The Ocean Cleanup, Netherlands: The Ocean Cleanup

while it focuses on <u>not</u> producing any waste, what about the waste that's already produced? What is the best, most sustainable way to deal with removing existing waste? One organization has figured out a creative way to do just that.

They traveled to the oceans, specifically the Pacific Ocean, where <u>The Ocean</u> <u>Cleanup</u> began its first plastic clean-up operations in 2019. While the organization is headquartered in the Netherlands, its operations are actually in the seas and rivers all over the world. The Ocean Cleanup is on a mission to remove 90% of all ocean plastic by 2040. But how?

The majority of ocean plastic actually ends up in 5 key areas where the natural ocean currents create 5 gyres (massive whirlpools). Using a "U" shape funnel they have created, they are able to guide and capture plastic pieces at these gyres. The plastics are then collected, sorted, and processed for recycling into new products like **Sunglasses**, including hard cases, and fabric bags. 
