WHAT WILL IT COST?

- State law limits tax revenue growth of CIFR and similar districts to 1% per year, unless voters approve a "levy lid lift."
- In 2017, voters approved a levy rate of \$1.35 per \$1,000 of appraised property value. Over time, as property values have increased, the levy rate has dropped all the way to \$0.83 per \$1,000 to comply with the 1% annual revenue growth limit.

BOTTLE CAP BUGS!

Directions: Step 1: Using the transparency paper, cut any shape of wing. Step 2: Color the wings in using the Sharpie markers using any pattern or design. Step 3: Hot glue or use Elmer's Glue to glue the wings onto the bottle cap. Step 4: Glue the googly eyes on to the front of the bottle cap.

JALAPENO POPPER CHICKEN SOUP

CookingMamas. com INGREDIENTS: 8 strips thick-cut bacon, cut into 1/2-inch pieces, divided; 1 med. yellow onion, finely chopped; 1 lg. green bell pepper, seeded and chopped; 4 jalapenos, seeded and finely chopped; 4 cloves garlic, pressed; 1 tsp. kosher salt, divided; 1/4 c. all-purpose flour; 4 c. low-sodium chicken broth; 2 c. whole milk; 4 oz. cream cheese, cut into 1-inch cubes, room temperature; 2 c. cooked shredded chicken breast (about 2 breasts); 1 c. shredded sharp cheddar cheese; 1 jalapeno, thinly sliced for garnish

DIRECTIONS: In a large pot over medium heat, cook the bacon stirring occasionally until crisp about 8-10 minutes. Transfer the bacon to a paper towel lined plate. Leave about 1/4 cup bacon fat in the pot. Add onions, green bell peppers, jalapenos, garlic, and 1/2-teaspoon salt to the pot, and cook over medium heat stirring often until softened about 5-6 minutes. Stir in the flour until it coats the vegetables and forms a paste that starts to stick to the bottom of the pot for about 1-2 minutes. Whisk in broth and milk until combined. Bring to a boil, then reduce the heat to medium-low and simmer, stirring occasionally until the liquid is reduced by one-quarter and slightly thickened for about 10 minutes. Stir in softened cream cheese cubes until fully melted. Add chicken and three-quarters of the bacon. Cook stirring until the chicken and bacon are heated through about 1-minute. Season with remaining 1/2-teaspoon salt. Ladle soup into bowls and top with shredded cheddar cheese, the remaining bacon, and sliced jalapenos if desired, Enjoy! Serves 6




