Woodlea Melrose is waking up! After a summer siesta, our neighborhood gets back in gear in the last quarter of the year. Here's a rundown of what we've got planned, take a look and pencil these in your own calendar!

Free Shredding Event

When: SAT Oct 8 from 8:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m.

Where: Melrose Center Parking Lot (corner of Montecito & 7th Ave)

Arizona ranks 9 th in the nation for identity theft in 2016. To help our neighbors keep their private information away from prying eyes, the AZ Center for the Blind's mobile shredding unit will be available to shred all your junk mail, medical bills, tax returns and any other paper that has sensitive information. The shredder can also handle credit cards and staples! All you have to do is get your papers gathered together, drive over and drop them off. There is no cost to neighbors to use this service.

Garage Sale

When: SAT Oct 15 from 7:00 a.m. to Noon

Where: Your Driveway!

After you get all of your old documents shredded, you might as well keep the organizing kick going and turn your clutter into cash. Each year, we advertise the neighborhood-wide sale on Craigslist and several newspapers and we benefit from attracting shoppers en masse. Throw a blanket down and hawk your wares in your driveway. Or do like I do, and go buy your neighbors' things.

We do ask for a \$5 donation to the neighborhood to help cover advertising costs if you make over \$50 at your sale.

Annual Neighborhood Block Party

When: SAT Nov 4 from 5 p.m. to 9 p.m.

Where: Montecito

This street party is our annual Block Watch event with the goal of introducing as many neighbors as possible. A strong community is the best defense against crime.

Like years past, we'll have plenty of food, from BBQ to side dishes to desserts, for people to enjoy. We completely block off Montecito so the whole street is open for kids to play and adults to mingle. Bring your family! This event is paid for with Block Watch funds and is free to everyone.

Please consider volunteering – we need help setting up, breaking down, cooking for 1-hour time slots and manning the neighborhood booth.

Luminarias

TRICK OR TREAT – ERIN HAGEMAN (MACKENZIE)



October is the spookiest time of the year and it's right around the corner. We've been in the 'hood for only two years, so we don't have a lot of experience to judge how much candy to buy. Our first year, Halloween fell on a Saturday, so we got enough kids to burn through the two huge bags of candy from Costco. But the following year, we had less trick-or-treaters on Sunday night. Since it falls on a Monday this year, I'm guessing we'll have the smallest turn out yet, but we're still planning on getting at least one jumbo bag from Costco. With all of the Halloween celebration and activities, it can also be pretty chaotic. The City of Phoenix Police Department suggests following the tips below to have a safe and happy Halloween. If you plan on celebrating, please be safe! Tips for Motorists:

Slow down and anticipate heavy pedestrian traffic.

Watch for children walking on roads, medians and curbs.

Turn your headlights on earlier in the day to spot children from greater distances.

Popular trick-or-treating hours are 5:30 p.m. to 9:30 p.m. so be especially alert for kids during those hours.

Enter and exit driveways carefully.

Don't pass stopped vehicles. The driver might be dropping off children.

Never drink and drive – if you plan to drink plan on having a designated driver or an alternate means of transportation.

Tips for Pedestrians (children and adults):

Before crossing a street, stop at the curb or edge of the road and look left, right, and left again to be sure cars are not coming. Continue to check for traffic while on the street. Cross the street only at intersections and crosswalks.

When crossing at an intersection with a traffic light, be sure to watch for turning cars. Obey all pedestrian signals.

Walk on sidewalks whenever possible. If there are no sidewalks, walk on the left side of the street facing traffic.

Tips for Parents:

Adults should accompany children at all times and supervise their "trick or treat" activities.

Teach children to "stop, look left-right-left and listen" before they cross the street. Use a flashlight, and wear retro-reflective strips or patches on your clothing or costume to be more visible to motorists.

Ensure that costumes do not impede walking or driving ability.

Tips for Pet Owners:

As much as your dog or cat may beg for some of your Halloween candy, always remember that chocolate is deadly to them in any amount.

Candy wrappers, such as tin foil, can get stuck in your pet's digestive tract and make them very sick.

Large dogs' tails or curious cats can knock over candles, Jack-O-Lanterns or other potentially flammable decorations. Keep pets away from holiday displays. Be careful that cats or dogs don't dart out the door when passing out candy.

Toasted however, is at the end of my street and, let's be frank how badly can you mess up grilled cheese? NEW FRONT PORCH LOTTERY PROGRAM - PATTI KARNES (9TH AVE)



Woodlea-Melrose Neighborhood Association is proud to announce a new front yard/porch seating program that we are able to fund through our yearly neighborhood grant! The idea behind this new program is to get people out in their front yards by compensating neighbors for purchasing front yard seating. Originally inspired by Ex-Mayor Phil Gordon's 2005 initiative to "bench crime" by getting folks in their front yards we are more likely to get to know our neighbors and be active participants in daily activities happening around the neighborhood.

So the way the program will work - 30 neighbors will be awarded (thru a lottery system) up to \$100 to purchase any kind of front yard/porch seating you like. So, say you win and have had your eye on the perfect front porch bench that costs \$180? You will be reimbursed \$100. Or if you have been drooling over a \$90 front yard chaise? You will be reimbursed \$90.

The lottery will open at our next neighborhood meeting September 20th and run thru November 1st. Winners will be announced at the Annual Neighborhood Cookout on November 5th. If you would like to enter your name you have a few ways you can do so.

Since January 2016, overall 15 homes have sold with an average sales price of \$314,325, 1530 was the average square feet, and price per square foot \$218.36. This gives an overall picture of the neighborhood with homes selling much above and below this average and it shows a variance depending on what condition and upgrades have been done to the home.

The chart below shows the sales of single family homes in the entire 85013 zip code from 2014-2016 for your reference and review. Many factors go into the pricing and sales of homes.
