
Chapter President DOUGLAS DRAKE congratulates TOM DOUGLAS

Virginia rifleman William Waller carried this powder horn during the Revolutionary War. The horn is decorated with several popular slogans of the American Revolution, including "LIBERTY or DEATH" and "APPEAL TO HEAVEN." Waller was captured by British and Hessian forces after the fall of Fort Washington near New York City on Nov. 16, 1776.

In addition to being a county prosecutor, Vern served for several years with the California Department of Justice as Deputy Attorney General in the Appeals, Writs and Trial Division. Vern is currently the President of the California District Attorneys Association and is the co-chair of the association's ethics and insurance fraud committees. In 2006, Vern Pierson was elected as District Attorney of El Dorado County and is currently serving his fourth term. Vern has been a prosecutor for 28 years, serving in various capacities as Deputy District Attorney, Deputy Attorney General, and Chief Assistant District Attorney. In addition, he currently serves as the President of the California District Attorneys Association and is the author of the California Evidence Pocketbook. Vern received a Master's Degree from the Naval Postgraduate School, Center for Homeland Defense and Security (CHDS). His thesis argued for re-examination of the role of psychology within extremism and serves as a subject matter expert for CHDS. Vern has three children who each graduated from Oak Ridge High School. His two sons have served in active duty in the 82nd Airborne and his daughter is completing her teaching credential with hopes of being a high school teacher.



Detective Miller is an integral part of the **Narcotics Unit** where he compiles quality investigations, is extremely knowledgeable and a great teammate. He is always willing to help those around him, to include other teams from agencies statewide. He is commonly called upon by various state and federal narcotics teams, as well as the District Attorney's Office due to his quality of work and expertise. Detective Miller was the case agent of a fentanyl death investigation, conducting a thorough intelligence investigation which led to the arrest of several local sources of fentanyl and recovered a vast quantity of the drug. He conducted an extended covert investigation where he was able to utilize numerous investigative techniques to track down one of the largest sources of fentanyl in the Sacramento area. During the Spring and Summer, He was tasked with leading the Sheriff's Office efforts to eradicate illicit marijuana grow sites throughout the county. This mission included locating illegal marijuana grow sites, supervising the authoring of search warrants, and coordinating investigations with community partners to ensure safe and lawful eradication of marijuana grows.



Public Safety Dispatcher Kelsey Hartshorn is an essential part of the Dispatch Unit and provides the utmost dedication to the Sheriff's Office Mission and Vision. Kelsey is an excellent Communications Training Officer who strives for optimum officer safety and gives her trainees every opportunity to succeed. Kelsey cares for her coworkers and shows that same caring attitude to citizens requesting assistance. She is an excellent communicator, patient and empathetic with callers. The Chapter found its candidate in **Elke Houser**, a **Nurse Practitioner** at Barton Community Health Center in **South Lake Tahoe**. She was instrumental in setting up the first COVID testing site and medical clinic in South Lake Tahoe, California. This clinic was specifically set-up for testing and evaluation of patients possibly infected with the SARS Coronavirus.

Nurse Houser was well suited for this challenging assignment given her years of experience as an Emergency Room and Trauma Nurse, at Mercy San Juan, Dominican, Mercy Redding and St Elizabeth Hospital in California, Director of Nursing, Santa Cruz County Jail, Supervising Nurse Avenal and Pleasant Valley State Prisons, Nursing supervisor Montana VA Medical Center, Helena, Montana and ER/Trauma Nurse in Helena, Montana.

An added appeal to the Mother Lode Chapter is that **Elke Houser** (nee *Adams*) is a local El Dorado County woman. She went to school here from kindergarten to graduating from **Ponderosa High School** in Shingle Springs in 1981.
