THE RON BOWMAN MEMORIAL PRIZE

It has been decided to institute a Prize to perpetuate the memory of Ron Bowman who, as most of you know, was the leading light of the society from its inception until his untimely death early last year. Because of our far-flung membership it is felt that the usual arrangement of having a competition by display for a trophy is not practicable. Therefore an annual prize of £10 will be awarded for the best article or series of articles written by a member and published in the bulletin during the previous year. The prize will be in the form of a voucher which can be spent in the Society's auctions. A diploma will also be awarded.

The winner will be decided by the officers, who reserve the right not to award the prize in any year in which, in their opinion, no article of sufficient merit has been submitted.

It is hoped that this prize will

- (a) keep alive the memory of one to whom we owe so much,
- (b) encourage members to prepare bulletin material.

MEMBERSHIP

It may be of interest to see how we have grown. When the Study Group (as it was then called) was formed in 1957 there were 19 founder members. Today we number about 190. The growth has been steady:

If anyone knows where any large numbers of this 1d Lilac Stamp are to be found I would exchange or buy them. I am always interested in this 1d Lilac issue.

A HANDBOOK OF GB OFFICIAL PERFINS

The Society is to produce a hand book covering the GB Official perfins on the lines of the well received booklet on Railway Perfins. The booklet will be based on my personal collection of these items, but I hope for help and information from the members to make it more complete. I would ask you all to look into your collections for these items and to let me know (in confidence) of your holdings. I would be interested in details of the perfin, the stamp, the postmark and such details as blind holes reversed perforation. A Good way to pass this information is to photostat the back of the stamp against a black background and to write the details on the back of the photocopy. I hope that you all will take part as I hope to include listings of stamps perfined and details of usage including earliest and latest. From time to time I will be asking for specific information in these pages as the Booklet progresses but to start with I would ask for information regarding the perfin Cat. No. 17.1, 22/CSC, which is listed as belonging to both 'Cook Son & Co.' and 'Civil Service Commission'. Does anyone out there have a copy of this perfin together with identity which they can lend me or photostat for me?

A list of the perfins I intend to include is reproduced below, but I would be pleased to hear of any others. All information should go to the Editorial address. I hope you will all co-operate to make this project a success.

Do you have a CL perfin (McKee-Tomkins C421.2) or a CLI (C452.1) or an IVE (I261) or a VE which was listed in the old van lint catalogue? Well, I did too, until recently when I found they were all partials.

I recently acquired a mixture of GB perfins from a dealer in India, which had been accumulated before 1920. The lot had quite a few of CL, CLI, and IVE. What I noted was that the lower left hole of the L in CL and CLI was often blind or incomplete. This made me superimpose them and find they were the same perfin, with the CL ones positioned so the I would always be off the stamp. After this I wondered if this was all, since the CLI goes right across a small stamp. With the abundance of IVE perfins in the lot, I tried it onto the I of CLI and it fitted perfectly, giving the new perfin CLIVE.

The range of stamps in my collection goes from Victoria to George V, and cancel dates from 1900 to April 1, 1915. Cancels are London W.C.

The abundance of the three types of partials in one lot was what prompted this discovery. Actually, I had a lead on it several years ago, but things were just not right at that time. I had a stamp with a double strike of the NE perfin, and they had been done at a slight angle. This gave on one of the strikes part of the lower bar of the L. At that time I was not even thinking of the IVE perfin, and put it in my collection under LIVE with a question mark. So, sometimes, you need a little luck to go along with the data, in order to solve the problems.

RAILWAY PERFINS

In the recent auction I was successful in obtaining Ron Bowman's collection of railway perfins. It is my intention to continue to add to this and eventually bequeath it to the Society (with the hope that it will never be broken up) as a memorial to Ron.

I find that there are quite a few gaps and am most anxious to fill them. They are of course mostly the more "difficult" items. If anyone is willing to help I would be willing to buy them (or receive them free!). I will send a list of the missing items to anyone who thinks they may be able to help.
