FAQs concerning the new Temporary Instructional Permit (TIP) – goes live on September 4, 2018

Questions received and answered:

Can a 14 year old obtain a TIP from the OMV?

Yes, the programing is set up so any 14 year old may apply for the TIP. However, the student must be at least 14.9 years old and at a minimum in the 8<sup>th</sup> grade to take the 38 hour course. The owners and instructors shall carefully check the student's age on their Birth Certificate at enrollment. The student must be a minimum of 15 years old to take the Behind the Wheel Instruction.

Where does the student sign on the registration page?

The OMV did not include a place for a minor or adult student to sign. Enrollment is proof that they are taking a 38 or 14 course. The parents/legal guarding of Minors shall sign the Parent Consent to allow their son or daughter to take a driver education course with includes the Behind the Wheel instruction.

• Why does the student need to bring their Birth Certificate for enrollment if have a TIP from the OMV?

The owner and instructors shall verify with the birth certificate that the legal parent or guardian is signing for the minor student to take a 38 hour course. Custody of minor is very important and it needs to be verified.

 Can I add my school's information and change the Registration on the Driver Education and Course Information forms?

The three page form may not be altered. This is a Department of Public Safety /Office of Motor Vehicles form. The DPS form number is DPSMV 2410. Do not use this form for any other purposes other than a driver education or a pre-licensing course (38/14 hour). There is a place for the school's name and address.

 Can the student go to a PTA or OMV express office to obtain a TIP, Learner's Permit or full Driver's License before taking driver education?

No. The students, minors & adults, must go to the OMV for the TIP and again to the OMV for a first time issuance of a driving credential. After the student has a Learner's Permit, then they may go to a PTA and after the initial issuance of a driver license for a

17 year old or adult, then they may go to a PTA.

• Is there a charge at the OMV for the student to obtain a Learner's Permit or full Driver License after using the TIP for driver education?

No. There will not be a fee to convert the TIP to a first time issuance of a Learner's Permit or full Driver License. (There is a fee when going from a Learner's Permit to an Intermediate License and for renewals) The TIPs and driving credentials expire six (6) years after issuance.
