For the sick, that they may find hope through the intercession of St. Anne who is the mother of the infirm and the help of the afflicted, we pray to the Lord...


The name Anne means "grace;" may our days be filled with grace and be secure under the protection of St. Anne, we pray to the Lord...

Spiritual Communion means uniting one's self in prayer with Christ's sacrifice and worshipping him in his Body and Blood. The most common reason for making an Act of Spiritual Communion is when a person cannot attend Mass. Acts of Spiritual Communion increase our desire to receive sacramental Communion and help us avoid the sins that would make us unable to receive Holy Communion worthily.
