- (1) December 2nd sees the start of the World's first Philatelic cruise. The Royal Viking Sea leaves Southampton on its maiden voyage for a 14 day cruise to Teneriffe and back, calling at numerous ports on the way. COMMEMORATIVE PERFINS
50th ANNIVERSARY OF THE BREDA PHILATELIC SOCIETY

This very attractive card from the Netherlands shows the perfin both through the stamp and the card.

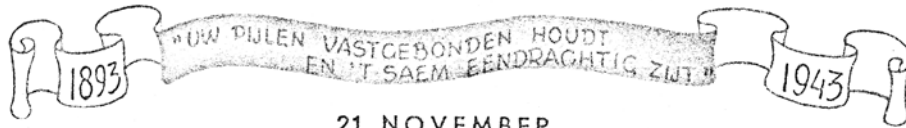
It was issued with a special commemorative post-mark dated 21 Nov 1943, with large figure 50 and a spray tied with a ribbon, and wording round the circle.

At the top of the card is a ribbon with 1893 on the left, 1943 on the right, and between, words in red on yellow:- "Uw pijlen vastgebonden houdt en 't saem eendragtig zijn". This sentence has been translated for me as an advice "That you hold your arrows tied and remain united" - maybe this is the motto of the Society? On the left side of the card under the date 1893 is a Lion in gold. Then, above and below a shield with three white crosses on a red field are the words "50- JARIG BESTAAN" and "POSTZEGELVEREENIGING "BREDA" ".

The stamp is S.G. 577, the 5c olive green showing Prancing Horses and issued in 1943.

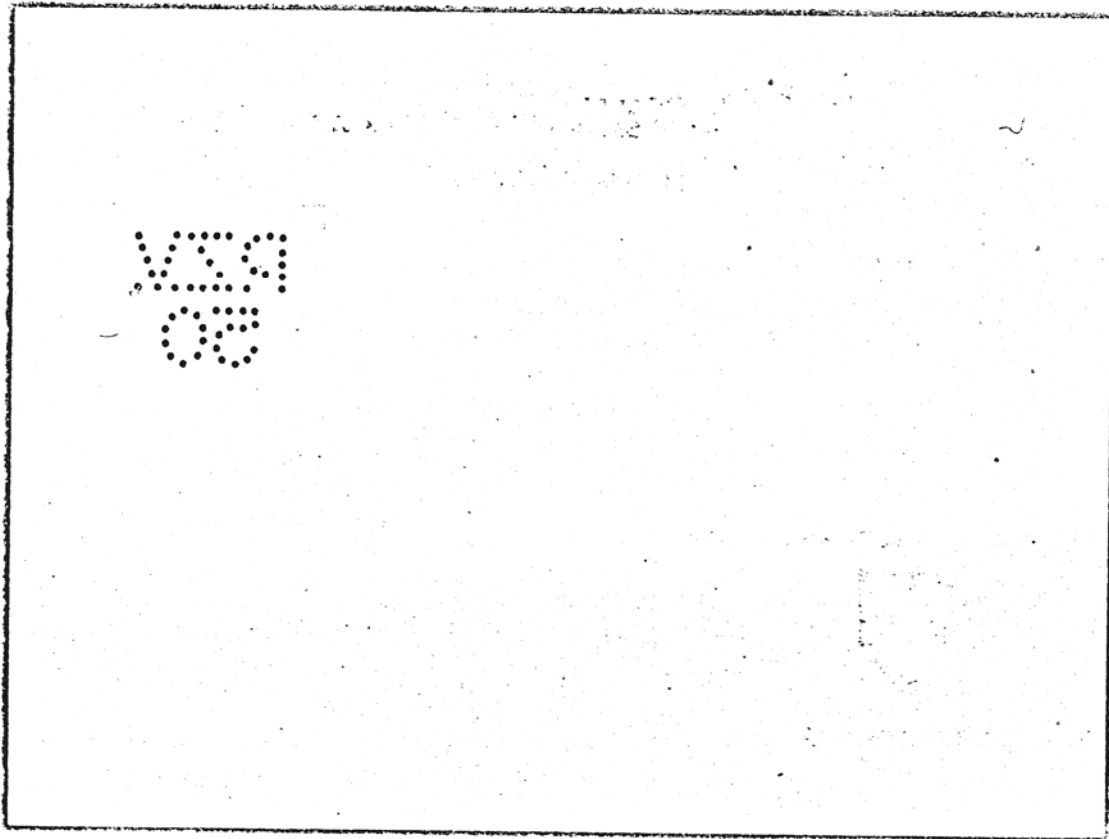
