At 3-30pm on 11th March I mailed the last cover containing the 19th batch (letter S plus updates) of the Edwards Catalogue. Some of you may have heard my sigh of relief. It has been a large task and I would like to express the Society's thanks to those who have contributed - principally of course Roy Gault but also those who correlated one or more sections.

With this Bulletin come the P and S pages of the Tomkins Identity Catalogue which is also now complete. Our thanks are expressed to Roy Gault and, especially, Rosemary Smith who proof-read my manuscript making many additions and corrections as well as reducing the A4 pages to A5.

So both catalogues are now complete. Please check your copies. If any pages are missing please let me know. I have spare sheets and can make up any deficiencies, though I fear I must charge for these.

Since new patterns and new identities are discovered all the time neither catalogue is complete and probably never will be. Updates will be issued as and when new information is available.

There are undoubtedly many errors and omissions in the catalogues: if you find any please advise Roy Gault.

(Editor:- My task of proof-reading was easy in comparison to the work put in by Michael Rucklidge in writing out the identities, having to correlate information from three or four sources.)

MEMBERS' QUERIES

Full Name "BOWS" Perfin DAVE HILL has a copy of B5510.01 (BOWS) on a GV stamp. There is part of an oval handstamp on the stamp (presumably for receipt purposes) which shows "Emporium Ltd., Glasgow". Does this clue help any of our Glasgow members to identify this perfin?

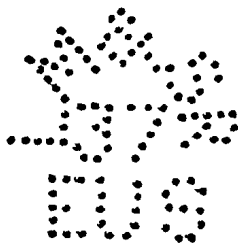
GTR Perfin

HARRY DOBSON has acquired a number of 1d lilacs all perforated GTR (G4340.01). All are dated 1900 or '01. The interesting point are the postmarks - all single ring LANGLEY MILL. Harry believes this is Langley Mill in Derbyshire, 15 miles NE of Derby. Can anyone in that area come up with a business with those initials, trading at the turn of the century?

RAILWAY PERFINS by J. M. Rucklidge.

It has always intrigued me that of the four railway companies formed on grouping on 1st January 1923 only two used perfins. The Great Western Railway retained its name and continued to use its perfins. The London & North Eastern produced two perfins. Neither the Southern nor the London Midland & Scottish appear to have produced perfins or continued to use those of the railways from which they were formed.

On a visit to Slopers I was given a proof book in which I discovered five different perforator proofs which clearly belonged to the LMSS. The proofs were on brown paper which does not lend itself to reproduction, so I have done a tracing of one of them:



The letterings are:-

EUS (ton)	number 37
LON (don)	number 27
MAN (chester)	number 27
LIV (erpool)	number 27
DUB (lin)	number 27

Since they are too large to fit on normal sized stamps, they are not (in my view) perfins but were intended for some other than security purpose. The significance of the numbers is not clear.

RAILWAY PERFINS LISTING

MICHAEL RUCKLIDGE has produced a listing of 116 different Railway Perfin dies. The lists are in alphabetical order and the five columns show:-

Name of Railway Company.

Perfin.

Die Number in Bowman, Tilles and Edwards.

This list is an invaluable aid for cross checking and cross reference. For a long S.A.E. (or S.A. Label if you do not want the pages folded) plus a 20p piece, I (Ed.) will send you photocopies of the four sheets. I have a stock of large envelopes which can be re-used.

OVERPRINTED RECEIPT STAMPS OF IRELAND

MISS NORAH K.KNIGHT of Ireland, one of our long standing members, has sent to the Society a copy of her research into the Overprinted Receipt Stamps of Ireland. It was on these receipt stamps that some of the earliest overprints for security reasons are found. These were the forerunners of our perfin.

The paper comprises an explanatory foreword about Receipt stamps and the rest of the pages show an alphabetical list of companies in Ireland who overprinted their receipt stamps and details of the overprinting and stamps used (S.G. Numbers).

Again, for a S.A.E. or S.A. Label plus 20p piece I (Ed.) will send photocopies of this excellent paper. A copy has been sent to our Librarian and to the British Commercial Overprint Study Circle. After the Bulletin has gone out I will wait two weeks before I photocopy your orders for either piece of work. It will save time to photocopy most orders at the same time.

MEMBERS' COMMENTS ON PREVIOUS ARTICLES

IBHL Perfin Bulletin 248 Pg.6; 249 Pg.13; 250 Pg.8

DAVID SCOTT can only find I1030.02 in his collection. He has this on six 1d Reds and six on Foreign Bill Stamps, one of which has a clear 1881 date. This stamp, on piece, is cancelled by a firm in Hamburg but David suspects this is pure coincidence and does not prove the 'H' stands for Hamburg.

HARRY SKINNER says I0130.02 appears on the whole range of QV 1d Plates to Jubilees. He has no dated copies between 1872 and 1880. I0130.01 is on KEVII. From the stamps he has, there is no overlap of the reigns at all. He has never seen a copy of I0140.01 and points out that the illustration in Tilles appears to be on a fiscal stamp. Has anyone a copy of this perfin on any stamp or document?

"F" Perfin Bulletin 250 Pg.20

HARRY SKINNER checked his holdings for F0010.06, .07 and .08. .08 have London Postmarks, .07 have Birmingham postmarks but .06 all have Huddersfield postmarks. I suggest this is a good identity of FISHER & CO., HUDDERSFIELD for Edwards F0010.06.

Which "Perfins" should not be in the Catalogue Bulletin 250 Pg. 5

I have had comments from three members, all with similar views to those I expressed in the last Bulletin. That is:- all types of 'perfins' or cancelling devices should be recorded but not included in Edwards proper. They could comprise a further section.

The following article slots in here very neatly.

What Is A Perfin? by J. M. Rucklidge.

The following is my personal view of what a perfin is. Since it affects what should be recorded in our catalogues views of members are invited.

A perfin is a number of holes in a distinct pattern applied to postage and other stamps. It should satisfy the following conditions :-

- a) be intended for security (i.e. prevent theft)
- b) be complete on a single stamp of "normal" size
- c) be applied before postal (or fiscal) use
- d) be relevant to the user i.e. consist of firm's initials, monogram, trade mark, full name, design, coat-of-arms etc.

There are two types of perforation which fail to satisfy all four conditions:-

- (1) "blanket" dies which extend over more than one stamp giving misleading partials on a single stamp. These fail condition (b) above.
- (2) personal dies used by members (or the Society). These fail condition (a) since there can be no need for security.

I do not say that these should not be collected or recorded in our catalogue, only that they should be in separate sections.

What Do We Call Non-Perfins? Editor.

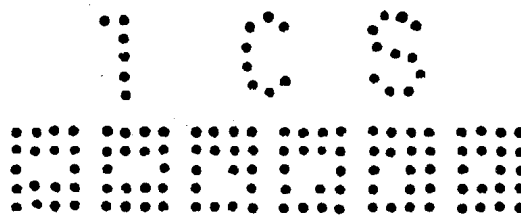
I would like some suggestions as to what we should call these "NON-PERFIN PERFINS". 'Perforations' is not correct as this is really the term for the holes separating one stamp from another. Have you any ideas?

DAVID ANDERSON from Australia has pointed out that the Raphael Tuck Label, with perfin RT/8S/ was illustrated in the Perfins Bulletin (USA) for Nov-Dec 1977. This was a 1d label and sage green in colour. So there were at least two values – 1d and 6d. Has anyone any further information?

NON-PERFIN ITEMS

Tilbury Container Services

KEVIN PARKHILL sent in the illustration of a non-perfin item. He saw the perforating machine when he was in an office at Tilbury Docks. The format of the six blocks can be changed by putting a pin in the side of the machine. Unlike all the other perforating machines we have seen, this one is cylindrical.



American Non-Perfin item

DAVE HILL spotted this item in one of a 4 volume Course on Advertising, 1908, by the International Correspondence School, Scranton, PA. Our American members may be able to say if this perforation was used postally, in smaller format, on stamps or documents.

SLOPER RECORD BOOKS information supplied by Stephen Steere.

After having no physical contact with Slopers, the last twelve months has seen a positive flurry of visits by our members to the works at Westhampstead. These have been reported in previous Bulletins. What has not been emphasised is the fact that Slopers die record books have been made available to us.

Many of the die record books which are obsolete have been given to the Society. Unfortunately, we suspect that others had been thrown away only months prior to our first visit.

The record books which are still in use have also been shown to us and two members, Stephen Steere and Dave Hill, have been allowed to take photographs of every page. It took five and a half rolls of film to complete the task. They were denied permission to take them from the premises to photocopy, although this would have been far more convenient.

The die records are in a ring binder and Stephen thinks they only go back to the 1950's. This could fit in with the renewal of the perfin blocks after the blitz, when the works, dies and records were destroyed, (See Roy Gault's article on Sloper Provisionals elsewhere in this Bulletin.)

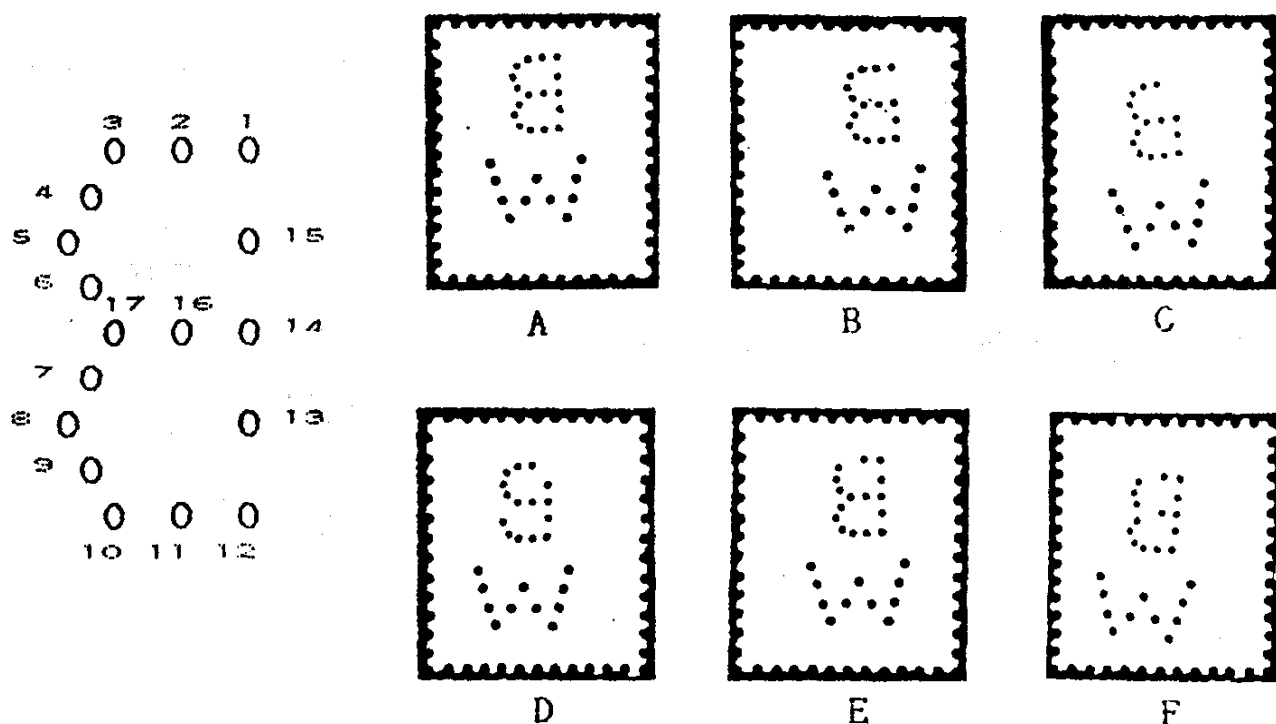
The book was not in strict alphabetical order and contained over-prints as well. Most of the dies show identities as well but there is some duplication and also changes in identity. Stephen is now trying to put everything in alphabetical order, note new dies to Edwards and new identities to Tomkins. At the beginning of February he had 225 new identities to Tomkins, 96 which enlarge the information in Tomkins and 10 identities confirmed which were only provisional before. The book also shows whether the die is a 12 multi die (converted to 10 for decimal issues) or a single die.

When the work is completed it will make interesting reading and fill in many gaps in the more modern perfins. Most of these dies should be found on GVI and QEII stamps, which are more likely to be in all our collections. How, and in what form, this information is ultimately going to be made available to members has yet to be decided.

SWISS PERFIN PUZZLE by D. Houtris.

Catalogue numbers used are from the Amateur Collectors Catalogue of Switzerland.

About ten years or more ago while looking at the B61 (Old No.B49) perfins that I'd accumulated, I noticed that there were missing pins in various places in the letter B. I decided to try and get as many of these perfins as possible and to see if there was any pattern to these missing pins. Over the years more than 40 of them came my way and I set about the task of trying to make some sense of what there was. Firstly they were sorted for those with readable cancellations, (those without were put on one side) and it was found that six groups emerged as follows:-



- A. With pins complete dated between Feb 1886 and Aug 1893
- B. With pin 15 missing dated Apr 1891
- C. With pins 1 and 15 missing dated between Apr and July 1891
- D. With pins 1 and 7 missing dated between Sept 1891 and Mar 1892
- E. With pin 3 missing dated between Aug 1894 and June 1897
- F. With pins 3 and 17 missing dated_ between Mar 1898 and Dec 1901

The Hurliman/Ganz Catalogue identifies this B/W perfin as Bank in Winterthur, Winterthur. B 6½mm high and W 5½mm high, with a total of 28 holes. From the above observations it appears that more than one perforating machine may have been used, as dates of use of the different groups overlap.






If any member can throw any more light on the subject, or has a different combination of missing pins please let me know via the editor.

POLISH OFFICIAL PERFIN by Andrew Hall of "Glass Slipper".

The illustrated card is from the offices of the Polish Finance Ministry at Mieleu. It records that these were the Revenue Stamps in use on May 5th 1927. Each stamp has a perfin WZÓR, applied in various positions, which was presumably used as a type of official cancel. I do not know the meaning of these initials, but my

Polish dictionary gives only four words beginning with ó:-
 ósemka/ósmy = eight (h) ówezesny/ie = then
 ów = the said ówdzie = elsewhere

Perhaps one of these provides a clue. The illustration is 70% of actual size. This piece will be in the May 'Glass Slipper' sale. (See Bulletin 247 Pg. 9)

SOME OBSERVATIONS ON PERFIN PRODUCTION AT SLOPERS by Dave Hill.

The first step in producing a perfin die is to mark the letters on the steel die which will be the part beneath the stamps through which the pins will go to enable holes to be punched through the stamps. Templates of each separate letter are used although the die is drilled by hand and minor variations can occur. I was shown a number of different sizes of template, the Bankers set with the distinctive bow legged A 4½mm high 8 hole as A10.03 and the Hospital set which was taller but still bow legged. This may have conceivably been used for single letter perfins but is otherwise too big. Other templates exist but are too big for stamps and are used for security endorsement for other things.

The die is then used as a template to drill the brass pin holder and the brass pin guide. The pin holder is slightly countersunk to match the top of the pins which are retained by a brass plate screwed on top. The pins occasionally are loose in the holder but this is insignificant as the pin guide locates them in position.

In operation the die and guide remain stationary with sufficient gap between to feed the sheets of stamps through (5 is the optimum number) and the pin holder goes up and down. The travel is enough in one direction to pierce the stamps and enter the die and in the other direction to strip the sheets from the pins (otherwise they would stay impaled on the pins) but without coming out of the guide. The guide is obviously essential, the image of pins waving about and hoping to find the corresponding holes in the die had always bothered me.

As for the pins, these are slightly tempered as they are too brittle at the heads when delivered and much time could be spent untangling broken pins from dies and stamps.

When the pins become rounded a stone can be run across the ends; when the holes become enlarged or the tops rounded they are drilled out and pins one thousandth of an inch bigger are put in. Pins are kept varying from 27 to 34 thousandths of an inch diameter. Occasionally a stone is rubbed over the face of the die.

This is different to the machines that perforate between stamps. The old established firm of Grovers, who make such machines, never use different size pins but use a special punch to restore the

edge of the holes in the die, then reamer them out and grind the face of the die all over to make it flat once more. The ends of the pins are squared up by running a stone over them. Otherwise, apart from the materials of construction and size, the machines of the two companies are similar.

Two types of electric machines are used at Slopers. Once over with single dies and twelve over, which since decimalisation are ten dies across but the old twelve die width is retained as the machines were originally made that width. Skilled operators can quickly change dies and there are means to "register" the stamps.

A treadle controls the rise and fall of the pins. One of the operatives is so quick she keeps her foot on the treadle all the time and can move the sheet of stamps forward and get perfect registration at each beat of the machine.

Hand operated machines perforate "PERFORATING MACHINERY" on Slopers letter heading and "THIS DESIGN IS THE PROPERTY OF J.SLOPER & CO AND SHALL NOT BE USED WITHOUT PERMISSION" on their drawings. (See Bulletin 248 Pg 10 for illustration. Watch for some of these perforations on blank white paper coming up in the Auction. -Ed.)

In view of the fact that so much of Sloper's work is to do with security endorsement we are more than ever grateful for the courtesy extended by Mr. Cokayne to the members of the Perfin Society and record the valuable help he has given to us.

PERFINS AND THE RED CROSS

Looking at Bulletin 247 Pg.11 and 14-15 caused BORIS PRITT to look at his Red Cross items. He has sent to me a photocopy of a similar card to the one in Bulletin 247. However, Boris' card has the cross of the Red Cross symbol printed on the address side. The card has the Chemnitz censor perforation and is dated 17.7.18. A second photocopy shows another W.W.I Red Cross cover dated 12.2.18. This has a GB GV 1d stamp with perfin CP/W (C6190) from the CENTRAL PRISONERS OF WAR COMMITTEE: BRITISH RED CROSS AND ORDER OF ST.JOHN.

A third photocopy shows a French Red Cross cover dated 6.7.26. The perfin is in the design of a cross from LIGUE DES SOCIETES DE LA CROIX ROUGE.

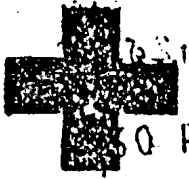

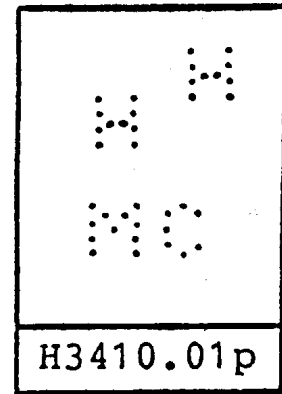
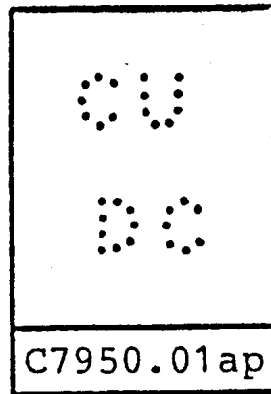
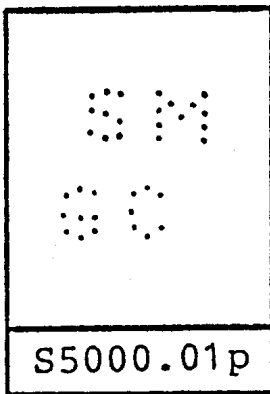
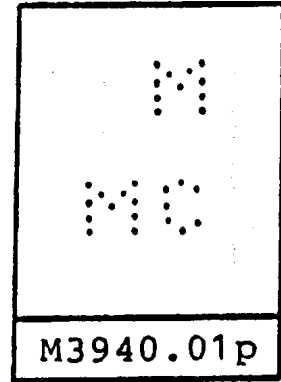
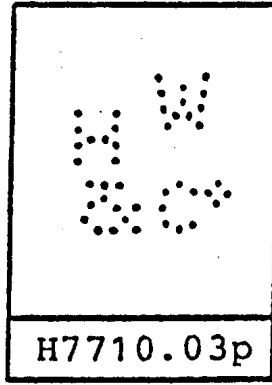
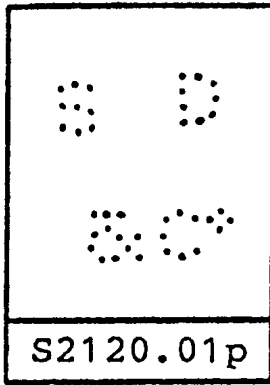
The existence of this small group of perfins was first suspected by the late Mr. K. Rymer-Young, and later confirmed by him through enquiries made of Slopers.



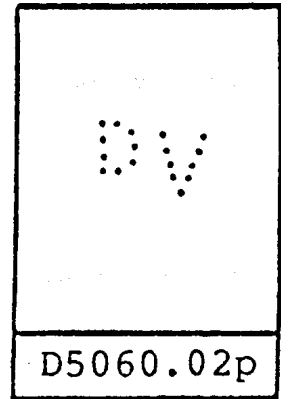
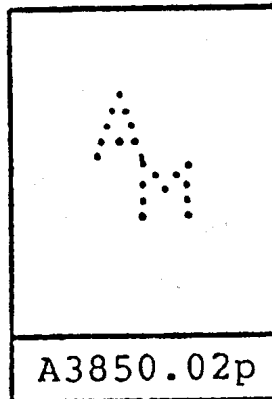
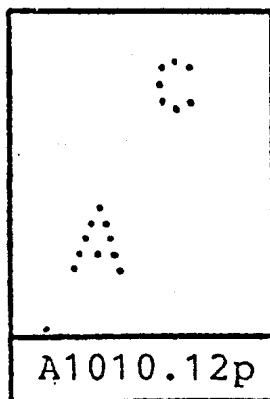
When Slopers works were blitzed during an air raid on London in May 1941, it must be assumed that many, if not all, of their dies were destroyed. Given the prevailing wartime conditions, a reasonable short-term solution was to improvise using single letter dies. In this way patterns involving combinations of letters could still be produced by passing the sheets of stamps several times through the perforating machines, each pass using a different letter. Inevitably, due to the very nature of this manual process, poor alignment and uneven spacing of the letters resulted, and in extreme cases the letters even overlapped.



In an attempt to speed up the process, single dies were made of common letter combinations. The most obvious of these was &C°, but many others are readily identifiable due to the constant alignment of pairs of letters. On occasions two sets of these pairs of letters were used to produce a four letter perfin.

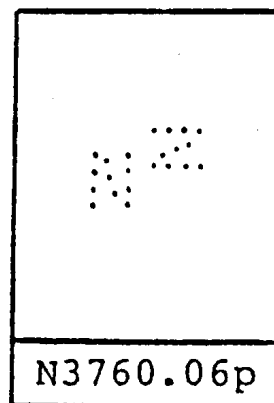
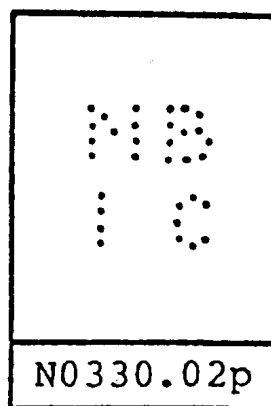
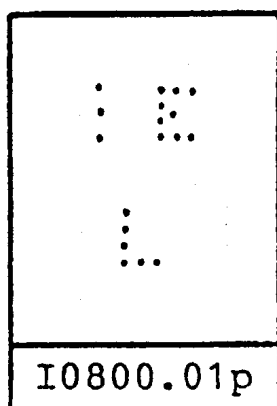


The vast majority of letters used were of the standard 4 hole type, but other larger letters were also used in combination with the smaller ones, notably 'A' and 'V'.



Two other devices may also have been used during this period to save the cost and delay in producing new dies - these are:-

- (a) deliberate pin removal to convert one letter into another,



- (b) the use of a letter in a new orientation.

A good indication of a Wartime Provisional perfin is the misalignment of letters, but additional confirmation is the actual stamp issues involved. At the time the works suffered damage the current postage stamps were the King George VI dark colours. Very shortly afterwards though, the lower values to 3d had their colours lightened as a wartime economy. These new shades were introduced progressively between the 21st July 1941 and the 28th September 1942. The majority of these in their turn were replaced by changed colours on 3 May 1951. Earlier chroniclers have indicated a relatively short life for these Wartime Provisionals. I have noted dates well into 1947 but have never seen an example on the changed colour issue of 1951.

Further study of this interesting group of perfins is required to catalogue more accurately the 'dies' involved. Collectors of these perfins are invited to send to the author photocopies of their holdings together with any supporting information such as issues, postmarks and legible dates.
