• Volunteers that serve as Weed Watchers on a lake they love.


- They learn the aquatic growth and become familiar with the water body

- All natives and not plants of concern




Larger patches of common weeds



Most weed watches have reported more & denser patches of the Clasping Pond Weed & expanding patches of Lily Pads.








2019 - Bassweed
