



NON-TOXIC GLOW-IN-THE-DARK DAY OF THE DEAD LANTERNS



So easy to make. These would also make for a great party craft or altar decoration for Día de Los Muertos. To make the lanterns glow, you can use non-toxic, glow-in-the-dark paint. For the original craft, we used glow-in-the-dark sticks. These can be toxic, and some sticks can have glass inside. Breaking the glow in the dark sticks can be dangerous as well. That is why we have replaced the glow-in-the-dark sticks with safe, non-toxic glow-in-the-dark paint. You can make these skull lanterns in three easy steps: Using the Sharpie marker, paint a fun sugar skull or Calavera design on the front of each mason jar. Using the brush, paint the inside of the jar with glow-in-the-dark paint. Let the paint dry before closing the jar.

Day of the Dead Lanterns Using Glow-in-the-Dark Sticks: As mentioned before, you can also make these using glow-in-the-dark sticks. To make the glow-in-the-dark lanterns using glow sticks, start by cutting a glow-in-the-dark stick in half. Make sure that you use gloves when you cut the sticks. Do not let children handle or cut them as the chemicals inside the glow stick can irritate skin and eyes. Some glow sticks also have glass inside! _So be careful when handling them as there might be glass shards inside the glow stick. Pour the glow in the dark liquid inside the mason jar. Close the jar tightly and shake it, ensuring the liquid covers all the inside of the mason jars. You should use proper safety materials like safety glasses and gloves to protect your eyes and skin.

WHAT WILL IT COST?

- State law limits tax revenue growth of CIFR and similar districts to 1% per year, unless voters approve a "levy lid lift."
- In 2017, voters approved a levy rate of \$1.35 per \$1,000 of appraised property value. Over time, as property values have increased, the levy rate has dropped all the way to \$0.83 per \$1,000 to comply with the 1% annual revenue growth limit.
- This levy lid lift pro- poses a rate of \$1.25 per \$1,000, still below the rate approved in 2017, but sufficient to fund much needed increases in CIFR staffing, infrastructure and services.

WHAT WILL WE GET?

- More first responders. The levy will allow CIFR to hire an additional six career firefighters and staff one more paramedic unit — important because call volumes are increasing.
- **Full-time Mabana Station.** Our southernmost station is only staffed Monday through Friday with full-time and volunteer firefighters when available. The levy will allow for the station to have someone on duty 24/7!







FRUIT & NUTS: (Select 4-5 options) Mandarin Oranges with Celery Stems, Dried Apricots & Dates, Grapes – Green, Red and/or Black, Red or Green Apple Slices, Assorted Fresh Berries, Pears, Figs, Mixed Nuts, Cashews, Pistachios, Almonds

CHOCOLATE & CANDY: Include a variety of flavors and textures, wrapped, and unwrapped.

PASTRIES & COOKIES: Choose a variety of cookies. Look for soft, crunchy, and sandwich filled cookies.

FRUIT & NUTS: Both dried and fresh fruit will add gorgeous color and lots of flavor to your charcuterie board! Nuts such as cashews, pistachios, and almonds should be shelled and salted. Mix and match selections.

Then the copy sneaks in at the end, "and in rare instances, blindness or even death." Holy crap! What did I just sign up for?

For weeks leading up to my surgery, several supportive friends told me they'd had the same procedure, that it was a breeze, and how glad they are that they did it. I learned the typical cataract surgery only takes 20 to 45 minutes – so, roughly the same amount of time it takes Domino's to deliver my pepperoni pizza.

I want to thank everybody who gave me calming words of encouragement. This list, however, does NOT include my buddy Raymond, who told me – and I'm not making this up – "I hope your doctor isn't Dr. Witherspoon. He lost his license after he caused several people to go blind as a result of his botched surgeries." Raymond shared this traumatizing story one day before I went in for my operation. Thanks, buddy.

Here's a fun fact that kept me up at night for weeks before my cataract surgery: You're CONSCIOUS during the entire procedure. Well, sort of. You're sedated, but technically you're still awake. At least that's what Raymond told me.

Every year since that initial diagnosis, my eye doctor has reminded me the dreaded day was coming. Recently, that frightful day finally arrived. I went in for cataract surgery on my right eye. And in two weeks – assuming I haven't gone blind, died, or fled the area in a panic – I'm scheduled to do the other eye.

Thankfully, they drugged me up so much I had no idea what was going on during my procedure. 
