

Welcome Dr. Ashish Patel, our new Division Chief of Pediatric Gastroenterology!

Dr. Patel recently moved from Dallas where he was the Section Chief of Pediatric IBD at UT Southwestern Medical Center and Children's Medical Center Dallas. Originally



born in Mumbai, India where both parents were doctors, Dr. Patel immigrated to the United States at 2 years old.
