Few Changes, Few Needed, for this Winner!

Introduced in 1989, the Mazda Miata is still one of our favorite roadsters. With its rear-drive dynamics and tiny convertible coupe body, the Miata is all about fun and involvement. Now in its fourth generation, known as "ND" by enthusiasts, the Miata is available with either a folding fabric soft top or a motorized retractable hard top. Mazda has announced several changes to the Miata for the Japanese market, which we expect to arrive in the United States, as well.

The Japanese-market Miata receives some changes for 2024. The North American-spec Miata is likely to benefit from these, as well.

- All-LED exterior lighting
- Asymmetrical limited-slip differential added
 - Updated electric steering rack
 - Improved track stability control system
 - An 8.8-inch infotainment display installed
 - USB-C ports replace USB-A
 - Fresh paint, interior, and wheel choices

The Texas Pecan was the theme for the run. Did you know that the pecan capital of the World is San Saba, TX? The run didn't go there, but that pecan fact tells you about the importance of the nut to Texas. Texas, New Mexico, and Georgia harvest most of the pecans in the U.S. And the pecan tree is the Texas state tree.

It turned out to be a good day for a run. The rains from Thursday and Friday were over, and the next rains weren't due until Sunday. Great timing for a Saturday outing. And very acceptable weather, highs around 60, overcast but pleasant. There was a slight chill in the wind but most went with their tops down. There was an excellent turnout of 16 Miatas, meaning many had a driving desire to hit the Hill Country.

Although 1604 construction delayed our departure, the run started with a circuitous route up Hwy 16 around Bandera and a stop in Medina at the Apple Store. You wonder what the Apple Store has to do with a "nut" run. Well, it's a great place to visit, some large pecan trees drape the facility, they sell some wonderful candied pecans, lots of apple spiced bakery items, and has restrooms.

After our dessert and rest break there, we headed up Hwy 16 through some of my favorite curvy and winding roads in the state. Our only regret was an OTM Jeep that we caught up to that slowed the Miatas from whizzing through some exciting hairpin turns, up and down roads, but we saw beautiful sceneries and trees that exhibited the changing colors of the season.

After skirting Kerrville, we returned to Hwy 16 and headed for Fredericksburg where we stopped at the Fredericksburg Pecan Store and enjoyed a talk by Olan Tisdale, the store's owner and grower of pecans for over 50 years. His own pecan orchard is near San Saba, but he buys pecans all over Texas. His store is packed with the many varieties of pecans and pecan products. Did you know there are over 1000 varieties of pecan trees? It's a fact.

Then it was off to the Pecan Grove Café on Hwy 16 just outside of Fredericksburg. It's an old Sinclair filling station that has been converted to a bar and café that sells great burgers and the best fries that George Lucas says he has ever had. We polished off the meal with mini-pecan pies.

So, while it was a very fine Bluebonnet Miata Club run through the Hill Country, it was definitely a pecan inspired trip. Did you know that pecans are healthy nuts as most of the fat found in them are monounsaturated fat which can help lower levels of bad cholesterol? Now you do!

One last pecan fact. The name "pecan" is a Native American word that was used to describe "all nuts requiring a stone to crack." Olan showed how pecan are shelled now mechanically and he said he would be glad to demonstrate the process to our group. Maybe that will be the next "It's Nuts" Run!
























Ladies, Ladies, Ladies
