After returning from a cross country cheese promotion road trip with Cabot Creamery, Rachel stepped back onto the farm ready to take on the range of responsibilities in the farm market. Her 'spring' season begins in February with sowing 1,000 tomato seeds in her house and placing orders for annuals and perennials to fill the greenhouses. As spring turns to summer, she procures local produce from farmers across the tri-state region, picks our homegrown sweet corn and occasionally pops into the bakery to try out a new gluten free cookie recipe!

She's transitioned from worker bee to managing a

team of a dozen employees across the greenhouse, market and bakery. Over the next few months you'll find her tending to the plants and answering questions about companion planting, blooming annuals and sun loving plants.
