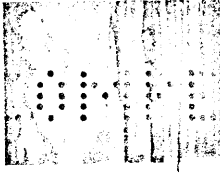

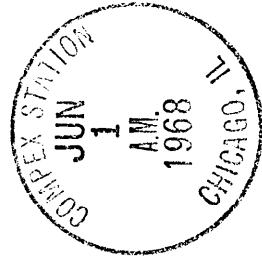


