#### **Book Sale**

The Book Sale was a great success! Our **net profit** for this year was **\$9,062**, making this the most profitable sale since 2003. Many thanks to all of the members who helped by donating time and/or money. Several of our newer members gave a lot of time. Even with all the help from members and friends, we needed to increase the paid helpers from prior years. We had a new group of helpers, mostly students from St. Elizabeth and Drew. Your generous donations of \$1,245 did not cover their cost. Our other significant expense was cost of table rental and incidentals to the College of St. Elizabeth for \$1,728.

We have already scheduled a sale in the same location for June 3-9, 2019. Looking ahead, we will need more help if we are to continue holding a book sale. Please keep the dates in mind as you schedule yourself for next June and try to give as much time as you can to the sale. To make it easier for everyone to participate, we are reorganizing the collection as well as the selling days creating tasks that can be accomplished sitting and we'll make the schedules more flexible. If you know of any book lovers who would just like to volunteer for a few hours of sorting or selling, please recruit them.

Books For Taiwan is an organization that ships books to Taiwan and distributes them all over the country. For the past few years they have been a tremendous help in taking leftover books and helping us clean up on the last day. We can use more organizations to take leftover books on Sunday afternoon next year. Let us know of any group that might want leftover books, especially adult books. This year every single children's book was sold or donated.

Hospitality

Our hospitality process worked well. But we would like to have a coordinator, so please volunteer to take on November and December meetings. At our Potluck Dinner in the Fall we will ask members to volunteer for the next two meetings or if they wish for the next half of the year.
