- Bacardi has pledged <u>\$3 million</u> in relief to bars and restaurants affected by the COVID-19 shutdowns as part of its #RaiseYourSpirits campaign.
- Facebook announced a \$100 million grant for small businesses impacted by COVID-19 and launched the <u>Business Resource Hub</u>, which features recommendations to help small businesses stay connected to customers and stay on track.
- James Beard Foundation started a <u>Food and Beverage Industry Relief Fund</u> to provide microgrants to independent food and beverage small businesses in need.
- JPMorgan pledged \$50 million to help struggling customers, and <u>\$8 million in aid</u> to small businesses, specifically.

Region-Specific Resources

- Escambia County Small Business COVID-19 Recovery Grant Program. Grants to assist for-profit businesses located in Escambia County with their immediate cash flow needs as a result of a demonstrated economic injury due to COVID-19. The max grant award is \$2,500 per applicant or business. The opening date to apply is Monday, April 20 at 8 a.m. CST with a deadline of Monday, April 27 at 5 p.m. CST. The application will be available online starting Monday, April 13, but applications will not be accepted until Monday, April 20 at 8 a.m. Please note that complete applications will be reviewed in the order they are received.
- <u>Orange Cares: Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security.</u> Orange County Government has created four funding categories and one replenishment category to ensure that the funds are able to meet the immediate and personal need of residents, business owners, nonprofits, municipal and community partners.
- <u>United Way of Central Florida United Community Relief Fund.</u> With children out of school, businesses temporarily closing, community events being canceled, and workers being laid off, there has never been a time where community support and financial resources have been more critically needed. The new fund will support local nonprofit organizations serving those most vulnerable to the economic and health-related impacts triggered by a community crisis.
- <u>Orange County Government Rental Assistance</u>. Orange County, Florida Government will offer rental assistance to low-income households starting March 1, 2021.
- <u>Central Florida Resources from the Orlando Business Journal.</u> The Orlando Business Journal has compiled a list of resources available to Central Florida businesses.
- <u>Hillsborough County R3 Program.</u> The Hillsborough County Rapid Response Recovery Assistance Program (R3) directs CARES Act funds to programs that assist residents and businesses.
- Community Foundation of Tampa Bay COVID-19 Nonprofit Needs Request Form. The impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on our nonprofit community has been immediate and continues to grow. The Nonprofit Needs Request Form is one new way that the Community Foundation of Tampa Bay is working to help nonprofits in our community. This is not a competitive grant process. It is an innovative way to share specific needs with us, our fund-holders (who granted over \$20 million to nonprofits last fiscal year) as well as other philanthropists in the Tampa Bay community. After completing the simplified Nonprofit Needs Request Form, your needs will be included within a database of requests from our community. If your nonprofit's request is matched with a donation, we will notify you and transmit funds to address the request as quickly as possible.
- <u>Tampa Bay Resiliency Fund.</u> A unique partnership has been launched to help the critical organizations that provide assistance to the most vulnerable of our local residents being affected by the COVID-19 public health crisis. The Tampa Bay Resiliency Fund is a new strategic collaboration of the Pinellas Community Foundation, Allegany Franciscan Ministries, Foundation for a Healthy St. Petersburg and United Way Suncoast with nearly \$1 million of funding assistance available to nonprofit 501(c) organizations and governmental agencies.
