



Camano Water Association (CWA) is looking to fill the role of Water System Technician. The individual chosen for this position will be under the direct supervision of the Operations Manager, who is responsible for routine operations, systems operations, equipment maintenance, water sampling, and customer service. 





WEATHER AND PAIN?

How does weather affect our joints and energy? Did you ever know someone who could "smell" snow or rain before it came? What they "smell" is a change in the electrical charge in the air. I understand pain, as I have arthritis and fibromyalgia. This will happen because our bodies slow their production of both adrenaline and cortisone in the evening so we can go to sleep. It's part of our circadian rhythm. So what can we do to manage this? Well, depending on the problem, whether it is pain, mood, or energy, there are some solutions. If the problem is simply energy, then it will be useful to stay away from simple carbohydrates such as sugar, starches, and junk food. Eat foods that will sustain you and not bring the "crash" you feel after that morning donut or muffin. Don't assume that caffeine is the answer, either. Chronic pain, chronic fatigue and depression all present unique challenges. They all can be affected by nutrition, exercise, sunlight and barometric pressure. A good support is exercise; simple stretching, gentle or seated yoga, meditation. Essential oils in a bath or shower help tremendously. 





DID YOU KNOW?

Originally known as Macy's Christmas Parade—to signify the launch of the Christmas shopping season—the first Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade took place in New York City in 1924. It was launched by Macy's employees. Today, some 3 million people attend the annual parade and another 44 million watch it on television.

PREPARING FOR STORMS

The sunsets are getting earlier and the temperature is getting (ever so slightly) cooler which can only mean one thing: fall is almost here! As the leaves change colors, fall also ushers in the unofficial start of what is often the busiest time of the year for us here at the PUD: storm season. The PUD works all year to prepare for storm season. We monitor National Weather Service briefings, attend (and provide) trainings, stock our warehouses and trim up to 750 line miles of vegetation annually to minimize the falling of trees and branches. We also review and finalize our Mutual Aid agreements. The PUD has Mutual Aid agreements with public power utilities across the Pacific Northwest. These agreements allow us to access assistance from other utilities when we're impacted by major winter storms, which allows us to get power back more quickly for customers. The PUD received assistance from utilities across Oregon and Washington during the major windstorm we experienced last November. As part of these agreements, we also send help to other utilities when assistance is requested. Hours that are worked are paid for by the utility receiving the assistance. Recent examples of the PUD providing mutual aid include assisting Guam in their recovery after Typhoon Mawar and assisting Willamette Valley utilities restoring power after wildfires. We consider getting ready for storm season a year-round job but there are ways you and your family can prepare for the upcoming storm season too! The biggest thing is to make an emergency preparedness kit. Items in your kit should be sufficient to get you through a three-to-five day outage, and include items such as: Non-perishable food; Blankets and pillows; Flashlights; Extra batteries; First-aid kit; Bottled water; Personal hygiene supplies; Prescription medications; Games and books for entertainment; And enough supplies for your pets for three to five days as well. Once a storm hits, that's when it's time to jump into action! First off, stay informed. Follow us on X (formerly Twitter) and Facebook and check local media for updates. It's also important to have a backup plan. Designate an out-of-area contact to help with communicating and have an alternate meeting place for your family. If you have special medical needs, consider a backup generator or have another place to stay. While the outage is still going, protect food by keeping your refrigerator and freezer doors closed as much as possible. NEVER use a gas stove or charcoal grill indoors because of the risk of carbon monoxide poisoning. Finally, have extra batteries for flashlights and always use extreme caution if you use candles or oil lamps. Never leave them unattended and keep them away from furniture, drapes and other flammable materials. REMEMBER: it is never safe to approach a power line that is on the ground. You don't even have to touch a fallen line to be electrocuted, which can be fatal. Always stay at least 30 feet from the power line and call the PUD immediately, any time of day, at 425-783-1001. If the fallen line is life-threatening – for example, causing a fire, sparking or touching an occupied car – also call 911. Together we can help each other stay safe and get through another wild winter in the Pacific Northwest! - Snohomish PUD.



WINNERS' NUANCES CAPTURE JUROR'S ATTENTION

in NWWS 83rd International Open Exhibition. Whether representational or non-objective, it's the nuances of a painting that made a visceral connection to juror Stan Kurth when he chose the winners of the Nothwest Watercolor Society's (NWWS) 83rd International Open Exhibition. The awards reception took place October 28th at Matzke Fine Art Gallery and Sculpture Park located in the woods of Camano Island. First place of \$2,000 cash went to Christine Alfery for "Talisman." "This is a surrealistic beach festival," said Kurth, "with the numerous contrasts and variety of shapes, lines, textures and colors that create movement. A worthy painting." Second place of \$1,300 was presented to Carla O'Connor for "Dreamer." Carla commented that sat around for 20 years because of the model's difficult pose. She wanted to make negative shapes positive and combine realistic human form with non-objective. "A marvelous design with the postive and negative," responded Kurth. "The painting is a totem with the gradation of colors going up. The figure imbedded in the totem is amazing – sitting with the knee up and the hand embracing it. An excellent, excellent painting." The optical illusion of Thomas Schaller's "Fade – NYC" intrigued Kurth's interest to award Schaller third place of \$850. "Wonderful contrast of the nostaglic background and the two contemporary subjects in front with the cape draping over the adjacent chair which is physically impossible. It's there for design and composition but it's so subtle you don't notice it right away. Or the little dog underneath," said Kurth. The Purchase Award of \$1,000 went to Lisa Pope for "Searching for a Seahorse." Paintings in this category are a permanent collection housed at the Fred Hutchinson Cancer Center in Seattle. Pope, a diver, had been looking for the illusive seahorse when she saw her crystal paper weight and thought, maybe I can do a still life. 'This is a wonderful composition – a serpentine composition. The dark at the top to the light below has movement that keeps interest in the painting. It's all intentional, right," Kurth mused with Pope. Twelve other awards went to paintings that Kurth felt had a correlation between captivating content and mastery of the medium. 



LEFTOVER STUFFING WAFFLES WITH MAPLE GRAVY

Transform leftover stuffing into crispy, savory, waffles drizzled with maple gravy, then topped with homemade cranberry sauce and/or poach egg, Enjoy!



INGREDIENTS: 4 c. leftover stuffing; 2 lg. eggs, lightly beaten; 1/2 c. shredded cheddar cheese; 1-3 T. milk as needed; 1 c. leftover gravy; 1 T. maple syrup; 1/4 c. leftover cranberry sauce, optional; 4 poached eggs, optional

DIRECTIONS: 1. In a large bowl, combine stuffing, 2 lightly beaten eggs and cheddar cheese. If the batter is too dry, add milk 1 table-spoon at a time. (Note: The stuffing should be moist, but still thick.) 2. Preheat your waffle iron. Spray the waffle iron with nonstick cooking spray. 3. Spread the stuffing mixture across the surface of the iron. Cook until both sides are golden brown and crispy, about 4-6 minutes. (Note: These waffles take more time to cook. Don't repeatedly open the waffle iron while the waffle is cooking, or it will lose its shape.) Gently open the iron and remove the waffle with a fork and spatula. Repeat with the remaining batter. 4. Meanwhile, in a small saucepan, combine the gravy and maple syrup over low heat. 5. Serve waffles warm, drizzled with maple gravy. Top with leftover cranberry sauce and/or a poached egg if desired. Devour immediately! Serves 3-4
