## SECRETARY'S REPORT. J. K. Rucklidge.

It is pleasant to be able to report another satisfactory year.

Membership is now about 255. We get 20 to 30 new members each year but this is offset by wastage.

The smooth and efficient running of the Society is, of course, due to the labours of the officers and I am happy to express our thanks to them and notably to:-

ROSEMARY SMITH for stepping in as bulletin editor at short notice: I have had several letters expressing members' appreciation of her efforts.

KEITH MOORE for the printing: and JOHN LUFT for despatching the bulletins. We welcome Roy Gault as catalogue editor and Geoff Longbottom as publications officer in addition to the post of librarian.

Work has proceeded with the 6th edition of the Tomkins catalogue and we shall soon be parallel with the Edwards. Thence forward sections of both catalogues will be published more or less at the same time. Thanks are due to Rosemary Smith for her help in correcting the Secretary's manuscript copy of the Tomkins pages and adding identities from her large cover collection.

## TREASURER'S REPORT J.M. Rucklidge.

Another satisfactory year financially. The Society's funds enable us to undertake relatively major undertakings without financial worries. I believe the accounts are straightforward but a few items need a word of explanation.

1. The copier we obtained in the previous year proved unsatisfactory and a complete refund was obtained by the efforts of Tony Llewellyn-Edwards to whom we are grateful.
2. Publications show a loss, but this ignores the stock held.
3. Bulletin costs are up, partly due to increased postal charges and partly due to the increased printing of the Tomkins catalogue pages:

sufficient stocks are held for the requirements of new members joining in the next few years.

4. The library expense is principally for a literature lot bought at auction. This will supplement our own library and surplus items will be sold in the auctions.

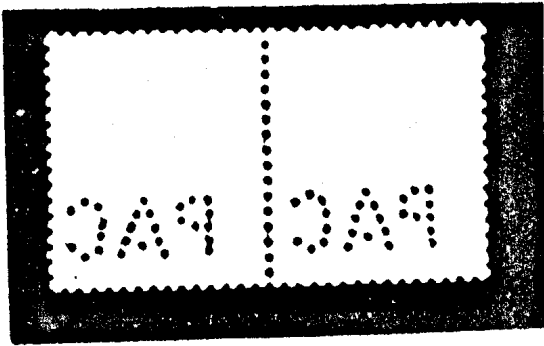
EXHIBITING PERFINs

Member Alan Sandy would like to see an article on the best way to mount and display perfins for exhibition. We know that some of our members have had successes in this field and could therefore supply this.

Any offers?

The inspection of multiple pieces can also be an interesting study so if you are lucky enough to have some multiples of this perfin (they are not too common) look at them to see if they add anything to the fund of knowledge. Figure 5 shows a pair, which turn out to be 0120.03 and 0120.03a. This shows that these two different perfins were made by the same double or multiple die perforating machine, figure 6 shows a block of 0120.10 and give us the chance to guess at the type of perforating machine in use. The horizontal rows of perfins are in line with each other but not parallel with the stamp perforations or each other so we can see that the machine used perforated a line of stamps (probably 10 or 12) at a time before the sheet was moved up to perforate the next row. Figure 7 is a block of six Jubilee issues and inspection of the alignment of the perfins on the individual stamps shows that they are all very well aligned with each other. This indicates either a very careful operator of the machine or, more likely, the use of a multiple head perforator which perforated a block of stamps in one strike. (Compare with comments on Multiple-Dies in Bulletin 234 & 241. Ed. M.R.S.) The Board of Trade had a perforator which perforated a block of 16 stamps which was manufactured by Sloper. Perhaps the Pru also had one of these machines.

Discussion of the machines used brings us to the reason for the group or 0130. --- perfins. Number 0130.01 and 0130.03 (the latter not assigned its number) are recorded in the catalogue of perfins on sideways watermarked stamps so they would have come from a stamp-affixing machine which perfined, dispensed and affixed a stamp to its envelope in one operation. I have never seen an example of 0130.02 but from the illustration in van Lint (see Fig 3) I would say that this too comes from a stamp-affixing machine. The indication is the characteristic clipped perforation on the bottom left of the illustrated stamp which is caused by the cutter which separated the stamp from the roll.

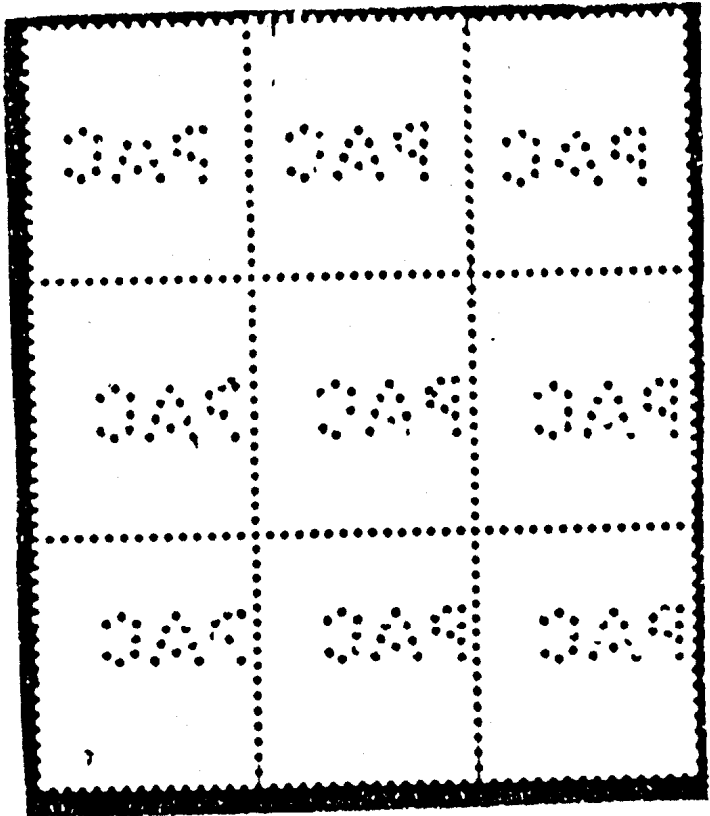

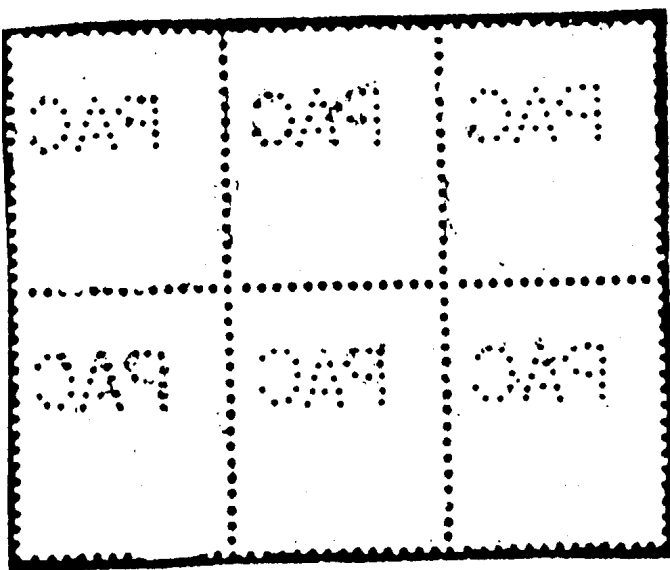

In some cases these machines were fed with rolls made up of stamps with upright watermarks torn from sheets. Does anyone have any examples of stamps of the 0130. -- group without sideways watermark?

In this article I have tried to show how a specialised study can be made up and you are encouraged to form your own specialised collection of perfins of the company of your choice. However we should not leave the matter there and I propose to continue with this study hopefully with the help of members, especially new members and those who have never tried a specialised study before. PAC perfins are (to say the least) cheap and there are many about so let us see how detailed a study we can develop and how many of our members we can involve. Send any information to me (new address in this Bulletin). I would also be interested in any surplus PAC perfins which any members want to dispose of. No I am not in the market to buy them as I already have more than I want but if anyone would care to donate these stamps to the cause I will distribute them to new members who want to help with this study free of charge.

A study such as this can be taken further by adding other items from the Pru and a further class worth collecting are postage stamps over-printed for fiscal use but that is another story.

Comments already raised by Part 1 of this article.

Dr. R.W. Powell points out that the Tilles Catalogue shows 9 perfins, not 8, as being identified with the Pru. (Page 4 Bulletin 241). 0120.05 in Fig. 2 is the 9th die in Tilles. With our Bulletin 234 April 1988 was an 8 page publication of his "Breaking Down a General Collection of Great Britain Perfins". In this he mentions again that 0120.04 is not from the Pru but from the Pearl Assurance Co. Ltd. I too have a cover dated 1939 with GVI 1d dark red perfined with 0120.04 and embossed Pearl Assurance Co. Ltd



Dr. Powell adds that he has copies of 0120.04 from GV Block to QEII Machins and the dates of his Pearl covers are 9-4-32 end 22-2-38. He also has a loose 3d Olympic Games of 1948 with this perfin. Does anyone have an identified Pru cover with 0120.04? My earliest Pru cover dated 17-5-99 has 3 x 1d lilacs perfined 0120.02. The Pru are still using perfins on most current Machins for mail from their Head and Sub Offices to the Agents in the field.

I am sure this very well thought out and documented 2 part article by Tony will have given many members food for thought, and I trust we shall have an update, on dates and stamps used, in the future.

## DUBLIN CASTLES PERFIN

Looking through an Auction Catalogue of Salisbury Stamp Auctions, I came across this amusing anecdote written by Ian McQueen.

Quote:

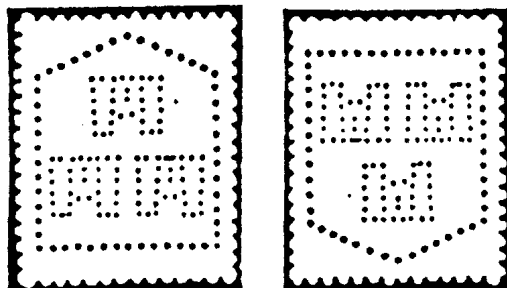
Several years ago, in an article in a French magazine by a well known specialist (no names for he is an officer and a gentleman) there was an illustration of the back of a G.B. ½d stamp, showing the perfinned design of what was described as a 'MAISON STYLISÉE'; and the author added the comment that there were so many little holes composing the windows of the stylised house that he had abandoned the task of trying to count them.

So I dropped him a line, suggesting that if he looked at the front of the stamp he would almost for sure, find a Dublin postmark, and if he turned the house upside down he would see Dublin's shield of arms, depicting the city's three castles! For this I received a most courteous reply, so typical of the old school of French military men but I still wonder how many collectors across the Channel still have 'maison stylisées' amongst their British perfins.

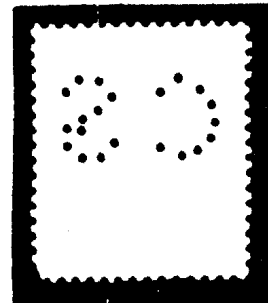
### ITALIAN EXHIBITION PERFIN by D.K. Andersen, Australia.

Wanted — information about the Italian Exhibition perfin RFPU - 46.

The only reference that I have been able to locate (via Perfin Abstracts) is from the SEPS Bulletin May/June 1974 Page 2 indicating that it stands for RIUNIONE FILATELICA PRIMAVERILE VENEIANA 1946 and originates from a philatelic exhibition held in Venezia in May 1946.

### ELABORATE DESIGN by W. J. Hanson.

Bill Hanson has sent the photocopy of this elaborate perfin design. It is on a Q.V. Jubilee 2½d S.G.201. The postmark is BEESTON-NOTTS and the perfin is H/&C<sup>o</sup>/L<sup>d</sup>. There are 133 holes and the whole design is 21mm high. It is illustrated, very faintly, in the Edwards Cat. as H1580.01 but is not in Tilles. Has anyone any more information about this one?



### A NEW CORPORATION of SHEFFIELD PERFIN

ROBERT ROWE has sent this unusual perfin to see if anyone can come up with any other information. It is as C6760.03 but with the extra hole out of alignment in the S. It is on a 13p pale chestnut with centre phosphor band.

Tony Edwards thinks it is an intentional control pin hole but if so, he has no previous record of such use by the City of Sheffield. Sheffield perforate their own stamps, using a hand operated Jean Sauven machine which perforate across twelve stamps at once. Living in Sheffield, about 8 years

ago I went into the Treasurers Department to look at this machine. They perforated a sheet of paper for me and looking at this now, there is no sign of the extra dot. Any other ideas?

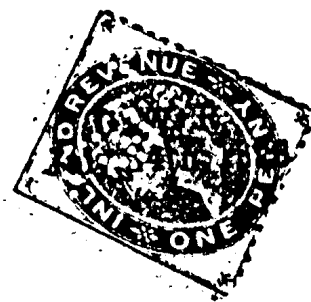
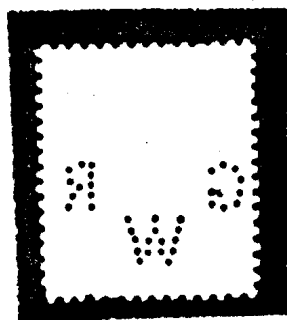

### ANOTHER G W R QUERY

The article in Bulletin 241 Page 11 prompted MARTIN KNIGHT to write and supply a GWR perfin for illustration. The stamp is a 1d lilac Revenue perfined GR/W G4350.02 (not sideways as the 241 article). However, this stamp is overprinted sideways on the face side "G.W.R./28th, Feby.,/1877. After examining the stamp, I would say that it is a professionally printed overprint, not a handstamp. The stamp bears no cancellation - fiscal or postal. Mr. Knight has spent much time researching the date 28-2-77, thinking it could have been a share date etc. for the railway stock, but has had no success in linking the date with any event in the history of the company.

Mr. Knight asks the following:-

1. Is this perfin common on other revenue issues?
2. Is this overprint well known?
3. Does the overprint exist but with other dates?
4. Does anyone know the significance of the date?
5. Does the overprint exist on other stamps with this or other GWR perfins?
6. Has anyone any evidence of usage by having a complete document?



The day after I prepared the above article, another similar photocopy came by post. BRIAN SMITH too wondered about a share call - this date being July 14th 1876. Perhaps the specialist collectors in the newly formed Br. Commercial Overprint Study Circle can shed some light on the matter.

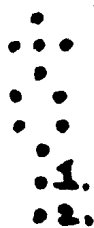
PERFIN 57 - Again! by Rosemary Smith.

Looking at Page 7, Bulletin 239 April 1989, it appeared that the perfin 57 identity was solved. However, at York Stamp fair I saw a ½d Jubilee with this perfin on a Trade Card coming from WALLACH BROS., 57 Gracechurch St. Wallach Bros are known as users of W41.1 & 41.4 WB. The number 57 appears to be the building number, but can anyone throw light on STERN BROS & WALLACH BROS who have the same address at roughly the same time?

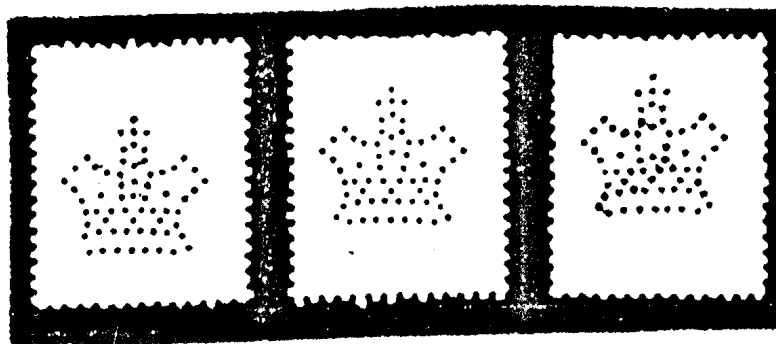
Tilles Design 41: Edwards Design 0140.01 : Crown 63 12mm.

When finding an extra dot in what at first sight appeared to be a normal Tilles Design 41 making the hole count 64, Roy Everett also wondered why the 64 holer was on EVII issues yet others similar to Tilles Design 41 were on QV 1d lilacs. The earlier items bore the numeral 850 and the EVII the cancellation of Wednesbury, both the same.

Arthur Smith also considered this a new die at first but on checking his holdings of this perfin he found that he had an item that carried 63 holes but differed from the Tilles in that it had the lower of two central dots. It can be shown thus-

Arthur did not mention on what issue his die featured upon, but these do tend to substantiate a fact that this business utilised a multi-die headed perfinning device at its works. Some dies breaking early on and others lasting the test of time. Arthur feels that the Catalogues need amending to show the present illustration as a provisional or missing pin die and a new entry is required- Design ? 64 holes 12mm. Any other information may be of value to the Catalogue Editor.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank members for offering me their good wishes and continued support as I take on the position of Catalogue Editor.

Although the circumstances leading to my appointment are somewhat unusual (and covered in the previous Bulletin), I welcome the task wholeheartedly. The post is indeed a privileged position which I know Tony did not take lightly, and the contributions that he has made over the years should not be underestimated. I hope to match the philatelic standards originally set by him, and shall strive enthusiastically to achieve the completion and maintenance of both the Edwards and Tomkins Catalogues.

The Edwards Catalogue is currently only approaching the half way stage, but a realistic completion date has been set for the Spring of 1991. Once the ball starts rolling, members can expect production of a new letter every 6-8 weeks, accompanied by update letters.

This brings me to my final point. The catalogues can only be as accurate and up to date as your contributions make them. If you suspect that you have a new identity or die, please forward the information to me for inclusion. The more details that you can supply the better, especially an illustration or photocopy, stamp details, postmark, trade etc. A good rule of thumb to apply is "If in doubt, send it". This request for information also extends to errors or omissions that you may have noticed in the sheets published so far.

In passing, the current prediction for GB perfins is 20,000 different dies, of which some 25% have identified users.
