### A LOOK BACK AT 2011

## January

Our President at the time, Gary Grout, passed along these prophetic words in the **From the President** column in the January 2011 issue of the *Society News*.

"What is going to happen in the new decade we enter in 2011 is what I choose to write about this month. 2011 will be the year that either makes or breaks your Society. It will prove to everyone who has already joined our Society and those still to join that we are for real. So get ready to put on your old clothes, the ones you save to paint in. At the December Board meeting it was decided to try to lease the Fire Hall and spend some of our funds. A lease agreement has been drawn up for a period of twelve months, beginning March 1, 2011. We have a home for at least a year at a cost we can afford. Now we must get busy and come up with the necessary funds to purchase the Fire Hall at the end of our lease."



Clay Township was contacted and we found the following information on the Fire Hall. In 2001 Electrical, Mechanical and Plumbing permits were issued for the following work: New Furnace, Air Conditioner, Water Pump & Smoke Detectors, New Sink, Toilet, and Hot Water Heater. There is no city water connected to the building but there is a water line which runs from the building to the South Channel. We will see if this line can be used; as a renter connecting to the city water would be very costly for the Society. Several other Island contractors have been contacted for their thoughts on what we need to open the building to the public.

## ALOOK BACK AT 2011 March

We officially received the key to the building on March 1, 2011. A lot of work needed to be done before we could move in. There were moisture problems, cracks - both exterior and interior, the grounds are overgrown, problems with the septic, plumbing, heating and cooling systems. March proved to be too cold to do much especially since the furnace needed to be fixed. On a positive note, the bylaw revisions were accepted by the membership allowing for better corporate structure. Workdays were scheduled and donations for the museum and building fund were trickling in.

# April

April proved to be a big month for renovations. We had a fleet of volunteers scraping, repairing and painting both inside and out.



The overgrown shrubs were removed and landscaping was done. A 1963 Chevy Suburban Rescue vehicle was donated by Bob Williams. It will need a bit of TLC to fix it up.



After 2 months of hard work, the Old Fire Hall was rededicated at the Grand Opening Celebration held May 31, 2011. 323 visitors toured the museum that day.

We received a \$500 grant from the Algonac Clay Community Fund to be used toward signage and display.



## June

On June 25 the Society held a sold out Rum Runners Party that featured a best costume contest, silent auction and a delicious dinner at the Middle Channel Country Club. Look for this to be an annual event!

June also saw the museum open on weekends and attract a large number of visitors. Contributions and donations continued to arrive. We received a pledge from the Karen and Drew Peslar Foundation of \$25,000 toward the \$140,000 purchase price of the old Fire Hall that houses our museum. A Building Fund mailing went out and resulted in many donations.

The Wednesday Night Social Hour started. This informal event was open to all and the only requirements were to bring a lawn chair, your beverage and some hors d'ouevres to pass. Folks could tour the museum and just relax and meet new friends and neighbors. This event occurred twice a month through September.

# July August

July was Election of Directors and the results were announced at the August Annual Meeting. Bernard Licata was installed as the new President with Gary Grout moving to Chairman. Bob Williams, from the Stewart Farm, was brought on board as  $2^{nd}$  Vice President.

## September


