





Kid's Korner

PAPER PLATE SUNCATCHER SNOWMAN



All you need to whip up with super cute winter craft for preschoolers are a few simple materials you probably already have on hand: tissue paper – we used white and blue; construction paper – various colors to make hats, ear muffs, arms, etc.; black sharpie; contact paper; scissors; glue; paper plates (optional)

Directions: Start by cutting up the white and blue (or any color you like) tissue paper into squares. Open contact paper so sticky side is up. Press tissue paper all over. Cover with additional contact sheet with sticky side down towards tissue paper. You will need 2 sheets to make a snowman. HINT: We made one white and the other a mixture of blue and white. Use a bowl or freehand to trace a large circle with a sharpie marker. Now cut out your circle. Repeat with another sheet of contact paper to make a smaller circle. Now you have a two ball snowman. Now you can either cut out the center of a paper plate or use a piece of white paper to make the white border. Then use your sharpie (carefully, remember sharpies are permanent markers) to add eyes, mouth, and buttons. Now cut out any accessories you'd like to use to make your snowman such as earmuffs, mittens, scarves, top hats, twig arms, triangular noses, etc. Begin attaching the nose and accessories to decorate your snowman project.

THE HIDDEN REWARDS OF VOLUNTEERISM

In 2007 the County and Friends of Camano Island Parks asked the South End String Band if we would be willing to take on the role of caretakers for little Hutchison Park, a 5 acre parcel once the playground for juvenile delinquents, drug transactions and the occasional late night sex. Since it was the only county park on the South End and we were, after all, the South End house band, we said, yah shure, u betcha. In the beginning the band threw in whole heartedly, cleaned up the area and mowed the lawns. FOCIP brought a few volunteers in to widen the trails and put up signage. So what if they misspelled Hutchison, the guy's name who donated the land.

Course, after the initial flurry of philanthropic excitement the Band sort of lost interest, not only in the Park but the band and the music too. Basically the way of bands. Probably the way of volunteers as well. So for the past 16 years the de facto role of park ranger fell to the banjo player, last guy standing, me and the fiddler who, unfortunately had moved off island and far from the idyllic South End. In that time more than a couple of lawnmowers have given their lives, one or two chainsaws have bit the dust, the caretaker has grown on and gnarly like a few of the second growth firs in the park, sculpture has been placed (and most stolen), a little library has been installed in the 1960's phone booth that mysteriously appeared one year and trees, shrubs and flowers have been planted.

Admittedly, not many people use the Park, mostly dog walkers, midnight lovers and pharmaceutical salespeople. Rarely are the barbecue grills used. Grill, actually, since the second one was stolen the first week and never replaced by the county. Occasionally bikers rest there, once or twice picnickers. It's a lonely place but it's my place. This week I went on the FOCIP website looking at their list of county parks we maintain gratis for Island County. Hutchison was not one of them. So I went to Island County Parks looking for a map or a mention. Nada. Zip. Zilch. My park has been stolen from the records!! Happens all the time on the South End, you're thinking. And me too.

What I can only assume is this: the County has abdicated its little park down here. For what reason, who can say? But I want to say this, being the ranger there for the past decade and a half, I'm publicly declaring the park mine by right of county abdication as well as adverse possession by yours truly. Skeeter Daddle Park. Nice ring to it, don'tcha think? Who'd have ever guessed volunteerism would have more than its own reward.

FROZEN PIPES TIPS AND PREVENTION

HOW TO PREVENT FROZEN PIPES

- Keep garage doors closed if there are water supply lines in the garage.
- Open kitchen and bathroom cabinet doors to allow warmer air to circulate around the plumbing.
- When the weather is very cold outside, let the cold water drip from the faucet served by exposed pipes. Running water through the pipe - even at a trickle - helps prevent pipes from freezing.
- Keep the thermostat set to the same temperature both during the day and at night.
- If you will be going away during cold weather, leave the heat on in your home, set to a temperature no lower than 55° F.

HOW TO THAW FROZEN PIPES

- If you turn on a faucet and only a trickle comes out, suspect a frozen pipe.
- Keep the faucet open. As you treat the frozen pipe and the frozen area begins to melt, water will begin to flow through the frozen area. Running water through the pipe will help melt ice in the pipe.
- Apply heat to the section of pipe using a portable space heater (kept away from flammable materials), or by wrapping pipes with towels soaked in hot water. Do not use a blowtorch, kerosene or propane heater.
- Apply heat until full water pressure is restored.
 If you are unable to locate the frozen area, if the frozen area is not accessible, or if you can not thaw the pipe, call a licensed plumber.
- Check all other faucets in your home to find out if you have additional frozen pipes. If one pipe freezes, others may freeze, too.

BOK CHOY SOUP



A healthy Asian inspired soup featuring fresh Bok Choy, tender chicken, and steamed rice in a flavorful broth seasoned with garlic and ginger, Enjoy!

INGREDIENTS: 3 Ig. stalks Bok Choy, washed, separated, and chopped; 1 T. olive oil; 1 c. diced onion; 2 cloves garlic, minced; 1 knob fresh ginger, peeled and thinly sliced; 3 skinless, boneless chicken breasts; 5-6 c. water; 5 T. chicken bouillon crystals or 5-7 cubes bouillon cubes; 1 c. diced carrots; Hot cooked rice for serving, if desired

DIRECTIONS: 1. Wash the Bok Choy, separate the dark greens from the white stalks and cut both into bite size pieces; set aside. 2. In a large stock pot or Dutch oven, over medium heat, add the olive oil. Sauté the onions, garlic, and ginger. 3. Add the chicken to the pot, brown on each side. Cover with 5-6 cups of water and add bouillon, bring to a boil, reduce heat and simmer for about 45-minutes to an hour. Skim off the foam with a spoon and discard. 4. Add the Bok Choy dark greens and carrots, cook for about 20 minutes. Add the Bok Choy white stalks, boil for another 10 minutes. 5. Serve soup over hot cooked rice, if desired. Serves 6-8. 6. Note: You can substitute chicken broth or stock for water and chicken bouillon.
