Camano Water Association (CWA) is looking to fill the role of Water System Technician. The individual chosen for this position will be under the direct supervision of the Operations Manager, who is responsible for routine operations, systems operations, equipment maintenance, water sampling, and customer service. As such, whether a candidate has prior experience or not, our current Operator will be responsible for deciding the day-to-day scope and workload of the successful candidate. This list of possible work duties is not exhaustive, and any/all tasks considered within the scope and spirit of the position are expected to be undertaken by the successful candidate. Because ... well, you know why. These thugs were basically cowards, that's why.

So I decided to put an end to this cheating. Kind of ruined the game and we were required to play the stupid game. This, dear reader, is probably as good an allegory for life in these partisan times as you're gonna want. Needless to say, the cheaters, once confronted, feigned courage. "Who's gonna make us?" one of the gang said, and I said, well ... you know what I said. Me. And then we 'rumbled' as they say in Milwaukee. I took the first punch to the stomach. I took the second punch to the face. After that I don't remember what body part I slammed against my opponent's fist, but I do remember the teacher who advised us to handle this ourselves, breaking up the slaughter and dragging us both to the principal's office. Where we were given verbal lashings and detentions, both of which my coward bully laughed off in the principal's face.

What I learned from this and a few other similar confrontations, bullies aren't necessarily cowards, they're just bullies. Creeps and sadists, brutes and users, I don't know where my teachers and my folks got their psychology degrees, but from personal experience I have to say they should ask for a refund on their tuition.



THE DANGERS OF VARIETY

- 4.0
- Causes irroversible brain damage: The part of the brain that's responsible for decision making and impulse control is not yet fully developed until age 25. Teens and young adults are at risk for long-lasting effects including nicotine addiction, mood disorders, and permanent lowering of impulse control.
- Causes attention and learning problems: Nicotine also changes the way synapses are formed, which can harm the parts of the brain that control attention and learning.
- 3. Nicotine in vape is highly addictive: Each time a new memory is created or a new skill is learned, stronger connections or synapses are built between brain cells. Young people's brains build synapses faster than adult brains. Because addiction is a form of learning, adolescents can get addicted more easily than adults.
- Gateway to smolking: Kids who vape are 4x more likely to start smoking which can lead to a lifetime of nicotine addiction.
- Toxic chemicals & metals: E-cigarette aerosol isn't harmless water vapor – it can contain toxic chemicals and metals.
- Weakens immune system: Vaping weakens the immune system, increasing susceptibility to all kinds of illnesses and infections.
- Nicotine everload: Teens may not realize the level of nicotine they
 are inhaling. For example, 1 JUUL pad = 20 cigarettes worth of nicotine.
- Blood vessal damage: Vape that contains nicotine can increase blood pressure and heart rate and cause arteries to stiffen up. That means a higher risk for a cardiovascular event (think heart attack).





SWEET POTATO CASSEROLE WITH PRALINE TOPPING

A 30+ year tradition in our family, this casserole is always on our holiday table. We like to top leftovers with whipped cream and call it dessert. Enjoy!



SWEET POTATO CASSEROLE: 4 c. mashed sweet potatoes (about 3-4 lg. roasted sweet potatoes); 1/4 c. unsalted butter melted; 1/4 c. heavy cream; 2 lg. eggs; 1/4 c. brown sugar packed; 1/2 tsp. salt; 1 tsp. vanilla extract

PRALINE TOPPING: 1/2 c. all-purpose flour; 1/2 c. brown sugar packed; 1/4 c. unsalted butter melted; 1/4 tsp. salt; 3/4 c. chopped pecans

DIRECTIONS:

- 1. Preheat oven to 400 degrees. Line a rimmed baking sheet with foil and spray with non-stick cooking spray.
- 2. ROASTED SWEET POTATOES: Bake sweet potatoes in their own jackets (do not peel). Wash each potato and prick with a fork. Bake on prepared baking sheet for 40 to 60 minutes (depending on the size of the potatoes) or until soft when poked with a fork. Let potatoes cool, peel and mash for casserole.
- 3. Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Butter a 2-quart or 9 x 13-inch baking dish; set aside.
- 4. SWEET POTATO CASSEROLE: In a large bowl, using an electric hand mixer, beat warm mashed sweet potatoes, melted butter, heavy cream, eggs, brown sugar, salt, and vanilla until combined. Spread sweet potato mixture in prepared baking dish.
- 5. PRALINE TOPPING: In a medium bowl, combine flour, brown sugar, melted butter, salt, and pecans, stir until moist and the mixture clumps together. Sprinkle mixture over the top of the sweet potatoes in an even layer. Bake for 25-30 minutes or until golden brown. Enjoy!!
