Dec. 5: *Holiday Music Celebration* Dave Deluca performs the very best holiday favorites. His program is a feel-good family-oriented event filled with yuletide whimsy and winter wonder that celebrates the magic of the holiday seasons through songs.

Jan. 9, 1:30PM: *Top Secret Rosies,* a documentary will be shown at **1:30 PM** in the Chase Room of the Madison Public Library. We do not plan to have a business meeting on this day, but we reserved the room to allow for a discussion after the 60 min documentary. This is a program about the role of some women during World War II.

Feb. 6: *Implicit Bias* Michael Brownstein is an Assistant Professor of Philosophy at CUNY/John Jay College of Criminal Justice. His program introduces the concept of implicit bias and covers the psychological measurement of "implicit attitudes," evidence for the effects of implicit biases on most people's judgment and behavior, along with strategies anyone can adopt to become less biased. The focus will be on the effects of implicit bias in the justice system, including questions about responsibility for implicit bias and the relationship between implicit bias and explicit prejudice.

Mar. 6: *Bridge Builder in Petticoats* Carol Simon Levin brings to life the lost stories of fascinating and forgotten women like Emily Warren Roebling, who in 1881 stepped in for her ailing husband to supervise the building of the Brooklyn Bridge. Carol is a Youth Services Librarian at the Bridgewater Branch of the Somerset County Library. She is an experienced storyteller and a member of the New Jersey Storyteller's Network and the Society of Children's Books Writers and Illustrators. She has always been fascinated by the history of technology and women's history.


