The journal is an open-access, multiple-reviewers, double-blind-review publication. This edition is numbered vol. 33, no. 1 to reflect continuation from where the Journal of Third World Studies (JTWS) ended, since ASRF articles were published in that journal under the Africa associate editorship of John Mukum Mbaku, Brady Presidential Distinguished Professor of Economics and John S. Hinckley Fellow at Weber State University in Ogden, Utah, USA. The journal is published semiannually. The frequency will be increased depending on the number and quality of submissions.
