PEER MENTORING

Youth should be prepared to effectively communicate and build relationships with people, throughout diverse roles and situations. Our mentoring helps youth develop social and problem-solving skills in safe environments.

POSITIVE INTERACTIONS & NEW INFORMATION

We provide access to safe, empowering social-learning environments with exposure to diverse activities and perspectives to practice consideration of alternatives. We consider human behavior insights and focus on the value of healthy thoughts, interpersonal relationships and self-worth.

THINKING & LEARNING STRATEGIES

We share information about how humans work and "alternative thinking" as a tool to manage situations, outcomes, thoughts and resources and get closer to their goals.



ACCESS TO PEOPLE & RESOURCES

Foster youth need access to social capital and support in retaining it, to increase their access to experiencebased advice, transportation, emotional support, and other key personal and professional growth resources.

Yalanis Vélez, the founder of OCA, and her sisters experienced the socio-economic contrast of living in a working-middle-class home, to living in group homes and becoming part of the foster care system in Puerto Rico.
