The South of England to Virginia

The <u>Cavaliers</u> and <u>Indentured Servants</u> (<u>Gentry</u> influenced the <u>Southern United States</u>' early plantation culture)^[5]

North Midlands to the Delaware Valley

The Friends' Migration (Quakers influenced the Middle Atlantic and Midwestern United States' industrial culture)[6]

Borderlands to the Backcountry

The Flight from North Britain (Scotch-

<u>Irish</u> and <u>border English</u> influenced the <u>Western United States'</u> ranch culture and the <u>Southern United States'</u> common agrarian culture

The Existing (since 1986) CASSAR Spirit of America Program

Recognizing the Outstanding Eighth Grade Boy and Girl

The Spirit of America Award involves awarding two young people (one boy, one girl) from the district's / school's / graduating class to receive the **SAR Bronze Good Citizenship Medal** at their graduation ceremony.

Rules for the Award:

Students to be recognized are selected by school faculty using these criteria:

- DEPENDABILITY (Punctuality, truthfulness, honesty, loyalty, trustworthiness and self-control at school, home and in the community);
- COOPERATION: (Respect for authority, property and the rights of others, and courtesy);
- . LEADERSHIP: (Ability to improve the school experience for self and others); and
- PATRIOTISM: (Loyalty to the United States of America, knowledge of the purposes as expressed in the Preamble of the Constitution and the Declaration of Independence, and the meaning of and respect to the Flag of the United States of America).

Rules for SAR Chapter:

In cooperation with the school, determine: Where and when the awards are to be made

- . If an SAR Color Guard Member will be making the presentation
- If the medals are to be engraved determine content
- If the Certificate is to be framed

The Proposed (2022) Mother Lode Spirit of America Program

- The Mother Lode Chapter Spirit of America program, <u>unlike</u> the CASSAR program, recognizes Middle School Graduates <u>within</u> a District.
- The annual expense of sponsoring an eighth-grade graduation at a school (young man and young woman) is \$200. [2 x Bronze GC Medals + 2 Special Certificates + 2 custom shadow-box frames]
- The sponsoring family selects the school of their choice and provides a deposit of \$1,000 to assure 5 years of graduation sponsorship.
- The Chapter Treasurer will establish and monitor each family's account.
- The Chapter Youth Activities Coordinator will:
 - (1) Have access to the ML America Spirit Family accounts for expenses
 - (2) Make all arrangements with each school
 - (3) Procure the SAR Good Citizenship Medals (2 x school)
 - (4) Procure the SAR Good Citizenship Certificates (2 x school)
 - (5) Oversee the appropriate inscriptions on the certificates and medals
 - (6) Procure the Certificate & Medal frames to include assembly
 - (7) Arrange for SAR Color Guard Presentation at school agreed upon ceremony
- The Chapter President is responsible for:
 - monitoring the Spirit of America Family School Accounts to assure adequate reserve each year, and
 - (2) to take such action as necessary to sustain and maintain the Chapter's commitment to the schools that have agreed to participate,
 - (3) including soliciting replacement sponsoring families, if ever necessary.
- The Chapter Color Guard Commander is responsible for:
 - (1) Confirming the actual presentation time and location with the school
 - (2) Arranging for the Chapter Color Guard presenters
 - (3) Accepting the framed awards from the Youth Activities Coordinator
 - (4) Reading the Awards at the school presentation event
