Feature Column


- Harsens Island Businesses -

This year our newsletter's feature column will highlight island businesses from years gone by.

The Al D'Eath Marina, on South Channel just opposite the Basset Channel in Canada, was purchased by Al D'Eath in 1961. Al, whose love, and interest in boats dates back 67 years, operated the marina with his two sons (Tom and Roger). Tom D'Eath was the service manager and the master mechanic of motors, woodworking, refinishing and fiberglass.

Roger D'Eath was the Sales Manager looked after the sales of the two main lines of boats: Lancer Yachts and Sutphen High Performance Deep Vee Offshore.

Al D'Eath Marina was a full-service marina and also had a mini party store. The Marina was easily recognized by the red and white striped building.

The International Picnic at Tashmoo Park in 1921

Over 100 years ago, in 1897, a river resort was established on Harsens Island. Tashmoo Park was created to accommodate any steamer which brought thousands to the park every summer. Some of the biggest draws for Tashmoo Park were the athletic events and the baseball games. Of the countless number of events held at Tashmoo Park, there was one in August 1921 that stood out; the International Picnic. The International Picnic had over 1,300 excursionists in attendance.

Here are a couple of partial articles copied from Michele Komar's Tashmoo Park Timeline compilation highlighting the picnic. The Tashmoo Park Timeline is on display at the museum.

MERCHANTS GIVE 101 PRIZES For Picnic Friday

Valuable Rewards Await Winners of Athletic Events at Tashmoo

Every sort of athletic event, together with a baby show, special games for the kiddies, dancing and two base ball games has been arranged for the International Picnic tomorrow at Tashmoo Park.

Never in the history of the city, the committee states, has there been such an array of prizes, as are assembled in the windows of the Knox Dry Goods company to be given to the winners in the contests.

Donated by the merchants and banks of the city, these favors range from a hat to a pair of shoes, and from half a ton of coal to toilet water. The complete list announced by the committee follows:

Events For Men

Broad jump—1st prize, ½ ton coal—Miller Coal & Dock company; 2nd prize, pair golf hose, Springer & Rose; 3rd prize, slippers, Brophy Bros.

50 yard dash—1st, pair pants, Mitchell the Tailor; 2nd, shoes, Co-Operative Show Co.; 3rd, tie tin, H. E. Runnels & Son.

100 yard dash—1st, basket of groceries, Smith Bros.; 2nd, basket of groceries, Smith Bros.; 3rd basket of groceries, Smith Bros.

Sack race—1st, desk lamp, D. J. Stephenson Elec. Co.; 2nd, hat, Water Street Garment Co.; 3rd, ink stand, K. H. Hubbard.

EVERYBODY IS SMILING AT TASHMOO

Over 1300 Excursionists in Attendance at Big Outing

"Everybody is having a dandy time" was the word sent to Port Huron from Tashmoo Park this afternoon by a Times-Herald reporter in outlining the details of the international picnic in which citizens of Port Huron, Sarnia, Marysville and St. Clair joined today.

The steamer Wauketa moored at her dock at Tashmoo Park on schedule time this morning, and about 1300 people immediately scattered about the beautiful park to get the most happiness possible out of the day's outing.

Of this number about 700 were from Port Huron, 50 from Marysville, 400 from St. Clair and the balance from Sarnia.

S. A. Graham, of the Federal Commercial & Savings bank was missed after the boat left St. Clair and a report was in circulation that he had returned to Port Huron to get his golf clubs, and would appear later at Tashmoo Park in his "knickers."

Members of the Royal Black Knights, No. 60 L. O. L. were aboard the steamer, and joined other Orangemen from Detroit at Tashmoo Park.

Sarnia Band on Hand

The Sarnia Citizens band furnished music on the trip to Tashmoo Park, and included in the Sarnia delegation were Gordon Storey of the Chamber of Commerce and Mr. and Mrs. Harry Watson.

At Marysville W. H. Watkins, A. T. Miller and Walter K. Sumner and their merry band of joy makers joined the excursion party, and soon everybody on the boat knew that Marysville was on the map.

Mayor Milton Gearing and Joe Gannon headed the St. Clair delegation.

At Tashmoo Park everybody was "tagged," and as a result there were no strangers at the event. The picnic took on the form of a big neighborly gathering with everybody calling everybody else by their first name.

The business streets of the city present a deserted appearance today and practically every business house is closed.

The weather conditions at the park are good and up to two o'clock no rain had fallen.

Another Notable addition to the Tashmoo Collection

The Harsens Island St. Clair Flats Historical Society is always seeking to expand our collection of Tashmoo art and artifacts. Our goal is to capture the essence of that great period in our Island's history. Another very special and rare item is now on exhibit: a water color painting of the Tashmoo, done by Father Edward Dowling. According to the archives of the Dowling collection (described in detail below). The painting featuring the Tashmoo is one of only three water color pieces done by the artist among a huge collection.



Fr. Edward J. Dowling was a noted Great Lakes historian, an associate professor of engineering graphics at the University of Detroit, and a special lecturer in marine travel and commercial shipping on the Great Lakes. He authored *Lakers of World*, published by the University of Detroit Press in 1967 and numerous journal articles on Great Lakes shipping.

A charter member of the Marine Historical Society of Detroit, Fr. Dowling served for many years as the group's president, secretary and monthly magazine editor of the Society's publication, *The Detroit Marine Historian*. He served as the president of the Great Lakes Maritime Institute, Detroit and vice president of the Steamship Historical Society of America. For ten years he served as Great Lakes Sectional Editor of *Steamboat Bill* writing approximately one column for each issue. In 1973, the Detroit Historical Museum bestowed on Fr. Dowling their Patriotic Award for his work.

Born in 1906, he received an A.B. in Classical Languages in 1930 from Loyola University (Chicago), an A.M. in Classical Language in 1933 from Xavier University, and a S.T.D. in Theology in 1941 from St. Louis University. Fr. Dowling joined the Society of Jesus (Jesuits) in 1930 and was ordained in 1940. From 1942 to 1973 he taught full-time at the University of Detroit and then served twenty years as University Archivist before retiring. Fr. Dowling passed away May 18, 1996.

An Honorary Doctor of Humane Letters degree was presented to Fr. Dowling in 1977. As noted in the citation read during the presentation of the award: "Your life-long interest in Great Lakes shipping and history has become, through the years, much more than an association. Thousands have learned from you of the magnificent ships which plied Michigan's waters. Through your beautiful paintings and photographs, teaching and service to numerous marine organization you have shared your love for the lakes and her vessels with many. Your detailed and dedicated scholarly research has added tremendously to Michigan's history of its great waterways."

A university professor, authority on Great Lakes marine history, photographer, and model ship builder, Fr. Edward J. Dowling, S.J. was also an artist. He created numerous paintings, pencil sketches, landscapes, and water scenes of Great Lakes ships in oil, watercolor, crayons, and pencil. The amazing array of his individual works is complemented on a grander scale with his murals in St. Ignatius High School in Chicago.

When Fr. Dowling honored the university with his collection in 1993, he provided a document listing the number, medium, size, date created and original owner of his artwork. Unfortunately, there are numerical gaps on the list and the disposition of some of the pieces is blank. No attempt has been made to verify the current ownership of these works or the location of the original owner.
