Town Election Canceled

The Town Election scheduled for May 9, 2023 has been canceled due to the 2 registered candidates running unopposed, as per Section 422 of the Town Charter.

Section 422. Cancellation of Election Where Seat is Uncontested

In the event that the seat for Council is uncontested and the time period for filing a certificate of nomination has expired to file as either an official candidate or as a write-in candidate, then the Town Administrator/Clerk may cancel the election. If the election is canceled, the candidate running for the uncontested seat shall be declared elected and shall be sworn in as Councilman.

Congratulations to Rosalee Potter and Michael Sullivan! They will be sworn in on June 7, 2023 to terms ending in 2027.

How to Properly Display Your 9-1-1 Address

Every second counts during an emergency. Follow these steps to help emergency responders find your house quickly:

1. Know your 9-1-1 address - first responders will need it to locate you
2. Visible from both directions - can be seen when approaching from either direction on the street
3. Visible in the dark - use reflective materials
4. Use large numbers - at least 3-4 inches tall
5. Locate near the road - post at the end of your driveway or on your mailbox
6. Post twice on long/shared driveways - post at the end of the driveway and on each house when access is shared
7. Keep numbers uncovered - frequently trim back bushes, weeds, flowers, etc.
8. Test it out - approach from both directions, day and night, to see if you can easily spot your address

The Town requires grass to be kept at a height of 6 inches or less. Follow these tips to ensure the safety of yourself and others.

1. Never leave a running mower unattended
2. Keep children away from mower
3. Pick up rocks, sticks, and other debris before mowing
4. Only add fuel after engine has cooled
5. Do not blow clippings onto the sidewalk and street
