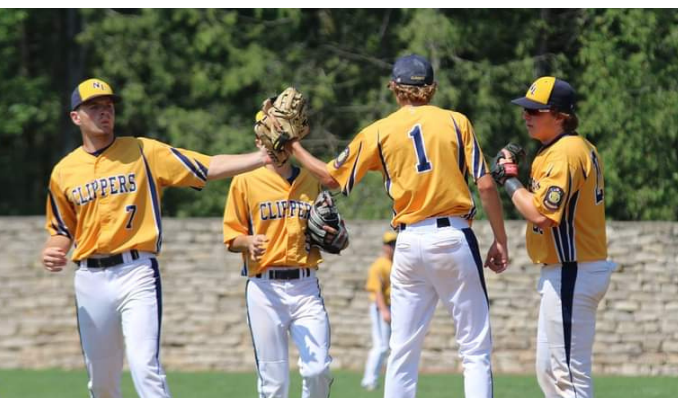

ABOUT LEGION BASEBALL

American Legion Baseball is the most successful and most visible youth program of the American Legion. Over 75% of college ball players and over 50% of major league players have played American Legion Baseball during the course of their careers, including "Yogi" Berra, Roger Clemens and Chipper Jones.

In addition to developing and promoting a spirit of teamwork, good sportsmanship, physical fitness and good citizenship within the community, being a part of the Wisconsin Legion program also allows for participation in one of five baseball classes.

Graduating senior players have the opportunity of participating in the annual All-Star Weekend in Milwaukee. All players are insured through the National program. All coaches and volunteers complete a mandatory background check and abuse training before team approval.



Each year 48 players across the state are selected to play in the All-Star game at American Family Field. The game is played after the Brewer's first Sunday home game each August.

SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITY

A \$1,000.00 scholarship is awarded each year to a graduating Senior in Wisconsin.

In addition a National All-Academic team is named with an additional \$2500.00 scholarship. Wisconsin has had 5 All-Academic Team players in the past, including Tucker Boucher in 2021.

"The choice between playing Legion ball and travel ball is easy. When you play travel ball, you are limited to certain places you can play. When you play Legion ball, you are playing with people who care about you. There are friends who you have played with and friends who you have played against.
