HELPING CHILDREN IN CARE TELL THEIR STORY

How life story work can help children use their voice to explain their situation the way they want to

As they grow, fostered children will need to come to terms with how they have come into care. But how do they find the words to explain their story - to others and to themselves?

Life story work is an important part of fostering and can help enormously. What this looks like varies widely depending on the child's age and stage of emotional development and the child's ability to engage with the process, as well as religious and cultural background, gender, disability or educational needs. In most cases, it involves a sensitively written book or file that explains the reasons for a child's moves - including information about birth family members - and allows words, photos and even letters to be inserted and gradually shared at ageappropriate intervals and updated as the child grows.

Creating a memory box of memorabilia - old clothes, toys, photos, for example - can also be a lovely memory aid and a comfort for the child, as can a meaningful photo album created for the child, showing people and places special to the child.

Together these tools can be a great help for a looked after child to explore, understand and come to terms with their history.

Benefits of life story work

Working together with the young person, foster parents and social workers, even teachers and, in some cases, birth family members - often backed up by therapeutic support to help the child come to terms with distressing history - can help the child explore experiences, feelings and memories to understand what has happened in the past, explain and accept their present, and come to feel positive and hopeful about the future.

It can also be a powerful comfort for children who blame themselves for abuse or neglect experienced very common in looked after children, say the experts.

Life story work is not only about helping children understand why they could not remain with their birth families; it also helps children come to terms with the realisation that their early life experience is not their fault and help them to grow in confidence and acceptance of their foster family.

Other benefits of life story work include:

- Building a sense of identity
- Giving clear details to build an understanding of their history
- Enabling a child to share their past with their current carers so they can better understand and develop empathy for the child and help with attachment
- To give a realistic, factual account of early events (children may harbour fantasies about their "perfect" birth family and this helps dispel that to help the child move on)
- To help the child understand how early negative experiences continue to affect them
- To acknowledge the separations and losses the child has experienced
- To enhance self-esteem and nurture a sense of security, comfort and permanency

Children who live with their birth families have many opportunities to know their past and to clarify past and present events. However, children separated from their birth families are often denied these opportunities; they may have changed families, social workers, schools, homes, and moved away from familiar neighbourhoods and communities. Children who lose track of their past and who are confused about the present, are likely to find it difficult to develop emotionally and socially.

But, done consistently and sensitively, life story work can help children separated from their birth families maintain a clear sense of their life journey and identity.

On behalf of Noorie and I, thank you for encouraging the young people to attend the events and any other participation work that we may hold in the near future.












