
My dream is that my creations inspire people to adopt lots of shelter pets.

If you or someone you know needs to surrender an animal, or has found a stray animal, please reach out for assistance. We may not always be able to intake an animal but we can help in other ways.

Humane Society for Inland Mendocino County is excited to announce our partnership with the **GoodPup** dog training app! **GoodPup** offers customized, affordable, positive dog training that you can access from the comfort of your home, at a time that works for YOU.

We are really excited about the possibility of better-behaved dogs! (And fewer dogs that need new homes due to behavioral issues.) **GoodPup** offers one week of free training; there is no obligation, and users can cancel at any time.

Here's what else to know:

- If you've ever adopted a dog from HSIMC, you can sign up for the **GoodPup** app, and get a lifetime discount off their services. (This is good for HSIMC fosters, volunteers, and staff members, too.)

- For everyone who keeps up with **GoodPup** beyond the first week of training, HSIMC will receive \$40 from the company – whether the dog is from us or not! These funds will help us with our behavior program so we can continue to support the needs of our dogs who are onsite or in homes (Remember, that first week is free.)

We live in a rural community with limited resources to sound training techniques. We love that this virtual training experience can help people and their pups from the comfort of their own home.

We hope this helps some puppies learn how to be good dogs, and also helps some old dogs learn new tricks!

Letter from our Board President

HSIMC's 30th anniversary dinner at Barra of Mendocino was a sell out and an absolutely magical event. The food provided by Black Dog catering was incredible and paired well with Barra's wines. Many thanks to all who were able to attend, participate in the live/silent auctions and contributed to our "Fund the Need campaign". After expenses we raised over \$47,000 and are truly grateful to our community who has always been so supportive.

"Our Fund the Need campaign" consists of improvements to the cattery and dog barn, both long overdue and both significant improvements for the comfort and welfare of our animals. We were able to raise nearly 100% of the amount needed and have already begun the work on these projects. In addition to the dog barn and cattery projects we also have plans to clean out, by removing several inches of pea gravel and earth and then refresh all of the dog kennels with new material. This is something we try to do as frequently as possible for health and sanitation purposes. Installation of the new electrical panels and sub panels has begun and should be finished by August. We will also, sometime before the next rains, undertake a project to improve our water drainage which tends to overflow from the neighboring marsh.

Speaking of drainage, I want to thank Munselle Civil Engineering for helping us with our concerns, they completed a full survey of our front lot and have provided a detailed engineering plan which recommends how to trench from the neighboring marsh to our culvert to eliminate any flooding, which we typically experience in the front between the dog barn and office. This survey work was donated to HSIMC and we are speechless in gratitude. Thank You Cort and team!

In addition to the big 30th gala we've kept ourselves busy with 3 adoption events on our Wags and Wine tour (Barra, Thatcher Hotel, and Toxqui), Jordans Way at the shelter, the Grand reopening of the cattery, an Ukiah Jeep event, Testa's craft fair, and the Hopland Tap. On Easter weekend, HSIMC sponsored an easter egg hunt for the neighborhood children which was a smashing success! Now that we know what to expect, next year will be even bigger and better. Also, we hosted a cat and dog adoption event at the Barkery, lots of foot traffic and an absolutely perfect location to catch the Farmers Market clientele and the many other downtown shoppers.

One of HSIMC's objectives is to make sure our community knows who we are, what we do and why we do it (the 3W's). To that end we attempt to participate in as many community events as possible, host youth groups at the shelter to discuss pet health, safety, and our rescue mission. And also try to get out into the community and present to business groups an overview of HSIMC, past, present, and future. To date we have presented our story to 2 Ukiah Rotary clubs, both were well received and I believe beneficial in helping to educate the business community about our existence. Next on tap is the Willits Rotary, the Lions Club, and the Kiwanis. If you have a group that would be interested in hearing our "pitch" let me know, it can be arranged.

HSIMC's first priority in the rescue business is to keep pets out of shelters, we go to great lengths in attempting to keep pets in their homes and only being surrendered as a last resort. You can always count on us as a resource, we can help with food or maybe work to help correct some behavioral problems or if you haven't noticed, look on our website for the Adoption by Owner web page. This is an initiative where HSIMC offers the benefit of our vast viewing community to help YOU perform a peer-to-peer adoption and completely bypass the pet needing to make a stop at the shelter. This is a service where HSIMC just offers our web resources, it is up to you and the adopter to work out all of the adoption details.

This newsletter marks the end of my first year of tenure as board President, a position I willingly accepted in order to help influence and foster the changes that I felt were in the best interests of the shelter and the community we serve. We can be proud of all the accomplishments so far, and in recognizing that there is still much more that needs to be achieved. To this end I have volunteered to circle the sun one more time as President and know that I can count on everyone's support.

Sunday July 9, 2pm to 6pm, at the shelter, HSIMC will host our annual appreciation day, this is an event where we recognize our volunteers, fosters and contributors who provide the critical support necessary critical support necessary which helps to make us such a highly successful shelter. This year it's a 50's theme ice cream social, there will be food, games, giveaways and lots of fun.



I hope this letter finds you all in good health and high spirits. As the director of the Humane Society for Inland Mendocino County, I am writing to you today with a heavy heart to shed light on the current challenges we face in our mission to provide a safe haven for animals in need. It is with deep concern that I bring to your attention the growing crisis plaguing our animal rescue efforts.

Over the past few months, our shelter has experienced an unprecedented surge in the number of animals requiring our care and attention. The situation has reached an alarming level, and we find ourselves stretched to our limits in providing for these innocent lives. We are facing a shortage of resources, both in terms of funding and essential supplies, making it increasingly difficult to meet the needs of the animals and our community.

The reasons behind the surge in animal surrenders are varied and complex.
