Compassion, Peace & Justice – a PC(USA) denominational focus "Your ancient ruins shall be rebuilt; you shall raise up the foundations of many generations; you shall be called the repairer of the breach, the restorer of streets to live in."—Isaiah 58:12

There are many agencies and ministries supported at the national level of our denomination (headquartered in Louisville, KY). CPJ is one arm of the Presbyterian Mission Agency of our denomination – PC(USA).

<u>The Compassion, Peace & Justice (CPJ)</u> engages with Presbyterians and partners across the U.S.A. and internationally to:

- End poverty and hunger
- Restore communities impacted by disaster
- Promote peace and transform cultures of violence
- Promote solidarity with people
- Promote solidarity with Creation

Embracing the invitation to be a "Matthew 25" church, their ministry area works to eradicate poverty, end systemic racism and bring tangible resources to impacted communities. They ask, "When did we see you, Lord?" as they accompany the imprisoned, oppressed and vulnerable, and seek to honor and protect all Creation.

Responding to the actions of our General Assembly, they support congregational and mid council vitality, equipping the church as it acts compassionately and prophetically in challenging times. They do this through accompaniment, advocacy, grant-making and community-centered development that is guided by global humanitarian standards.

Collaboration with mid-council networks, congregations and other ecumenical and interfaith partners is crucial to their work. Compassion, Peace & Justice is made up of 8 ministries:

- Office of Public Witness (OPW)
- Presbyterian Committee on the Self-Development of People (SDOP)
- Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA)
- Presbyterian Hunger Program (PHP)
- Presbyterian Mental Health Ministry
- Presbyterian Ministry at the United Nations (PMUN)
- Presbyterian Peacemaking Program
- Racial, Gender & Intercultural Justice Ministries

CPJ work is supported by the Pillars of the Church program and the Special Offerings of One Great Hour of Sharing, Peace and Global Witness, and the Pentecost Offering.
