Her short-term goal is to finish up at Rutgers and start counseling those suffering from addiction. But Luciann has bigger dreams and a long-term goal; to get her Doctorate in Social Work and open her own counseling center.

SUZANNE DOWNING

Is a resident of Madison. She graduated from SUNY Stony Brook, New York in 1988 with a Bachelors of Arts in Social Sciences. Suzanne worked in publishing for Hearst and Time Inc. for 19 years in various sales capacities ending up as a Sales Development Director. During that time she married, moved to Madison and had 2 boys (Max and Teddy). In 2008 she decided to take some time off to be home with her children. In May of this year she started working on classes required to apply for the Respiratory Therapy program at the County College of Morris. "It's my goal to graduate before my oldest son Max graduates from Madison High School", she said.

BETH WOLFE

Resides in Florham Park. In 1986, she graduated from Binghamton University with a Bachelors degree in math, and immediately began a 27-year career as an actuary, which included innumerable hours studying for and passing a series of 10 actuarial exams.
