Dear Friends,

I recently read an awe inspiring article recently by David Brooks, one of my favorite pundits. He writes an Opinion Column for the New York Times. Brooks adapted an essay from his book "How to Know a Person: The Art of Seeing Others Deeply and Being Deeply Seen." The essay title is "The Essential Skills for Being Human" in which he describes his journey to finding a more emotional existence and connection to others.

It's been said (NPR and others) that we are experiencing a loneliness epidemic which arose during our Covid isolation. Brooks came up with a list of skills found in persons who connect with others. He calls those persons "illuminators."

- 1. "The gift of attention" refers to our need to attend to others with warmth and enthusiasm because each is a "creature with infinite value and dignity."
- 2. "Accompaniment" describes "an othercentered way to being with people during the normal routines of life." I know that when I have a list of errands, efficiency demands that I say nothing more than "Hello" and "How are you?" But, that is not a good way of being there.
- 3. "The Art of Conversation" starts with "being a loud listener." Then, Brooks goes on

to "Storify whenever possible" referring to asking questions that suggest they relate experiences with others that shaped their values. Turn your partner into a narrator with follow-up questions. "Don't be a topper" by shifting conversation back to yourself.

- 4. You can improve on the quality of your conversation by asking big questions; that is, don't be cautious as adults tend to be.
- 5. Start your conversation by putting yourself in the listener's shoes.

I like his description of "The illuminators offer the privilege of witness. They take the anecdotes, rationalizations and episodes we tell and see us in a noble struggle. They see the way we're navigating the dialectics of life – intimacy versus independence, control versus freedom – and understand that our current selves are just where we are right now on our long continuum of growth." I must say that all of you who attended my talk about my memoir are illuminators. We had a wonderful conversation that left us all feeling more connected. Thank you for listening.
