C5670.01a C.O./W/L^{td}. 8,10/15/7,5,7 5½ Ø Coventry Ordnance Works Ltd, London SW. {Est 1905}. The Admiralty Contract Dept was based in New Buildings, St James' Park, London SW, and would have been heavily involved in setting up the company, originally a branch of 'Coventry Ordnance Co'.

Note: Identity *suspected* from a loose stamp (reported by **Bart Berends**) postmarked (Lo)ndon SW, NO 18/07. Die in use 1905-1910.

D4530.03 D&S/L^d 11,12,10/7,7 4½ IIIa Ø C Davidson & Sons Ltd, Paper Mfrs, Printers & Lithographers. Warehouse: 4 Trinity Quay, Aberdeen. Works: Mugiemon and Buxburn. [1895 Trade Directory. 'Ltd' in 1875. Still active today].

Note: Identity *suspected* from a loose stamp postmarked (Bu)cksburn (Aberdeen). Die in use 1900-1904.

H2330.04 HE/O 11,12/12 5½ Ø Harrods Ltd, Estate Agents & Auctioneers, West Byfleet. {Office set up by September 1924}.

Note: Identity *suspected* from loose stamps postmarked West Byfleet, Weybridge, Surrey. Die in use 1930-1935.

H2655.04 H.F.&C^o. 14,10/12,8,6 4½ IIIa Ø Hamilton, Fraser & Co, Steamship Owners & Brokers, Inch Line, 13 Castle St, Liverpool.

Note: Identity *suspected* from a loose stamp postmarked (Ex)change, (Liverp)ool, OC 14/95. Die in use c1895. This is a Sidney Allchin Product for a known customer.

I2490.01 ITC/L^d 4,6,7/6,7 4½ Ø Immediate Transportation Co Ltd, Shipping Agents, 33 St Mary-at-Hill, London EC3. {Est 1914}.

Note: Identity *suspected* from loose stamps postmarked London EC, and 'Paquebot'. Die in use 1920-1941.

I2490.01a ITC/L^d 4,6,7/6,6 4½ Ø Immediate Transportation Co Ltd, Shipping Agents, 33 St Mary-at-Hill, London EC3.

Note: Identity *suspected* from a loose stamp postmarked Billingsgate, (London EC3). Die in use c1940.

I2490.02 ITC/L^d 5,7,8/7,7 5 Ø Immediate Transportation Co Ltd, Shipping Agents, 33 St Mary-at-Hill, London EC3.

Note: Identity *suspected* without postmark evidence. Die in use c1935.

I2500.01v ITC/L^{td} 5,7,8/7,5,7 5 Ø Immediate Transportation Co Ltd, Shipping Agents, 33 St Mary-at-Hill, London EC3.

Note: Identity *suspected* from loose a 1938 cover with a 'Paquebot' cancel. Die in use 1935-1939. The cover has 'Rubber & Produce Traders Ltd' printed on the back, but stamp probably applied while on board the cargo ship (S.S. American Merchant) by an ITC representative en route to New York - Boston Mass GPO cancel.

M1540.02 M/C^o 15/8,4 4 Ø Marconi Company, Marconi House, Strand, London WC2. Die in use 1915-1920.

Note: Identity *suspected* from loose stamps postmarked London, and the fact that "M/C^o" (M1540.03), another product of an 'FIXO' affixer, is known positively used by the company.

Note: Identity *suspected* from a loose stamp (reported by **Ron** Mills) postmarked with a partial Lond(on EC) Hooded Circle. Die in use 1890-1895. The City Office & Showrooms were at this address by 1880, and remained there after the Works moved to Reading in 1901.

Note: This *positive* identity replaces the *suspected* identity in both 'Gault and 'Tomkins'. Die in use 1895-1915.

40 Cloth Fair, West Smithfields, London EC.

Note: Identity *suspected* from a loose stamp postmarked London, 17 MY/91. Die in use 1890-1892. The die was followed by "MIC" (M3090.03v) 1892-1907, and "MIC" (M3090.01v) 1907-1939.

1 SEP/1915}. Die in use 1912-1939.

Note: Oval cachet in mauve reads -‘COMPAGNIE FRANCAIS/PELLETIER & Co/LONDON BRANCH/???’.

F4330.01 F&W 7,14,11 4 I Faulkner & Winsor, African Dept., 147 Fenchurch St, London EC3. {Cover pmk London EC, AUG 22/1924}. Die in use 1915-1930.

J6000.01 J&P 7,5,11 7,2½,7 ‘x’ **Confirmation:** Johnson & Phillips, Electrical Engineers, Victoria Works, Charlton, London SE. {Cover pmk Woolwich, NO 27/01}. Die in use 1890-1915.

W5160.01a WM 16,15 4½ Ø William F Malcolm & Co, Merchants, 36 Leadenhall St, London EC. Also 85 Gracechurch St, London EC.

Note: Identity *suspected* from a loose 10/- Telegraph stamp cancelled Mark Lane B.O., EC, NO 5/78. Also known on a 6d Telegraph Form (Type 1b) first issued in 1894. Die in use 1878-1895.

W7310.01p WT 12,6 4½ World Transport Agency Ltd, 1 Martin Lane, Cannon St, London EC4. {Illustrated cover pmk London, 28 OCT/1941}. Die in use 1941-1950.

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From Bart Berends:

A1020.01 A.C 10,8 5½ Acton Corporation - Education (Dept). {See also “ADC” (A1660.01)}. Piece postmarked Acton - W3, 30 JAN/1934. Die in use 1925-1939.

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From David Higgs:

D4530.02M D&S/L^d 11,14,10/7,7 5 III Densham & Sons Ltd, Wholesale Tea Dealers, 49 & 51 Eastcheap, London EC. Die in use 1900-1915. { Sloper m/c N^o. 8685, fitted with 4x1 multiheaded die. Dispatched 22nd January 1900}.

Note: B16 used on receipt with part oval cancel in mauve ‘... (M)azawattee ...’. The Mazawattee Tea Co was established by ‘Densham & Sons Ltd’ - both ‘Ltd’ c1896. New Cross factory in Knoyle Street opened in 1901.
