ORDINANCE NO. 5/14/97

AN ORDINANCE REQUIRING AND REGULATING THE NUMBERING OF BUILDINGS WITHIN THE TOWNSHIP OF MILLCREEK, LEBANON COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA.

WHEREAS, the Pennsylvania Second Class Township Code in Section 1520 provides that a Board of Supervisors may by ordinance require and regulate the numbering of buildings; and

whereas, the present numbering system using rural routes and box numbers has created confusion in locating properties and has hampered the provision of emergency services to residents of the Township; and

WHEREAS, a better organized system for numbering buildings will help ensure a better delivery of emergency services to the residents of the Township as well as make locating homes and businesses easier for the delivery of other services.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED, by the Board of Supervisors of the Township of Millcreek, Lebanon County, Pennsylvania, as follows:

- SECTION 1. The numbering of all buildings within Millcreek Township, Lebanon County, shall be as set forth on the schedule attached hereto, made a part hereof, and marked Exhibit A.
- Exhibit A shall clearly mark, or cause to be clearly marked, his, her, or its property with the number listed under the heading "NEW House" that corresponds to his, her, or its respective property as listed on Exhibit A.
- requirements set forth in SECTION 2 above to clearly mark his, her, or its property by placing the required number on his, her, or its property, or reasonably close thereto, in such a manner that the number is visible from the nearest street or roadway.
- action brought before a District Justice in the same manner provided for the enforcement of summary offenses under the Pennsylvania Rules of Criminal Procedure. Any person, firm, partnership, or corporation who shall be found guilty of violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be sentenced to pay a fine not to exceed one thousand (1,000) dollars and may be

imprisoned to the extent allowed by law for the punishment of summary offenses.

SECTION 5. Any Ordinance or part of an Ordinance conflicting with the provisions of this Ordinance is hereby repealed.

SECTION 6. This Ordinance shall become effective five (5) days after enactment.
