

Paul Steinman

March 25, 1944 – February 6, 2022

Paul was born in Kitchener, ON and was raised and educated in Baden. He was the son of Alice & Arthur Steinman. He lived above Steinman Furniture Store, Snyder's Road East Baden. (Later known as the Emporium) I lived next door to Paul. We played together as youngsters.

Paul went to Baden Public School, Waterloo Oxford District Secondary School, then to work at General Springs in Kitchener (they made seats for General Motors cars & trucks). He left work and went back to school at Conestoga College in Kitchener, where he earned a Drafting degree. Paul then went to work at Babcock, Wilcock in Preston (Cambridge). Babcock, Wilcock built industrial pumps for nuclear plants, the oil industry etc. as well as boilers.

Paul was a volunteer firefighter, 1964 to 1976 with the Baden Fire Department. He was one that encouraged me to join the fire department.

Paul left Ontario, in the mid 1970's and moved to South Burlington Vermont to work for Hayward Tyler, a similar company to the Preston plant building pumps. As he prospered at his company, he travelled extensively thru USA, Mexico and Canada for work.

Paul was an energetic volunteer and great community supporter of causes around South Burlington, VT. After retirement, Paul spend countless hours at the Wheeler Homestead Garden, planting and maintaining their gardens.
