The season was filled with many highlights for each team and the wrestling program as a whole. With only two seniors graduating from the last year's varsity line-up, the outlook for this year's team looked very bright, however, the success we had this year was a direct result of the efforts made during the off season. Team 2003 is made up of many multi-sport athletes, has many strength records in the weight room, traveled to the state of Nebraska and participated in a team camp with over 700 wrestlers, and believed that hard work and sacrifice would allow them to accomplish goals others would think could never be accomplished.

Reflecting on this past seasons brings back many **positive memories**. The season began with the 4th annual Commitment Night. That night allowed each wrestler to come together, build relationships, set goals, and begin making a commitment to the upcoming season. The success of the Eastview football team was a great experience for the entire school including several wrestlers, however, slowed the start of the season for those involved. As the season progressed, each wrestler became better conditioned, gained confidence, and developed the skills needed for a great season. Below is a recap of the 2002-2003 season.

The **Freshman team** had a very good season filled with many highlights...

- ◆ 23 freshman wrestlers worked very hard and completed the season.
- ◆ Earned 12 dual meet wins, placed 2nd in the section, & qualified for the State Team Tournament.
- ◆ Qualified 6 individuals to the 9th grade state tournament with one state place winner.
- ◆ Improved throughout the season and had a great Individual Region tournament placing 2nd as a team.
- ◆ Earned 191 match wins, 921 team points, 100 falls, and 217 takedowns.

The **Junior varsity team** had a record breaking season with multiple wrestlers competing at each weight class...

- ◆ Set a school record with 19 dual meet wins and a 2nd place finish in the Lake Conference.
- ◆ Earned 2nd place honors at the Faribault Invite and 2nd place honors at the Eastview Tournament.
- ◆ Placed 3rd at the Central Lake Conference Varsity Tournament in South Dakota.
- ◆ Earned 308 match wins, 1664 team points, 153 falls, and 355 takedowns.
- ◆ Provided the depth needed to fulfill each of the varsity teams needs.

The **Varsity team** had an outstanding season, achieved many of its goals, and accomplished things that no other Lightning team has ever accomplished...

- ◆ Earned Gold Team recognition with a team GPA of 3.59.
- ◆ Earned a team record 21 dual meet wins and a 2nd place finish in the Lake Conference.
- ◆ Earned an Individual Tournament Championship at Burnsville and a Team Championship at Eastview.
- ◆ Had 2 section champs, 4 state qualifiers, and 2 All-State wrestlers earning 5th and 6th place honors.
- ◆ Earned 362 match wins, 1722 team points, 166 falls, and 844 takedowns.

The **Class of 2003**, the Seven Sensational Seniors, have raised the bar for all future classes. The senior class leaves having earned 69 varsity dual meet wins, 364 individual match wins, 175 falls, and 1697 team points – all recorded by our sensational senior statistician. To each of you seniors, I thank you for your hard work, commitment, and your ability to achieve things nobody would have believed. My hope for you is that you continue to use these life long skills to achieve great things. You are always welcome in the Eastview wrestling room.

The **Future of Eastview Wrestling** is unknown. In order for success to continue and have the bar raised to higher levels, **Parents** must continue to offer their support, **Coaches** must continue to offer opportunities and challenges, and **Wrestlers** must work harder than ever, make sacrifices, and do the little things needed to become a champion. The success that our wrestling program will have in 2004 will be determined by those mentioned above. I challenge each of you to do things you have never done, work harder than you ever have, and start believing in goals that you would have never believed possible. 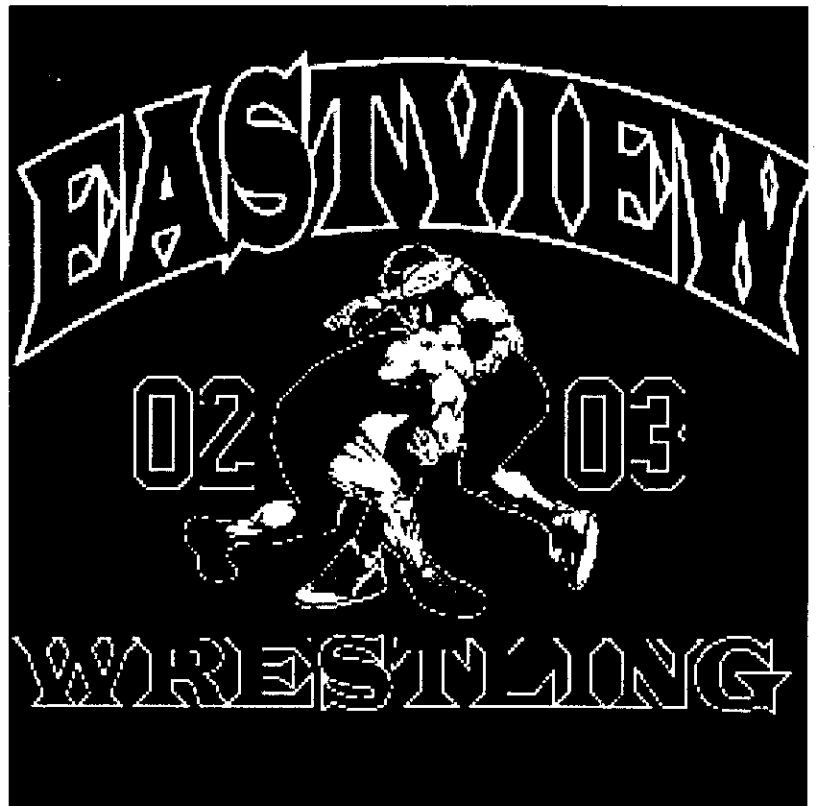
"A thousand mile journey begins with a single step." We are on an honorable and groundbreaking journey this year, but in order to reach our goals, we must focus on each step.

There are only four secrets to staying young, being happy, and achieving success. "You have to laugh and find humor every day. You've got to have a dream. When you lose your dreams, you die. Jefferson also joined the dual-meet and left with a pair of lopsided losses.

Rosemount's Dan Chapman was an 8-3 winner at 140 for a 15-0 lead.

Eastview's Steve Davis picked up a 16-3 major decision at 145. John Getzke pulled the Lightning to within 15-9 with a 19-4 victory in his match at 152. The Lightning's Ryan Langlais won by pinfall at 1:06 in the first period at 160 to tie the match at 15-15.

Rosemount's Zac Cornett scored all three of his points in the third period in a 3-1 win at 171 to put the Irish ahead 18-15.

But Nate Kocer brought Eastview back into an 18-18 tie with a 16-11 victory at 189.

Kyle Fokken (215) and James Voyles (heavyweight) followed with decisions for a 25-18 Eastview lead.

Walsh, ranked No. 7, took a 3-2 lead into the third period, but McBride, ranked fourth, used a takedown to tie at 4-4. Walsh used an escape and a takedown to build his lead. McBride scored on a penalty point and an escape.

"We're getting better everyday, but we need to get a lot better by February if we want to contend for a section championship," said Habeck, whose roster includes more seniors than ever. "We expected to win, we did, and we're going to keep getting better."

Against Jefferson, Foertsch (130), Turk (140), Davis (145), Kocer (189), Voyles (215) all won by pinfall.

Eastview's McBride gains 100th career win

Eastview High wrestling coach Kurt Habeck saw senior Kevin McBride strolling down the hallway with crutches nowhere to be found.

On Monday of last week, though, McBride injured his right foot during a physical education gymnastics class.

"I was just walking off the mat after a stunt and rolled it," McBride said. "I kind of had a feeling it might be broken. I was trying to think positive things, and not really think about it being broken. But then the season kind of popped into my mind."

A trip to the doctor later that night resulted in the diagnosis of a slight stress fracture.

Three weeks minimum — with a potential of six to eight weeks — was the bad news for McBride, who placed third in the Section 6AAA meet last season at 119 pounds and was aiming for a state-tournament berth this year at 125.

Because of the swelling in his foot, McBride was summoned to return to the doctor Thursday morning to be fitted for a cast. So he hobbled around school with a pair of crutches as he pondered life with a cast on his foot.

Instead, when McBride reported to his doctor Thursday, radiologists had determined in the interim that there indeed was not a fracture.

McBride headed off to school with a note from his doctor that he was ready for action whenever the pain subsided.

"As a coach I was shocked when I saw him in the hallway Thursday," Habeck said. "I asked him where his crutches were and he handed me the note."

McBride, a senior captain, did what he could in the weight room, and was headed toward rehabilitation in the school swimming pool. McBride returned to practice Thursday, and was held out of an easy win against Kennedy Friday. Saturday, he won three matches — including the 100th of his varsity career in the finale — to help Eastview to its first-ever team championship at the Eastview Invitational.

"I was feeling pretty good on Saturday, so I just went after it," McBride said.

"I think the power of the doctor saying 'You'll be OK,' really helped him," Habeck said.

Eastview defeated Paribault (49-13) and Dassel-Cokato (31-27) before knocking off Coon Rapids 31-28 in the finals.

In the semifinals against Dassel-Cokato, Eastview won four matches by one or two points. Against Coon Rapids, Eastview

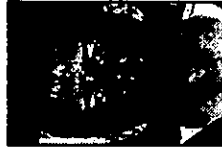
