RAPHAEL TUCK & SONS. RT/&S

I am taking a gamble that the photocopy of this beautiful item from DR. REG POWELL will reproduce well enough for it to be seen.

The "stamp" is for SIX PENCE and it relates to an 1890 Competitive Prize Exhibition for Amateurs and Art Students. The competition must have been sponsored by Raphael Tuck & Sons (London, Paris and New York). The "stamp" has the trade mark of Raphael Tuck in the centre oval and is perforated RT/&S Cat. No. R5380.01. Has anyone else any literature about this? Reg has 27 different values of this perfin ranging from the QV 1d lilac to KEVIII 1½d brown.



SOCIETY INFORMATION.

VISIT TO SLOPERS' WORKS.

Thanks to the efforts of Stephen Steere the Society was given the chance of a visit to Slopers' works. This was due to the generosity of Mr. Cockayne, the manager. His predecessor had refused to allow such visits. He specified a Friday afternoon and not more than five visitors. So on the 23rd March five of us assembled at West Hampstead tube station, which is a stone's throw from Slopers'. The lucky five were four Society officials and Stephen. There was no time to notify members - and in any case your officials deserve some reward!

The visit proved as interesting and enjoyable as we had hoped. We saw the machines in a variety of sizes and the current dies used to perforate stamps. Stamp perforation is only a small part of the business now, but we were fortunate enough to see a lady perforating "18" (London Borough of Sutton).

Mr. Cockayne generously gave each of us a copy of the short History published in 1939, and also a "proof book" each. The latter are quite fascinating, although nearly all the dies were for non-philatelic use. It is proposed that these "proof books" be donated to the Society: they are too fragile to send out, but copies will be made and placed in the library whence they can be borrowed (but only by UK members - others could buy further copies from the Librarian).

On a personal note, the previous evening to the visit, I was sorting a batch of perfins received from a charity: on a piece were a 19p perfinned TWA and a 1p perforated TW. I suspected that the latter was a modified TWA to take account of the dropping of "Authority" from Thames Water Authority. The next day at Slopers' there was this die with the "A" engraved on the plate scratched out - and yes the A pins had been removed as I had suspected.

I am sure many of you will be most envious of the lucky five. We have been promised a further visit again on a Friday afternoon at 2pm in August. Anyone wishing to go please advise the Secretary: if, as seems probable, more than five apply lots will be drawn and the lucky five notified. So if you apply and do

not hear I fear you will have been unlucky. It would help if you gave me a telephone number so that I am sure I have got the message across.

COIL PERFINS - PILOT SURVEY. Roy Gault.

The two-part article by Tony Edwards entitled 'COIL PERFINS OF GREAT BRITAIN' (see Bulletins 230 and 231 for 1987), covers admirably some of the background information relating to this small group of perfins. Following on from this, Harry Skinner and myself produced, in 1988, a booklet called "A PRELIMINARY LISTING OF G.B. POKOs". Along with illustrations of the Standard Alphabet dies, this also listed the issues involved together with known or suspected identities. Inevitably, this has become out of date and an attempt is now being made to revise it.

The most appropriate vehicle for this is a survey of members holdings of these popular POKO dies. The opportunity is also being taken to widen the net to include the small group of perfins found on stamps bearing sideways watermarks. These are virtually certain to have come from perforating machines using a sideways delivery system. Subscribers to the Edwards Illustrated Catalogue will have already received the first worksheet for this project, Worksheet P1. To date, everyone who has replied has had something to add to the story, possibly a new denomination, issue, postmark or, more importantly, a date. Remember that for these Standard Alphabet POKOs, dates earlier than 1930 and later than 1970 are particularly unusual.

The first worksheet is reprinted on the back of the enclosed Worksheet S1 to ensure that ALL members have the opportunity to add to our corporate information.

MEMBERS' COMMENTS ON PREVIOUS ARTICLES.

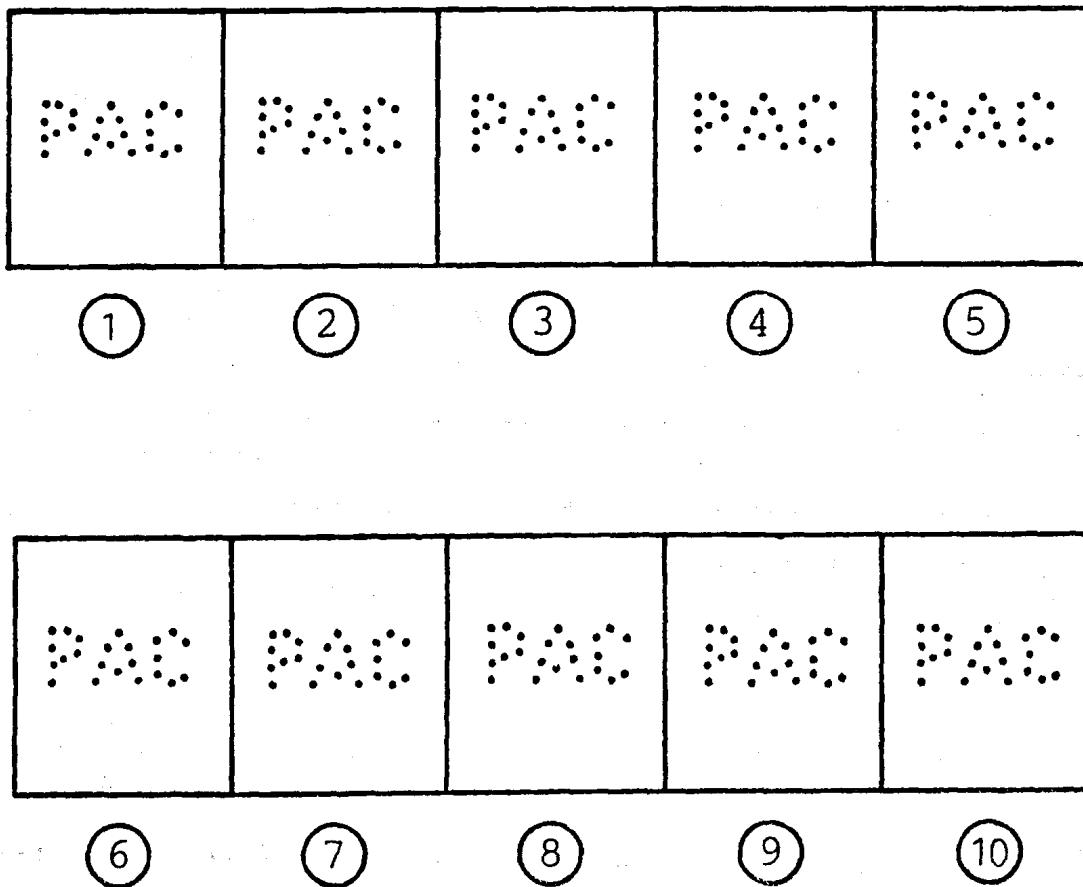
Glyn Perfin. Bulletin 245 Pg 13.

DAVID SCOTT has provided an earlier date for G3260.01. This is 11th April 1872 and this cover too is embossed GLYN MILLS CURRIE & Co, Bankers, London. No new information as to when 'CURRIE' was dropped from the firm.

PAC Perfins. Bulletins 241 & 242.

At the recent visit to Slopers' works, ROY GAULT persuaded Mr. Cockayne to give him an impression of the current 10 head PAC die. This answers the question of: how many dies there were on this multi-headed machine; who perforates the Pru perfins; the exact variations to look for.

Although the illustrations are in 2 rows of 5, the multi headed machine perforates a continuous row of 10 dies - as the numbers.



Another Identity for PAC?

STEPHEN STEERE has sent to me a letter from a Mr. STANLEY WILSON who, as an office boy Aug.1940 to Oct.1941, was working in the Public Assistance Department of the Shire Hall, Old Elvet, Durham City. Although he had little interest in the job - having volunteered for the R.A.F. and was desperately awaiting his call-up - he does remember using a stamp perforating machine which regularly jammed when he put in too many stamps.

The department had an un-paid COMMITTEE who considered every request for "more money because of hardship". (He remembers in 1944 his paternal grandfather came to live with his parents and his only income being 10/- per week O.A.P. he received 11/- per week from the PUBLIC ASSISTANCE COMMITTEE). The money was sent weekly by postal order and a receipt and pre-paid envelope were enclosed.

Although Mr. Wilson cannot remember anything else about the perforator he does recall the letters being perforated were PAC in some shape or form. In Tilles there is one PAC die not identified 12A P.A/C 10,10/8 5hmm. I have this on a 1d EVII used as a receipt stamp with a pen signature. This could perhaps link up with the information about a receipt being sent out with the payments. Have any members copies of P.A/C with DURHAM postmarks?

This little story illustrates most graphically why I find the collecting of perfins, particularly on cover and documents, so, fascinating. So much Social History is revealed by the discovery of the usages of many of our perfins.

Guy's Hospital. Bulletin 245 Pg 4.

BRIAN MERRYWEATHER provides the information that the Guy's Group of Hospitals, at 1990, are all under 'Lewisham & North Southwark Health Authority'. Of the 4 Hospitals in the Guy's Group, (Guy's, New Cross, St. Olaves and Lewisham) New Cross and St. Olaves are now closed.

Another Puzzling Design. Bulletin 245 Pg 6.

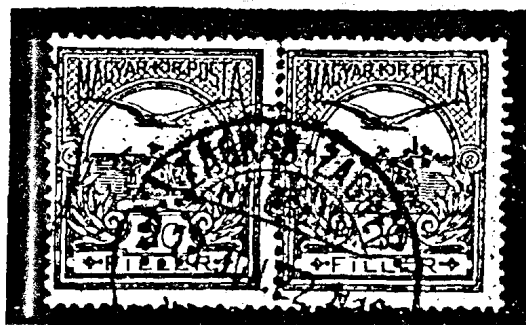

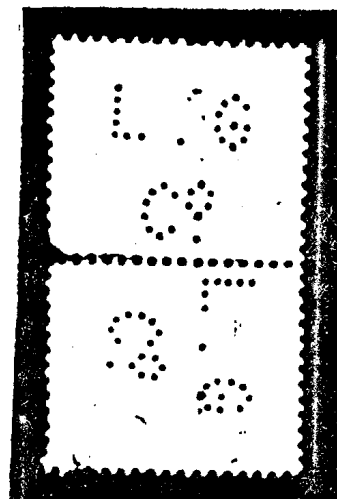
ROSEMARY SMITH has this distinctively placed perfin on cover. The stamp is a 1d GVI dark red dated 06-12-40 and the identity is SANGERS, Ltd., LONDON N.W.I

Different Perfins on Adjacent Stamps. Bulletin 244/5, 245/11

ARTHUR SMITH has sent photocopies of a pair of Hungarian stamps showing completely different letters on the adjacent stamps. Who can explain?

KELLY'S DIRECTORY.

DAVE HILL, our Packet Sup., is looking for an old Kelly's Directory to aid his research into identities. If he has offers of more than one, I (Ed. M.R.S.) am in the market for one too.

Whilst on the subject of Kelly's Directories, ROY EVERETT points out that these are not complete records. Businesses had to pay for entry and so many 'frugal' firms are missing. Even early phone directories will not yield total business coverage.

Roy thinks the only complete records would be rating records of the time, probably held in the archivists records library of each county in the county library section for that purpose.

would like to trade his used Canadian stamps (non-perfin) for World Perfins, or non-perfins of Switzerland, New Zealand or Australia.

MEMBERS' QUERIES.

KM/&S H5170.04 Perfin.

STEPHEN STEERE has this perfin on cover with a GV 2½d dated 21-06-32 and postmarked Redditch - which would match the identity in Tomkins of Henry Milward & Sons. However, the back of this envelope is printed "HENRY WILKES & Co., STUDLEY, WARWICKSHIRE". "The cover is to Sweden. Stephen asks if anyone knows of a connection between Wilkes and Milward?"

DOUBLE K or DOUBLE STRIKE? Rosemary Smith.

The illustration is of a 1½d EVII perfin which is an additional to a 3d rate embossed Registered Envelope dated 1908. The cover is hand stamped and 'wax-stamped' Henry S. King & Co. 65 Cornhill, London E.C. I had assumed that this was a double strike of K0010.05 (Tilles 1.5) K 10 5½mm 3mm wide.



However, I have come across a 1d lilac cover, dated 21-09-91 with hooded London postmark. The perfin is K00010.06 (Tilles 1.3) K 10 5½mm 3½mm wide. The name on the back is KING, KING & CO., BOMBAY.

Has anyone else a 'Double K' or 'Double strike of K'? Can anyone confirm that King, King & Co., Bombay had some connection with Henry S. King & Co., the Bankers.

Have you any other clues on your King covers?

AFRICAN ASSOCIATION Ltd. LIVERPOOL. Rosemary Smith.

A0230 AA/LD 8,8/6,7 44mm is given in the Tomkins Cat. as African Association Ltd. Liverpool. Stamps known are GV Photo.

I have a cover dated 09-09-13 with this perfin on a 2½d GV sent to Aix-Les-Bains. However, the printing on the envelope front is V.B. Company Limited, Royal Liver Building, Liverpool and the trade mark is shown as 5 cherries hanging from a branch with the word VIBICO on the branch.

Looking in the 'V Catalogue, V0185 V.B./&Co. 9,15/14,8,6 4½mm (III) is given as Vaughan Bros & Co., Liverpool.

Can anyone give any information about the African Association Ltd. Liverpool. For example: was it a group of companies trading with Africa? Also any information about the V.B. Company Limited, Royal Liver Building and the meaning of VIBICO? Again, is Vaughan Bros & Co. Liverpool the same firm as the V.B. Company Limited?

Y&/WD Y1160 Perfin.

DAVE HILL informs me that the London Borough of Hillingdon was formed from the U.D.C's of Ruislip & Northwood (no perfin?); Hayes & Harlington (H3110.01 and 3510.01); Uxbridge (U2030); Yiewsley & West Drayton. Is the perfin Y1160 YS/WD for this U.D.C? Has any member a copy postmarked Middx to confirm?

B0010.53 B 24 13mm.

DAVE would like to know if the four identities given for this perfin were in a kind of co-operative of Wool Traders. Even dates of use etc. may help to give the clue to the answer. This query is similar to the African Association above.

B0290 BATTY & Co.

DAVE again says that Batty & Co. were makers of Nabob sauce and in 1895 were at 123 & 125 Finsbury Pavement E.C.1. Has anyone any clues to link the perfin with this firm? The perfin is an early type.

B5430 BORWICK.

Borwick were a big name in baking powder at the turn of the century. DAVE asks if anyone has an address for this firm.

"COX" PERFINS. PART 2. By Peter E.J. Cox

Following Part 1 in Bulletin 244, I can now report with the help of fellow member Mr. D. Collins, that C5680.03 COX Diagonal perfin, was NOT USED OR OWNED by Cox & Co. Bankers but COX BROTHERS of DUNDEE as I had suspected.

After finding a Cox & Co cheque, I find that Cox & Co. had not one but SIX branches in INDIA. With the help of Mr. M. Werner of Sweden, I am the proud owner of two Cox perfins on Indian stamps. Thinking that my hunt was at an end, I found a further Cox & Co. cheque, this time of 1919, only to find that added to the Indian branches there was now a COX & CO. (FRANCE) Ltd. with another FIVE branches in FRANCE. Roy Everett informed me that there were French COX perfins and with the help of R. Dedecker I now have a copy and a photocopy of a cover bearing a French COX perfin.

I now find that there were still further branches in Alexandria and Cairo in Egypt, and still another branch in Rangoon, Burma. Does this mean still further Cox perfins to find? Only time or other members will bring an answer. One thing has become clear: if you accept a challenge and want to make a study of a certain Perfin, you will have many allies, a fine Bulletin (Thanks Peter!!) and many helpful members.

I have found the experience both exciting and rewarding. If any members have any COX perfins on INDIAN, FRENCH, EGYPTIAN or BURMA stamps I shall be pleased to hear from them so that I may complete my study and add a last part to this story.

May I in closing add a poem published in BRITISH FORCES TIMES in 1917. It was supposed to have been written by a soldier in the trenches and addressed to Cox S Co. Their answer is also noted.

TO MELT A STONE.

Kindly manager of Cox,
I am sadly on the rocks,
For a time my warring ceases
My patella is in pieces.
Though in hospital I lie,

ALLEGED ANSWER FROM COX's.

Sir, the kindly heart of Cox
Cannot leave you on the rocks,

 'Impecunious' R.F.A.

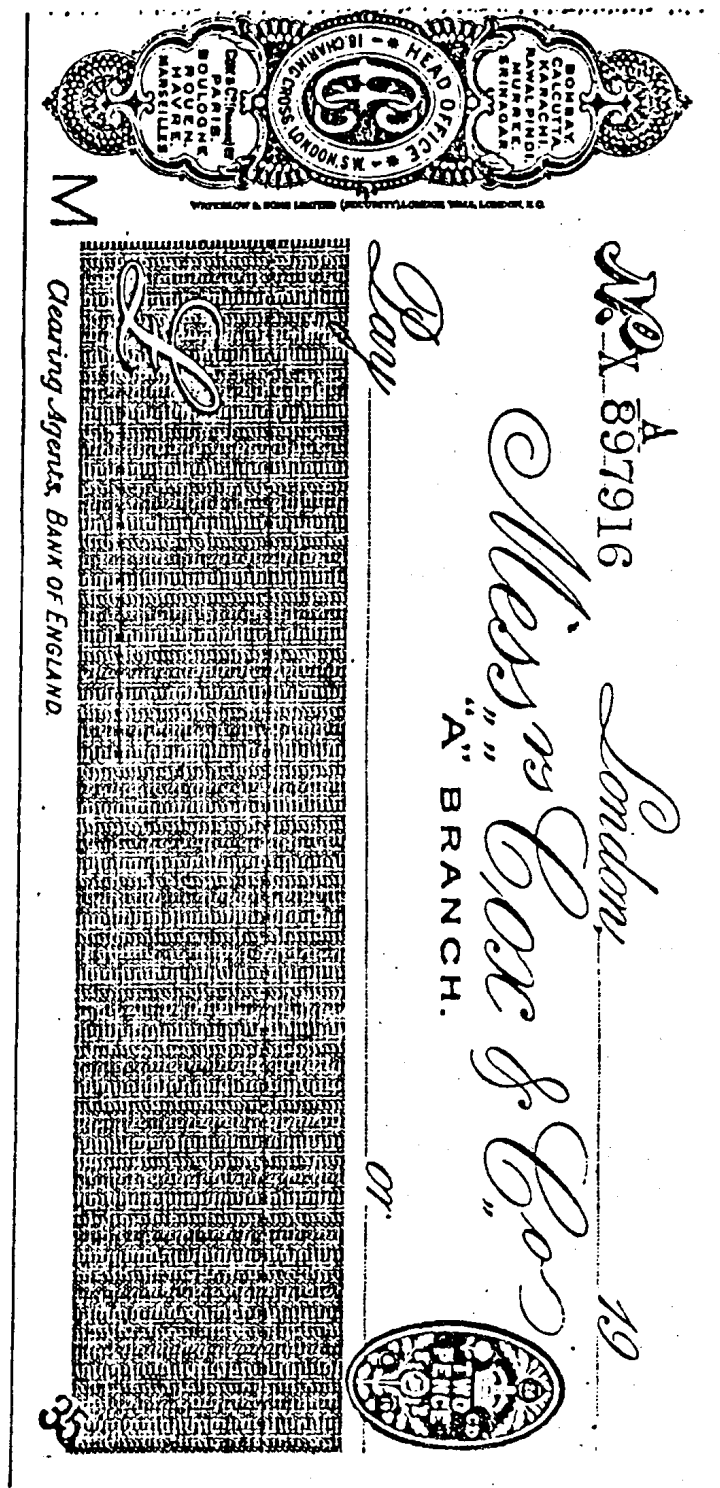

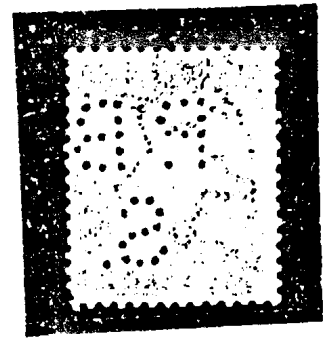
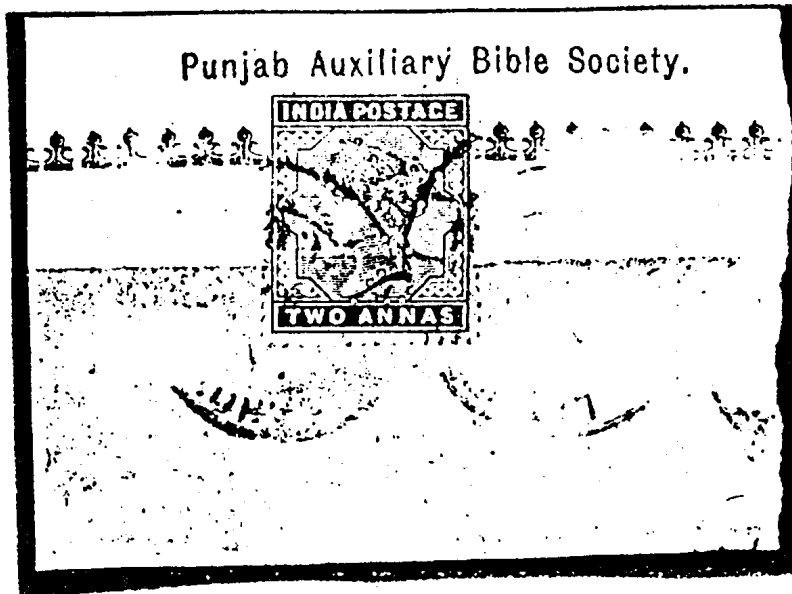

ARTHUR SMITH has sent this proof of identity of P.B./S. as being from the PUNJAB (Auxiliary) BIBLE SOCIETY. The loose stamp was the same Victoria 2 Annas blue.



CATALOGUE OF PERFIN'S OF BRITISH MALAYA Roy Everett

This Catalogue is by P. Giffen, published in 1989 - costs about £3 inc. postage - and has 64 pages.

Peter Giffen goes into some depth the perfins of Malaya, giving all known values. A price rating, A to E, is given for each perfin. It is illustrated and periods of known usage are shown, as are identities to the majority of perfins.

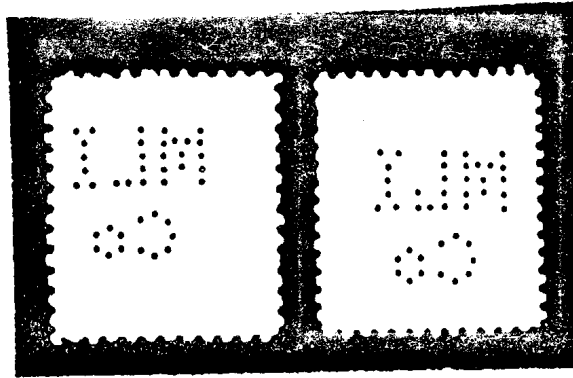
The history of the area comes alive with the use of British, Dutch, German, French, Indian, Chinese and Japanese business usage of the perfins of Malaya. Peter has only included items which he holds, he has seen or has been provided with a photocopy. This is a good opportunity perhaps to add to the information in this useful addition to your perfin library.

To take into account bank conversion fees for cheques, perhaps a good guess at the overall cost would be £5. Enquiries to P. GIFFEN

U.S.A. METROPOLITAN LIFE INSURANCE Co. MLI/Co by Jack Brandt.

Similar perfins have been used by multi-national companies in different parts of the world, but with slight variation to show area of usage.

Illustrated are two similar MLI/Co perfins.



The one with the serif on the 'L' was located in CANADA, and the other in the U.S. Using my collection as a guide the Canadian one is found on issues from 1912 to 1967, and the U.S. on issues from 1917 to 1932. It has been reported later on U.S. issues. Both machines probably started use in the early 20's.

Also, companies doing business in another country often perforate stamps of the other country. Some years ago the U.S. MLI/Co was found on Canadian Revenue Stamps. These were due to a Canadian Tax on various items from the U.S.A. Recently I have found one of the Canadian type on a U.S. issue of 1938.

So, now we have a situation where one company with two types from two countries were both used on issues of both countries. (Play it again, Sam!!) Are there any more?

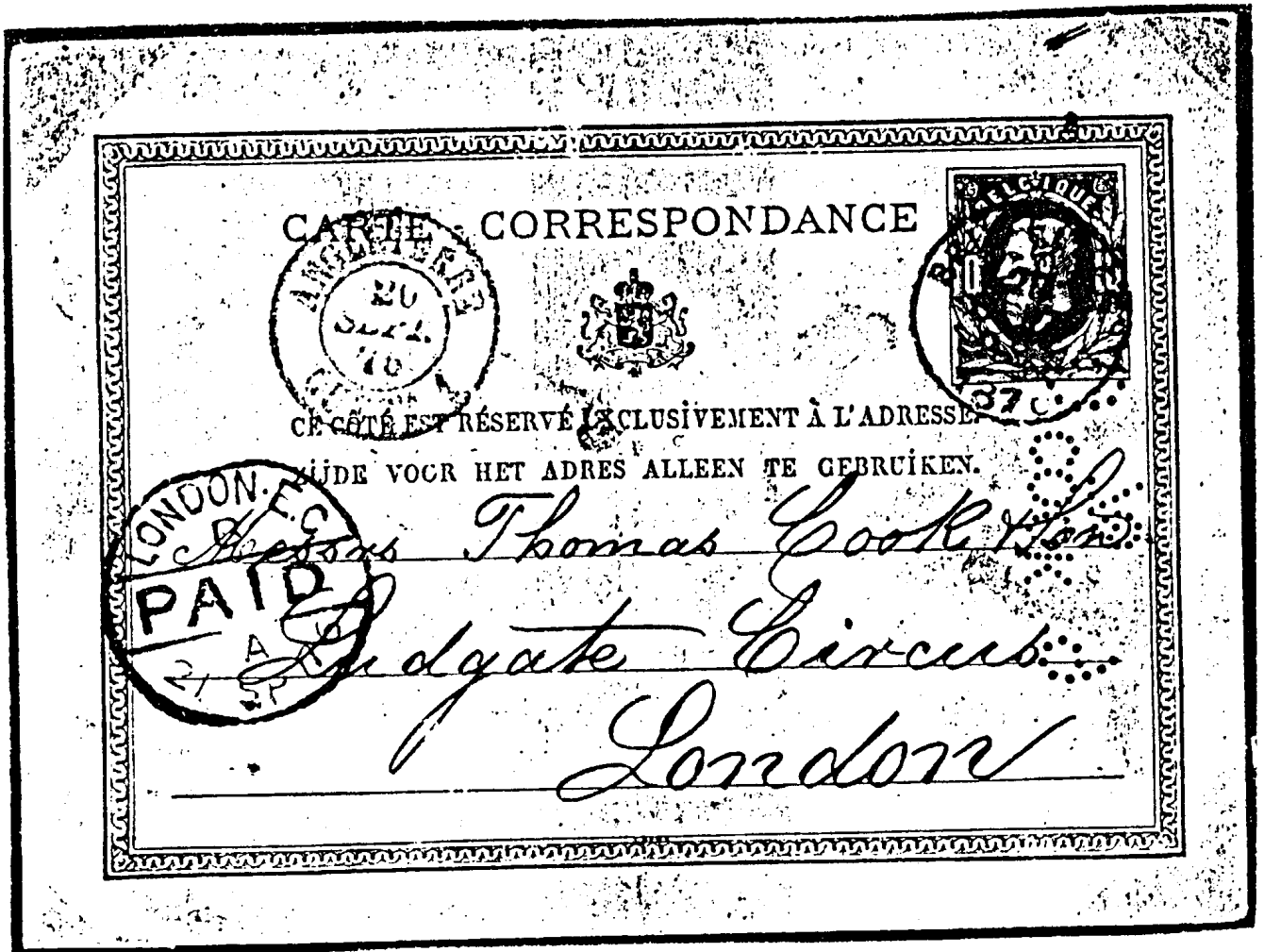
THOMAS COOK ITEMS.

In the article about the Slopers' Works visit, Michael made mention of the fact that many of the perfin dies in the Sloper 'proof books' were non philatelic. Some showed date stamps for Thomas Cook & Son. Although to the purist, these should not be classed as perfins, as items in a collection of a particular firm, they are most desirable and often very elusive. Two such items, shown on the next two pages, are from BORIS PRITT.

BELGIUM.

Post card from Thomas Cook's Belgium Office to Thomas Cook & Son, Ludgate Circus, London. Dated BRUXELLES 20 Sept 76.

As the receiving date is clearly seen to be 21 Sept 76 the perfin must be Thomas Cook's Belgium office perfin.
