Trip Report HBYC Kayak Trip to Santa Fe River High Springs Florida.

Nine HBYC members and two guests participated in our paddle in the Santa Fe River on March 9. Everyone had single kayaks.

Some of us met in Hudson at the Beacon Woods Café for breakfast before we drove to Santa Fe River Canoe Outpost. Two paddlers stayed the night before at the Moonshine Acres RV part in Fort White and met us there. We offloaded the boats at the Outpost and then took cars to the Highway 27 Boat Launch. The weather was warm and windy. We had a bit of a late start and rain was forecast to arrive in the afternoon, so we shortened the paddle. Unlike last year, the outpost didn't have a shuttle service, so we had to shuttle our own cars. My GPS logged the paddle for about 4 miles between our put in at the outpost and take out at Highway 27 Boat Launch.

Like last year, the river was shallow, clear, and scenic. We had a nice current pushing us down the river. Paddlers report counting over 300 turtles and a few small alligators.

The Rainbow River is located in Dunnellon, Florida, United States, in the southwest corner of Marion County, about 20 miles (32 km) southwest of Ocala, 100 miles (160 km) northwest of Orlando and 100 miles (160 km) north of the Tampa Bay area. It is formed by a first-magnitude spring (Rainbow Springs) that is ranked fourth in the state for volume of discharge. In addition to the springs located at the headwaters, there are many smaller springs that discharge from numerous caves, rock crevices, and sand boils the entire length of the river.

We will launch at KP Hole Park and paddle with current about 4 miles to the takeout point at Blue Run park. We can either move cars to shuttle ourselves or utilize the shuttle service (~\$26/person).

We will most likely have lunch after the paddle, but we will decide a location later.

From the Crow's Nest...



<u>Our first club cruise</u> of 2024 to Caladesi was uneventful, specifically because it did not occur. Only two boats were planning on going, and due to the inclement weather forecast, and with discretion being the better part of valor, it was best to cancel.

<u>Our second club cruise</u> of 2024 is on the Memorial Day weekend, immediately following the Women at the Helm race on May 25th, to Dunedin and possibly Clearwater ending on or about May 28th. For those who crewed on the racing boats but will be disembarking after the race, there are two possible options:

At the end of the race raft up with a boat going back home and transfer the crew member(s), or Offload the crew members not cruising at the Dunedin Municipal Marina (this may require coordination with a dingy ride from an anchored vessel unless a transient slip is available at the marina that day) but also land transport needs to be arranged.

Regardless, it's too early to plan the specifics right now, not knowing who is racing or plans on doing the cruise, but something to think about as we get towards the end of May.

SPEAKING OF TRANSIENT SLIPS. In Tarpon Springs one of the past favorites was the Turtle Cove Marina; unfortunately they no longer offer them. Another option is the Port Tarpon Marina on the Anclote River. All of the slips in Caladesi are transient, but as the weather gets warmer the no-see-ums can be quite pervasive and annoying. Further south, there is the Dunedin Municipal Marina, and although they don't have specific transient slips, they often have slips available when their permanent slip holders aren't using their slips for on reason or another. But one would need to call ahead a week or two ahead of time to check availability. Further south in Clearwater there is the Clearwater Harbor Marina on the ICW right by the Clearwater Memorial Bridge, and also the Clearwater Beach Marina right by Clearwater Beach (although their docks are rather short and best for power boats, not sailboats (been there, done that!). And then further down there is the Gulfport Municipal Marina. Although anchoring out is always a much less expensive option (it's FREE after all) as the weather gets warmer if one has A/C on their boat crew members often are partial to the Marina option with plug-in power. Then again, if one wanted to put out between \$500 - \$1, 200, there is always the option of a Honda EU2000i portable generator or one of its cheaper cousins available either from Harbor Freight or Northern Tool.

REGARDING ANCHORING. Lots of options, starting with Dutchman Key or Anclote Power Plant Outside depending upon the wind direction, Three (or it it now Two?) Rooker Bar, Dunedin either by the spoil islands or closer in near the entrance to the marina. And "One Tree Island" off the ICW in Clearwater, anchoring behind "Frenchy's" or grabbing a mooring ball or anchoring in Gulfport. And the list goes on. There are many more spots up and down both the West and East Coasts identified in our HBYC Cruising Guide (available upon request)! Let's get out there!

St Martins Race - April 13th

HBYC Points Race/GHYC Spring Regatta - April 27th

We are combining our points race with the GHYC Spring Regatta. They are running two races on Saturday the 27th. One of the races will count for both HBYC Points Race and towards the GHYC trophy.

Given the tide windows that weekend, if you want to race you should plan to take your boat to GHYC on Friday. You must let David or Eric know if you are coming Friday and returning Sunday (again tide windows). Racers and crew are welcome to use the bar and dining room at GHYC Friday and Saturday nights.

There is a \$15.00 fee to HBYC for the points Race and a separate fee to enter the GHYC Races.

Blessing of the Fleet And Women at the Helm Race <u>May 25th</u>.

Blessing of the Fleet: 11:30 W.A.T.H. Race Start: Noon

We are reinstating our annual Blessing of the Fleet. This event is open to all boaters (sail or power) in the Hudson Beach area. The Blessing of the Fleet is a centuries-old tradition originating in southern European fishing communities. A blessing from the local priest was meant to ensure a safe and bountiful season for the area's commercial fishing community. Over time, however, these ceremonies have evolved into community gatherings that celebrate not only safety but also the camaraderie of seafarers and their families.

Dennis Stow's (HBYC Chaplin) boat will be the Blessing Boat. He will be anchored between the HBYC Start Waypoint (FR1) and Marker 2. That will be just a short hop south of Marker 2.

The ceremony will begin at 1130 and will be broadcast on <u>VHF Ch. 72</u>. Plan to arrive and be in position before 1130. All boats should form a big circle (<u>under power</u>) and motor clockwise around the Blessing Boat. As new boats arrive, please make room for them to join the circle. Please maintain your position in the circle, don't overtake a slower boat.



Once Chaplin Dennis begins the Holy Water phase, boats will make a tight pass one-by-one staying in their position in the circle to receive the Holy Water. **Do not pass to close**! It is the symbolism not the splash that counts!

As soon as your boat has received the Holy Water please break from the circle. Racers should head for the W.A.T.H. start line which will be the HBYC Start Waypoint (FR1).

The Women at the Helm Race is a trophy race featuring our women captains at the helm for the entire race. To sign up for this race please contact Dave Bauer. The course will be sent to the signed up racers on the eve of the race.

This will be a great day on the water, we hope you can come out and be a part of it.





