SENIOR FARMERS MARKET NUTRITION PROGRAM

SNOHOMISH COUNTY

Providing eligible low-income older adults with fresh fruits and vegetables from local farmers.



The Senior Farmers Market Nutrition Program (SFMNP) increases our community's intake of fruits and vegetables; expands the use of local farmers markets, farm stands, and community-supported agriculture programs; and increases sales of Washington grown produce. Eligible low-income older adults will receive one \$80 benefit card to purchase fresh fruits and vegetables at participating farmers markets, farm stores, farm stands, and certified sellers.

INGREDIENTS: 1 c. all-purpose flour; 1/4 c. confectioners' sugar; 1/2 c. butter; 2 lg. eggs; 3/4 c. granulated sugar; 3 T. lemon juice; 2 T. all-purpose flour; 1/2 tsp. baking powder; Confectioners' sugar for garnish

DIRECTIONS: 1. Preheat the oven to 350 degrees. 2. In a mixing bowl,

whisk together 1 cup of flour and 1/4 cup of confectioner's sugar. Using a pastry blender, cut the butter into the flour mixture until it is well combined and holds together. Pat the mixture into an ungreased 8x8x2-inch baking dish. Bake for 10-12 minutes. 3. Meanwhile, in a separate mixing bowl, using an electric hand mixer beat eggs, granulated sugar, and lemon juice. Beat until slightly thick and smooth about 8-10 minutes. Stir together 2 tablespoons flour and baking powder, add to the egg mixture. Blend until all is moistened, pour over the baked layer. 4. Bake for an additional 20-25 minutes. Sift con-

fectioner's sugar over the top. Let cool, cut into squares.
