This die is likely to have been used, as a generalisation, in the '*North West*', with postmarks noted - Bolton, Halifax, Lancaster, Manchester, Maryport, Oldham, Radcliffe, Rawtenstall, St Helens, Shrewsbury, and Warrington.

The '*Anglo-American Oil Co Ltd*' was established 27th April 1888 as the UK distributing subsidiary of the American '*Standard Oil Co*', over time building up a nationwide network.

1891, but by 1895 we have the 'trading as' reference. W T Irving (born c1835) was a 'retired tobacco
manufacturer' in the 1901 census. There was no mention of the firm in a 1910 Directory.

In 1904 Samuel Courtauld (1876-1947) opened an artificial silk works in Foleshill, Coventry. In 1905 the '**Foleshill
Railway Co**', an independent industrial railway opened in 1901 to serve Webster's Brickworks, was extended to
serve the new Courtauld's factory. In WWI the line also served the Coventry Ordnance Factory (a Perfin user).

Company established by 1885 by (Sir) William Barclay Peat (1853-1936), who in 1891 took on the debts of
'Roderick Mackay & Co'. Other offices included the Royal Exchange - Middlesbrough, Scarborough, Barrow-in
Furness, as well as abroad - in India and Egypt (Cairo and Alexandria). W B Peat was knighted in 1912. W B Peat
is the 'P' in 'KPMG', which was founded in 1987, one of the 'Big Four' accounting organizations.

Their last newspaper reference in 1897 (after being struck off) gave their address as 41 Threadneedle St, London EC, which was the premises used by the 'Natal Land and Colonization Co Ltd' with whom they clearly had some relationship.

Alfred Alexander Gibbons (1863-1942) took over the 'West End' Flour Milling business of his brother Frederick Joseph Gibbons (1855-1885) in Benezet St, Ipswich, after his untimely death. Company still called 'A A Gibbons' in the 1920's, but had become 'Gibbons Ltd' by 1935.

Die in use c1895.

Note: Identity *suspected* from a loose stamp postmarked 'D21' Rich(mond), Sur(rey).

Daniel Watney (1826-1893) took over the brewery in 1877, becoming 'Daniel Watney & Son' in 1882, and 'Limited' on 21st March 1888. They also had a brewery in Croydon. The Brewery was acquired by Brandon's Putney Brewery Ltd in 1915, and subsequently closed.

[Established in 1892. In 1924 amalgamated with

'Burchard & Co', by then at 32 Fenchurch St, London EC, was wound up by order of the Board of Trade in August 1916 under the category of 'Enemy Firm'.
