FROM DR MOTES

This January has been one of the warmest ever, to the delight of our vandas and ourselves. The huge weather systems which have devastated the north as they swept south have been ameliorated by the warmth of the Gulf and the Atlantic have arrived in enfeebled states. These weak and dissipating fronts have also produced much less than typical rain.

A succession of these fronts has left us with much drier than usual air. Dry air radiates heat in the night and the swing of day to night temperatures has been extreme with low temperatures frequently exceeding forecasts. All this has been good for our orchids. Wide swings of day to night temperatures mimic the conditions in tropical mountains where most of our orchids originated, and

stimulate roots and blooms.

Dry air is always good, tamping down fungal activity and putting us in control of the water our plants receive. As our plants' roots, potting medium and containers are extra dry, we must be sure to water them thoroughly. Three or sometimes four applications of water should be applied to the point of runoff and spaced a few minutes apart. Testing the weight of a plant to see that it is quite heavy is the best measure of thorough watering. If dry conditions continue to prevail most potted orchid should be watered at 7–10-day intervals to ensure their bulbs stay plump.

Vandas are flourishing in this warm winter. Keep them well watered and fertilized. With the temperatures we are having, *Vanda* roots should remain in active growth and crowns should be pushing forth new leaves. Each new leaf has an axial with a potential flower spike bud. With some extra care given to them, vandas will reward us with extra blooms.

Thrips are usually not problematic in February but with the temperature ranges and dryness we are experiencing, they could emerge at any time. Scout for them on the new root tips of vandas where the tissue is maturing. If a ring of pitted tissue is present, control them with the methods recommended in *Fla. Orchid Growing*.


