The lengthening of the average human lifespan is one of the remarkable achievements of the 20th century. In 1900, life expectancy was only 47, but over those 100 years, it rose to 75 for men and 78 for women. The percentage of older persons in our global society is growing and expected to nearly double between 1990 and 2030.

This trend is no less apparent here in the United States and is especially noticeable within our own congregations of the Presbyterian Church (USA), where the average age of worshipers is 58 — and rising. For every worshiper under the age of 25, there are more than six worshipers over the age of 65, which account for 35% of all Presbyterians.

Our churches, which have traditionally focused on our youth members, must now answer this question: "How can we adjust our focus to better meet the needs of and utilize the skills and wisdom of our older persons?"

An 80-year-old parishioner said, "I am what I am, but how much more I would like to be! I want to remain sensitive, to do the things I can to lighten the load of others, and be a role model for healthy aging." As stated in one of the Psalms, "...In old age, they still produce fruit. They are always green and full of sap, proving that the Lord is upright."

Jesus invites us to practice faith on a daily basis and follow Him. Below is an excerpt from "The Daily Dad" by Ryan Holiday.

A Little Fellow Follows You

In 1939, nine years before John Wooden would be hired to coach the UCLA men's basketball team, a friend sent him a picture with a poem on it to celebrate the birth of Wooden's first child. The picture is a man on a

beach whose son is running behind him, playing in his footsteps in the sand. Wooden hung the picture in his home so he might see it every day. The poem, which he memorized and liked to give as a gift, went as follows:

A careful man I want to be—a little fellow follows me. I do not dare to go astray, for fear he'll go the self-same way. I cannot once escape his eyes. Whatever he sees me do he tries. Like me he says he's going to be-that little chap who follows me...

You don't have to memorize these words as Wooden did, but you better internalize their message. Your children follow behind you. They see everything you do. If you go astray, so too will they.

"Whoever serves me must follow me; and where I am, my servant also will be. My Father will honor the one who serves me." John 12: 26

If you are struggling to do this and are searching for help, here are some suggestions for your family. Please feel free to use any suggestions and adapt them freely to your situation and setting. This month's suggestions are: Continue reviewing the books of the New Testament through Philippians. Pray the Lord's Prayer each day and with the congregation during Worship, Pray at mealtime and each night at bedtime. Check out books from the church library to read to your children.

God bless you as you lead your children towards a better relationship with God.
