

The doors of Sea Ranch Civic Center were opened on March 5, 2024 at 5:00 pm for a presentation by Vice Commodore Nancy Colson on how to do "Hands Only" resuscitation. She also gave us a rundown on first aids needs aboard our boats. She showed a short video and had the "Resusi Annies for us to practice on. The technique is different from when we learned it years ago. There is no breath or mouth to mouth used , only in a few situations. The main objective is to pump the patient's blood through the body consistently. We learned proper placement of the hands to prevent injury to the person doing the resuscitation and to insure constant pressure. She also demonstrated the AED unit for shocking a person back to normal heart rhythm. Instructions are very well presented on the machine and a voice tells you when to do what. She reminded us that the first thing someone who comes up to a person not breathing is to call "911" and then start compressions. The compressions must be kept up until the person recovers or medical people take over. It is their call to stop. She asked if there was interest in doing a certified class in the future and everyone was interested.

At 6:00 pm we setup tables and food for the March Irish Potluck Dinner. Chaplain Dennis Stowe gave a blessing before dinner.

Membership Director Bob Costales listed the Birthdays and Anniversaries for March which are in Marker2. This paddle is less than 4 miles with the river current. Not only is the Withlacoochee River wild and gorgeous, but it is also so long that you can return again and again to paddle different segments. The Withlacoochee River, Florida's fourth largest, is designated a Florida Outstanding Waterway and is unusual in that it flows north. It starts in the Green Swamp near Orlando and meanders largely through state forest and undeveloped land for 141 miles to empty into the Gulf at Yankeetown.

We will drop boats off at Hog Island and then move most cars to the takeout at Nobleton. Lunch at El Sol de Mexico in Brooksville after the paddle.


