THE LYTTON BAND OF INDIANS BY-LAW #1978 - 1

Being a By-Law to regulate the use of Recreational and Off-Highway vehicles.

Whereas sections 81 (b) (c) (d) (g) and (r) of the Indian Act empowers the Council of a Band to make by-laws respecting the regulation of traffic, the observance of law and order, the prevention of disorderly conduct and nuisances, and any matter ancillary thereto, and the imposition of a penalty for the violation thereof;

And Whereas the use of Off-Highway vehicles within the Reserve creates a nuisance and danger;

And Whereas the Council has received numerous requests from the residents of the Lytton Indian Reserve to regulate the use of certain vehicles;

Now Therefore the Council of the Lytton Band of Indian enacts as a by-law thereof as follows:

- 1. In this by-law, unless the context otherwise requires;
- a) "all terrain vehicle" has the same meaning as in the All Terrain Vehicles Act RSBC 1971, chapter 3;
- b) "Council" means the Council, as defined in the Indian Act, of the Lytton Band of Indians;
- c) "Highway", "Motorcycle", and Motor "Vehicle" shall each have the same meaning respectively as in the Motor Vehicle Act, RSBC 1960, chapter 3;
- d) "Off-Highway vehicle" means any type of vehicle propelled by motorised power and capable of travel on or off a highway and without limiting the generality of the foregoing shall be deemed to include motorcycle, motor vehicle and all terrain vehicles; and
- e) "Reserve" means those tracts or parcels of land set apart for the use and benefit of the Lytton Indian Band which are known as the Lytton Indian Reserves No. 1 and No. 15.
- 2. No person shall operate, or authorize or permit any person to operate, an off-highway vehicle within the limits of the reserve except on a highway.

Any person who violates any of the provisions of this by-law shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable, on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding \$100.00 or imprisonment for a term not exceeding 30 days or to both fine and imprisonment.

Approved and passed at a duly convened meeting of the Council of the Lytton Band of Indians this 28th day of November 1978.
