THE SYMBOLLIC CRAB OF CAMANO ISLAND

Just as tulips are synonomous with Skagit County, crabs (specifically Dungeness) are iconic to Camano Island, even more so than the town of Dungeness, WA....but it wasn't always that way. Agreeably, the Dungeness Crab have been around for centuries and have been a valuable source of food and pride to our area. Yet, the crab was not a symbol of the area until after the arrival of The Crab Cracker community magazine. The magazine, emblazoned with a cute crab logo and crab decor throughout the magazine, was first produced by James and Malynda Shipley back in 2012. Every two weeks a new edition would be distributed to thousands of locals, with the infused crab theme throughout the magazine, that soon generated a crab identity to Camano Island itself. Evidently, the large metal crab at Terry's corner was constructed after 2012 and the Camano Crab Dash did not exist prior to 2012. Since 2012, many businesses, artists, and clothing companies have adopted the crab icon, strengthening the local crab market, all likely inspired by The Crab Cracker magazine.



The produce cultivated on-site will be distributed to members of the Stanwood Camano community facing food insecurity, facilitated through our partnership with the Stanwood Camano Food Bank. There is also plan to restore the wetland located at the park with the help of the Stiliguamish tribe of Indians as well as the Snohomish county conservation district. PROJECT 2. The parcel adjacent to the Stanwood United Methodist Church presents an exceptional opportunity for a community garden space. It has access to water, morning and afternoon sun, and is in close proximity to many residences. The garden will serve as a community gathering space where residents have the opportunity to learn how to grow fruits, vegetables, and flowers. The space will also provide the Stanwood Camano Food Bank with fresh, locally grown fruits and vegetables. Classes on how to grow a garden will be provided once a week for all to enjoy. Residents of the Stanwood-Camano community will have the opportunity to rent a plot of a raised garden bed or accessible bed to grow their own food. More info: https://pspfarms.org/





WHALE BREACHES DOWNTOWN



A gray whale broke through the concrete on 271st Street in downtown Stanwood on March 28th. Scientists from Salish Marine Stewards and the Historical Society of Snohomish County stated that, though externely rare, there is an explanation. Stanwood was actually built upon a man-made sheet of rock over the bay of Port Susan. This shelf of engineered rock is laid over the deep waters of Port Susan, creating a large "underwater tunnel" to allow for safe migrations of sea life, including gray whales. As mammals, these whales have to surface in order to breathe in oxygen, otherwise they will die. Naturally, whales have learned to surface before travelling underneath Stanwood. This old whale, however, was forced to break through the thin crust of the street to gasp for air. Some speculate that the whale may have been disoriented or sick, leading it to make a wrong turn and end up on the street. Others believe that the whale may have been chasing prey and miscalculated its jump, resulting in it landing on the street. Fortunately, the whale returned back to the sea with iust minor cuts and abrasions and minimal damage to the road. The street was closed for two nights for repairs to it and the shelf foundation, and was re-opened on March 30.


ZIPLINE CAMANO-WHIDBEY



LEMON RASPBERRY CUPCAKES



CUPCAKES: 1 c. unsalted butter, room temperature; 2 c. granulated sugar; 1 tsp. vanilla extract; 2 tsp. lemon zest; 1/2 tsp. lemon extract; 4 lg. eggs, room temperature; 1 c. full-fat sour cream; 1/2 c. whole milk; 3 1/4 c. plus 3 T. cake flour, divided; 1 1/2 tsp. baking powder; 1/2 tsp. baking soda; 3/4 tsp. salt; 1 1/2 c. raspberries

LEMON CREAM CHEESE FROSTING: 12 oz. cream cheese, room temperature; 1/2 c. unsalted butter, room temperature; 1/2 tsp. lemon extract; 4 1/2 c. confectioners' sugar, sifted, more if needed; 2 T. fresh lemon juice; 1 tsp. fresh lemon zest

DIRECTIONS: 1. CUPCAKES: Preheat the oven to 350 degrees. Line two (12 cup) cupcake tins with paper liners; set aside. 2. In the bowl of a stand mixer fitted with the paddle attachment, or in a large bowl using a handheld electric mixer, beat the butter, sugar, vanilla extract, lemon extract, and lemon zest on medium speed until light and fluffy, about 2 minutes. Add the eggs, one at a time, beating well after each addition. With the mixer on low speed, add the sour cream and milk, beat until combined. 3. In a medium bowl, whisk together 3 1/4 cups of the cake flour, baking powder, baking soda, and salt. Using a rubber spatula, gently fold the dry ingredients into the wet ingredients, mixing just until combined. Be sure not to over mix or your cupcakes will be dense; set aside. 4. In a small bowl combine the remaining 3 tablespoons of flour with the raspberries; toss to coat. Using a rubber spatula, gently fold the raspberries and any excess flour into the batter, stirring just until combined. 5. Spoon or scoop the batter (using an ice cream scoop) into the prepared cupcake tins (filling each mold 3/4 of the way full). Bake one pan at a time, for about 20-22 minutes, or until a toothpick inserted into the center of a cupcake comes out clean, or with just a few moist crumbs attached. 6. Cool in the pan for 10 minutes then transfer cupcakes to a cooling rack. Cool completely before frosting, 7. LEMON CREAM CHEESE FROSTING: In the bowl of a stand-mixer fitted with the paddle attachment, or in a large bowl using an electric handheld mixer, beat the softened cream cheese, butter, and lemon extract on medium-high speed until completely smooth; about 2 minutes. 8. Reduce the speed to low and gradually add the sifted confectioners' sugar. Add in the lemon juice and zest. Once incorporated, increase speed to medium-high and beat for 1-2 minutes. 9. Once the cupcakes have completely cooled spread or pipe the frosting on top of the cupcakes. Decorate with fresh raspberries and a lemon slice, if desired. 10. Cupcakes are best the day they are made but will keep covered and stored in the fridge for 3 days. Bring to room temperature before serving. Yields 24 cupcakes
