

Two handicap ramps were completed recently. On November 15<sup>th</sup> a ramp was constructed in Hale for an Air Force veteran who had suffered a stroke. Two 24-foot ramp sections with two platforms were built. Material costs were \$1,274.74 and paid for by losco Veterans Affairs. Lions Tony P., Tony B., Ann, Scott, Chuck and Bob Drogosch completed this ramp.

On December 6<sup>th</sup> the crew of Tony, Scott, Chuck and Bob built a 12-foot ramp with a 4 x 4 platform in the garage of a wheelchair –bound resident. This ramp will allow him to get to therapy treatments. The cost for materials was \$177.53. The residents said it was a terrific Christmas present.

This was the 18<sup>th</sup> ramp built this year with 8 of them out of Oscoda. It is the 93<sup>rd</sup> ramp since this program was initiated. We Serve!
