

Did you know that Whidbey Island prairie is the ideal habitat for Garry Oak trees and the oak trees there were once part of a much larger ecosystem stretching from British Columbia to California? Today only a few older Garry Oak trees grow in a very small park called Smith Park near old downtown Oak Harbor. The rest were chopped down to build buildings, homes, furniture or to burn for heat. 

Camano Water Association (CWA) is looking for a candidate to fill the role of Business Manager. The individual chosen for this position will report to the Board of Trustees and be a full-time (salaried) employee. The successful candidate should expect to work with minimal supervision (after training with the current Business Manager) and demonstrate excellent time management skills. The focus of the position includes tasks relating to both accounting and payroll, such as taking care of accounts payable/receivable, and the use of Intuit QuickBooks to support the operations of the office. The position also includes making bank deposits and transfers to all relevant accounts, and the detailed tracking of such transactions. It is also the role of the Business manager to complete payroll monthly and maintain confidential staff files for all employees of CWA.

The Business Manager for CWA also represents the first point of contact with our association membership, and as such is also responsible for monitoring the office phone/email system and addressing any questions or concerns that may arise from among our membership. The role also involves interacting with external vendors to complete tasks relating to the timely billing of our customers on a bi-monthly basis. 

Kid's Korner

A KID FRIENDLY BATIK



Traditional batik is done using wax but this method using glue is a tried and true favorite amongst crafters AND perfect for kids! DO NOT USE WHITE GLUE. Elmer's Blue GEL GLUE is the perfect alternative! It flows easily out of the bottle and dries fairly quickly and is the only type of glue I recommend when using this technique. If doing this project with kids I also recommend using smaller bits of fabric. My daughter and I once tried to glue batik t-shirts and it took FOREV-ER to cover them in glue which did not hold my daughter's interest for very long. For this project we used small canvas bags.

MATERIALS: Gel Glue; Canvas Bags, T-shirts, or fabric; Acrylic paint; Foam brush; Cardboard; Pencil

DIRECTIONS: Time needed: 45 minutes. Time does not include drying and washing. 1. Sketch your design. Sketch outlines of your design in pencil on the fabric or canvas. 2. Draw with glue. Draw over the pencil design with the gel glue. TIP: Keep designs simple, the glue will spread out as it dries. If the lines are too close together they will blend. 3. Let Dry. Let glue fully dry. This may take several hours or overnight. Paint the fabric. 4. Paint over the designs with acrylic or fabric paint. Let dry completely for several hours. If you are using a canvas bag, place a piece of cardboard between the two layers of canvas to prevent the paint from soaking through to the back of the bag. 5. Wash off the glue! Wash the fabric in hot water in the washing machine to remove glue. Be sure to wash it separately from other

FIZZING SIDEWALK CHALK

Make this fun, fizzing twist to sidewalk chalk paint!

WHAT YOU'LL NEED:

- · Cornstarch
- Baking soda
- Water
- Food coloring
- Squeeze bottles.
- · White vinegar
- · Spray bottle
- · Measuring cups.



HOW TO DO IT:

- Start by mixing up the base for the paint. Combine equal parts comstarch, baking soda and water using a measuring cup.
- Add this mixture to the squeeze bottle. Decide what color you want the paint to be and add a few drops of food coloring. Close the bottle and shake to combine.
- 3. Repeat this process until the bottles are filled.
- 4. Fill up a spray bottle with white vinegar.
- Now you're ready to go outside and start painting! Test an area of the sidewalk first to make sure the paint won't stain - it should wash away with water.
- 6. Use the squeeze botties to make some colorful creations on the sidewalk. Let these dry a bit and then spray with the vinegar and watch what happens!
- Keep experimenting! See if you can get the paint to fizz more by changing the ratio of cornstarch, baking soda and water.

BEACH 1 GALLERY ART SHOW FOR RON KING



Ron King was born in the small town of Manson on Lake Chelan in Eastern Washington, Ron is a graduate of Washington State University where he studied anthropology. He began his photographic career in Wenatchee in 1973, and in 1981 moved to the Skagit Valley where he then owned and operated a photography studio for many years. In 1991, Ron developed an interest in adapting the computer for use in his professional photography business, first restoring old photos, retouching and enhancing images, and soon after began his pioneering experiments in the artistic side of the medium. He created popular, creative artistic additions to his portrait and wedding photography business, always striving to add extra impact to his images. And then he decided to have Lasik surgery to free him from wearing contact lenses, and instead found his vision altered in a way that ultimately ended the photography part of his career. Feeling driven to continue in the visual arts, he ultimately found inspiration the most unlikely place – from the failed eye surgery itself. For a few years, until he found a different kind of contact lens that gave back his ability to see, Ron was fascinated by the sinuous streaks (Hancock lines - named in honor of the surgeon who did the surgery.) he saw at night when looking at bright lights. His goal was to find a way to share that experience – an insight into a new and mysterious world. After years of experimenting, in 2016 Ron finally developed the techniques that allowed him to share his new vision, and he began creating an entirely original body of work, creating images that go well beyond the photographic image. And his style was born.

Artist Statement: "My art expresses the unknown beyond the familiar. Stratomorphic Rendering is a process I've created involving a combination of photography and a unique mixed digital media process that transforms into a completely different artistic expression, bringing out stronger, and often unrelated, messages. A visual experience of the world as I see it. Each piece takes between 30 hours and three years to complete."

YMCA PARTNERS WITH SCHOOL DISTRICT TO SOLVE TRANSPORTATION CHALLENGES

The Stanwood-Camano School District (SCSD) has agreed to provide transportation for YMCA School-Age Care (SAC) students for the 2023-24 school year, reducing the amount of time children spend on buses and making it more efficient for families to drop-off and pick-up their children at sites close to home. The YMCA School-Age Care site at Utsalady Elementary School also serves students at Elger Bay Elementary on the south end of Camano Island. Last year, due to high enrollment numbers and reduced staff, the Y was unable to provide multiple bus runs and relied on district support in the afternoons. The drive from Elger Bay to Utsalady took over 45 minutes every afternoon. This year, we hoped for a new solution to the transportation challenges. The district worked out the logistics to make the Y program at Utsalady the first drop-off, eliminating that long bus ride. Families will save valuable time by having their children at sites close to home and won't have the additional minutes of driving from Stanwood to Camano Island and back again – twice every day. "We are grateful for the support of school staff and the Superintendent who believe in our programs and recognize that partnering together improves quality of life for families in the Stanwood-Camano School District," said Vital. "We can continue to provide high-quality, impactful care for these students and we don't have to worry about transportation concerns that can be a huge barrier for families." With school starting for most students Tuesday, Sept. 5, the Stanwood-Camano School District urges all drivers to brush up on the rules of the road when it comes to safely operating around school buses and school zones. Drivers must always stop if they're traveling in the same direction as the school bus. On a two-lane road, traffic in both directions needs to stop. Please keep in mind that even if drivers are not required to stop, they need to proceed with caution. Failure to stop for a school bus can run you a \$500 ticket, per state law. Remember that 20 mph school zones are active again — so drive cautiously near schools and crosswalks. There will be 50 buses out each morning and afternoon traversing the 140 square miles in the Stanwood-Camano School District. And while the big yellow school bus is one of the safest vehicles on the road, according to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, district officials said they hope that everyone stays extra alert as we get back into our school routines. BLOOMING CHICKEN PULL-APART QUESADILLAS



INGREDIENTS: 3 c. cooked and shredded chicken breast; 1 sm. yellow onion, finely chopped; 1 red bell pepper, finely chopped; 1 jalapeño, finely chopped; 1 c. taco sauce; 20 (8-inch) flour tortillas cut in half; 3 c. shredded sharp cheddar cheese; 3 c. shredded Monterey jack cheese; 2 T. chopped cilantro for garnish; Salsa for serving; Sour cream for serving

DIRECTIONS: 1. Preheat the oven to 375 degrees. Line a baking sheet with parchment paper. Place a pint-size Mason jar or glass in the center of the baking sheet; set aside. 2. To a large bowl, add cooked shredded chicken, chopped onion, red bell pepper, jalapeño, and taco sauce, stir to combine; set aside. 3. Cut tortillas in half. Place about 2 tablespoons each of the cheddar cheese, Monterey Jack cheese, and chicken mixture on each tortilla half. Roll the tortillas into cones, starting from the cut edge and making sure not to push the ingredients out of the tortilla. 4. Place 13 filled cones (seam side down) around the jar to create a ring. The points of the cones should be touching the jar. Sprinkle cheddar and Monterey Jack cheese over the layer. Repeat with the remaining cones to make 2 more layers, finishing with the rest of the cheddar and Monterey Jack. Remove the jar from the center of the ring. 5. Bake until the cheese is melted and the edges of the tortillas are crispy, 15-20 minutes. 6. Carefully transfer the blooming quesadilla to a serving platter OR serve from the baking tray. Place your dip of choice inside the ring and top with fresh chopped cilantro. Serve immediately
